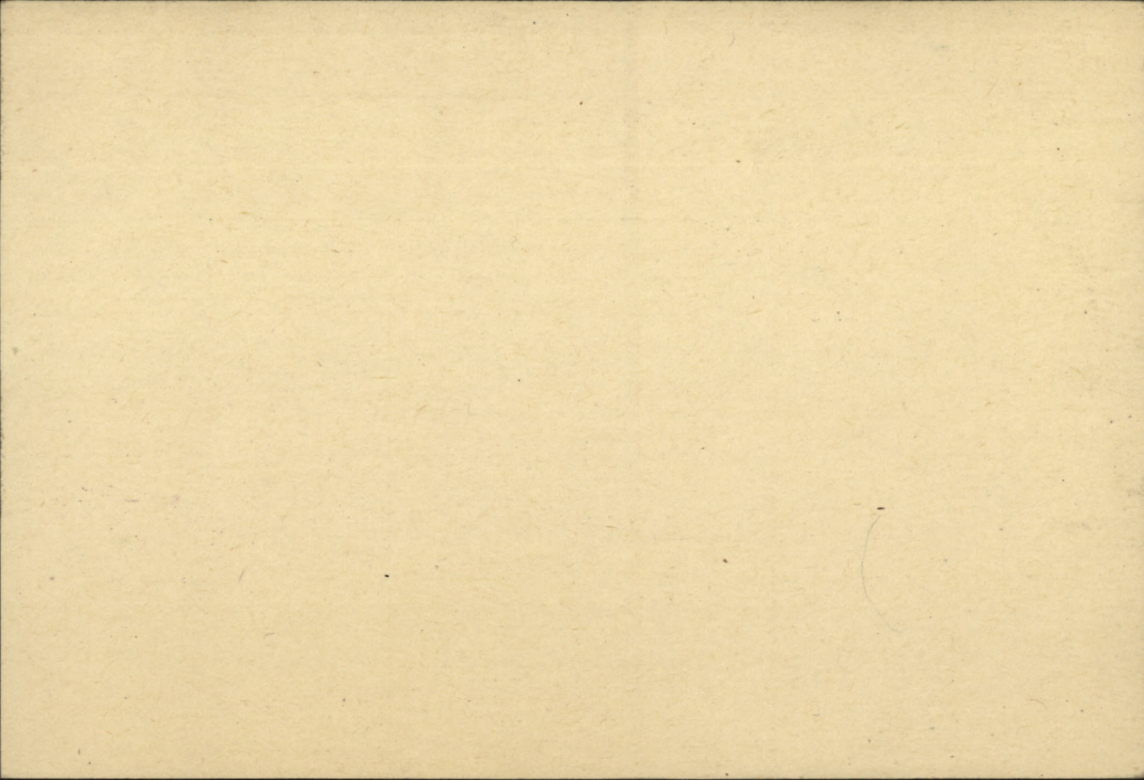



Health O.K. enlistment. January 1916, Winter 1916/1917 England began to lose weight and strength, complained of cough and slight expectoration recovered. France August 21st., 1917 G.S.W. chest spat blood for one day afterwards. Hospital and Convalescent for 3 months on duty until August 1918 complained severe cold, sweats, loss strength given 2 months leave, since then health very fair.

Present Condition: Weight 8 lbs. below normal, cough moderate, slight expectoration, sweats easily.

Chest Examination: Chest flat, expansion fair, no dullness, breath sounds harsh both apices behind

Radiogram of Chest: Apices clear, moderate general peribronchial thickening, few old nodules in roots.

Conclusion: Moderate Chronic Bronchitis.

Recommendation: Not in need of treatment.
