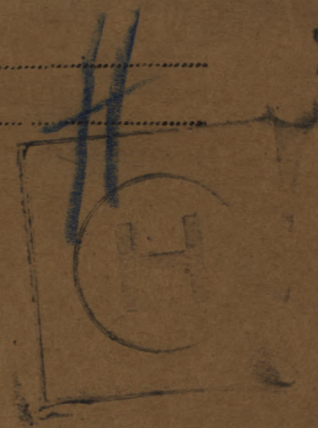

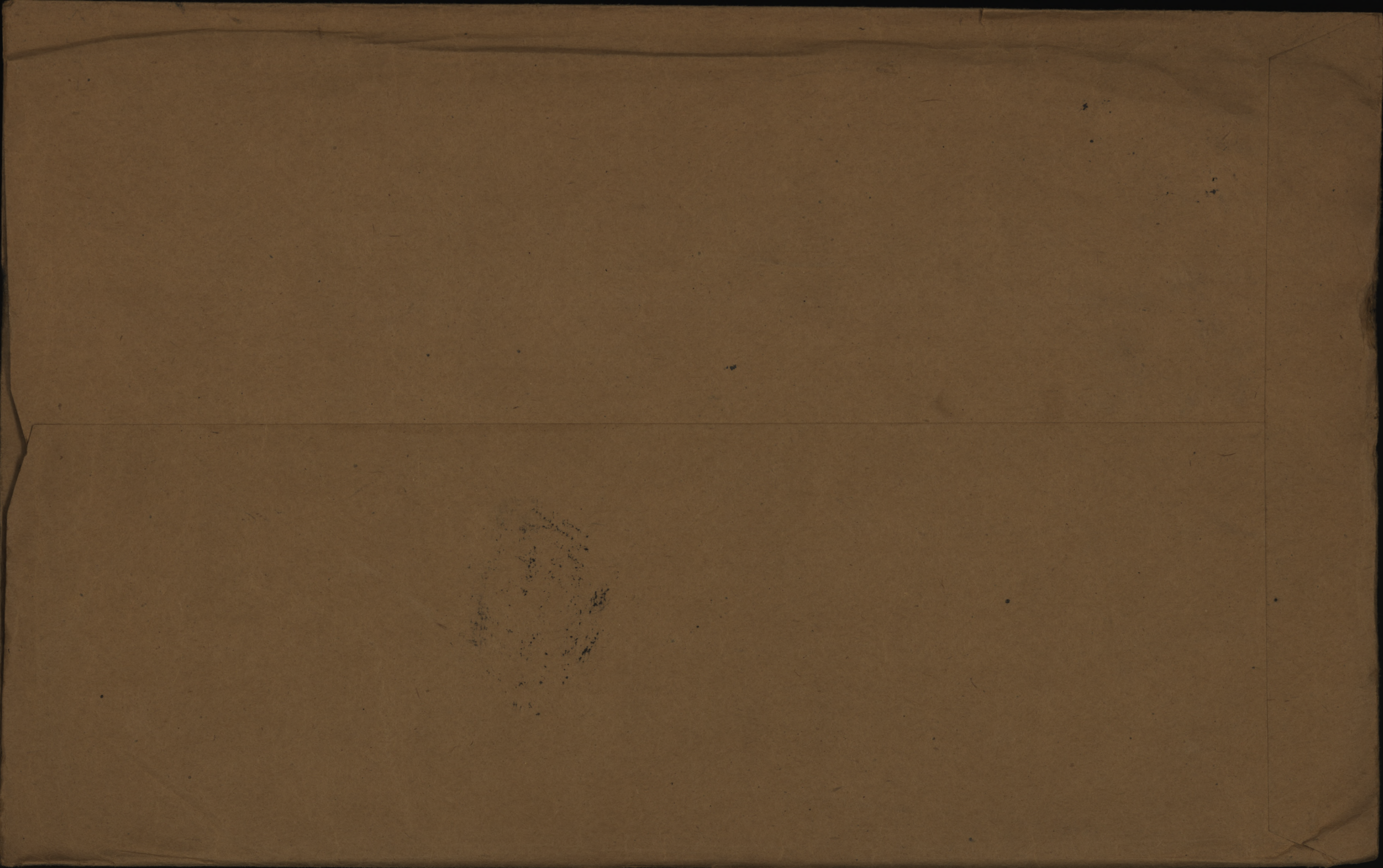

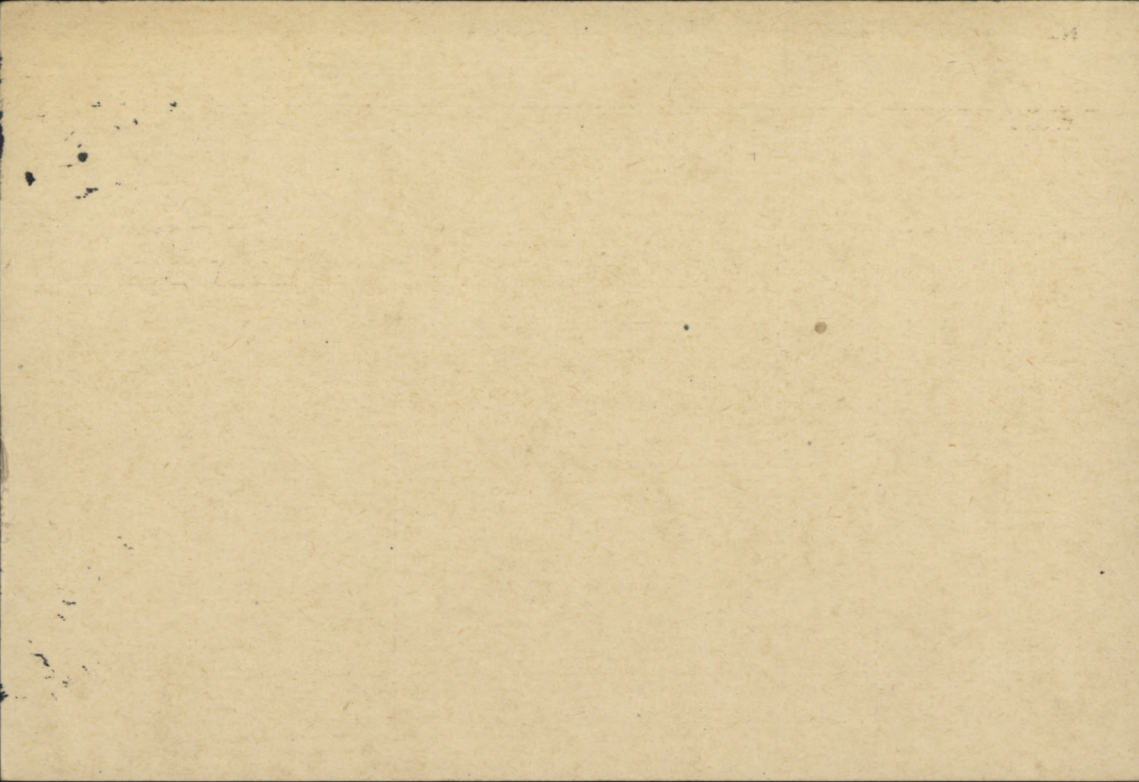

Though the wound in face being in anterior &amp; posterior surfaces of soft maxilla were enlarged and the cavity behind in zygomatic fossa plugged the sharp steel was not discovered. No further bleeding and patient progressed well until 4. 11. 16, the wound cleaning well &amp; discharge becoming on 4. 11. 16 a series of rigors began, anaemias being lost for time to time. He improved again by 15. 11. 16 but on 16. 11. 16 large oedematous swelling appeared right side of neck. This was raised but no further discovered until laryngeal could be made out. He died 6. 0 am 20. 11. 16, having had another series of frequent rigors. His death was due to pyaemia and was a direct result of wound received in action in France.</p>

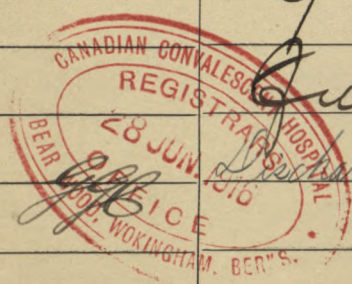
