This man first enlisted in Nov. 1916 with 19<sup>th</sup> Co. C.A.S.C. He was with this unit about 4 to 6 weeks, boarded and discharged as medically unfit. Then he ~~enlisted~~ <sup>re-enlisted</sup> in Apr. and June 1917 to enlist in the Royal Flying Corps and was both times rejected on account of rheumatism. He went to Victoria in July 1917 and was passed by the Medical Board as a recruit for the R. Flying Corps. He went to Toronto July 20 - 1917 and discharged as medically unfit the day after arrival in Toronto. He was returned to Vancouver in July 1917 and did some work as a chauffeur for the Degg Motor Car Co. between then and October 1917 when he registered under the M.S.A., examined by Permanent Medical Board and placed in Category E on account of Rheumatism. From Oct. to Dec. 1917 he did no work, on account of being laid up with rheumatism. On Dec 14/1917 he went to work as motorman for the B.C. Electric Ry. Co. Ltd. and worked for them for 3 weeks when he had some injury to ear (L) by a fuse or switch blowing. He was treated by Dr. Farish, Dr. Anthony and Dr. Macmillan, under the Workmen's Compensation Board. In Apr. 1918 he was ordered to report to the Board of Review and placed in Category A2. He reported for duty on May 4<sup>th</sup> 1918 at Hastings Park, and was sent before Board of Review on May 31 - 1918 and placed in Category B2. Following this classification he was transferred

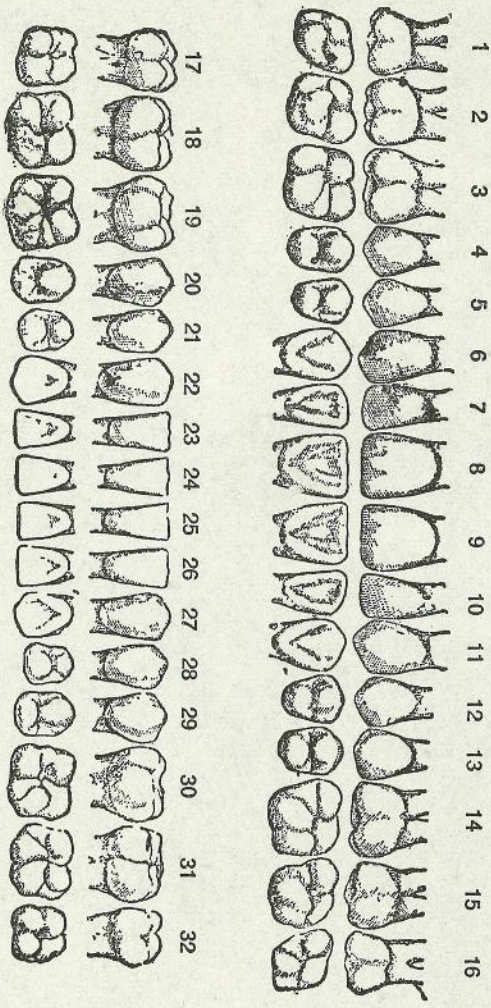

Says he has deafness and bleeding from left ear due to ~~explosion~~ ~~shock~~ explosion of opening street gas switch. He has a mania for collecting antiques and has been much tossed about from A to Z and back again. His right ear he says is quite normal but his answer to tuning forks are not in keeping with a normal hearing. He stoutly maintains that he cannot hear in left ear still when the tuning fork is on his forehead. He cannot hear it in either ear which is not the case if one ear is gone. It is always heard in one ear if hearing is uneven. Again with my voice he could not hear my questions but opened his eyes when I said in the same tones "I am finished you may open your eyes." Again he heard my office nurse ask him his number when I had the right ear stuffed full of wool.
