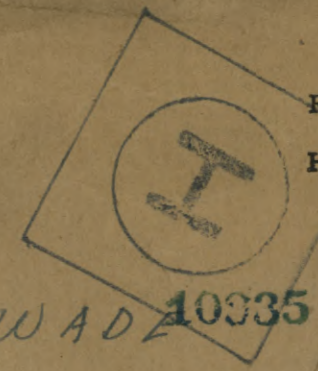

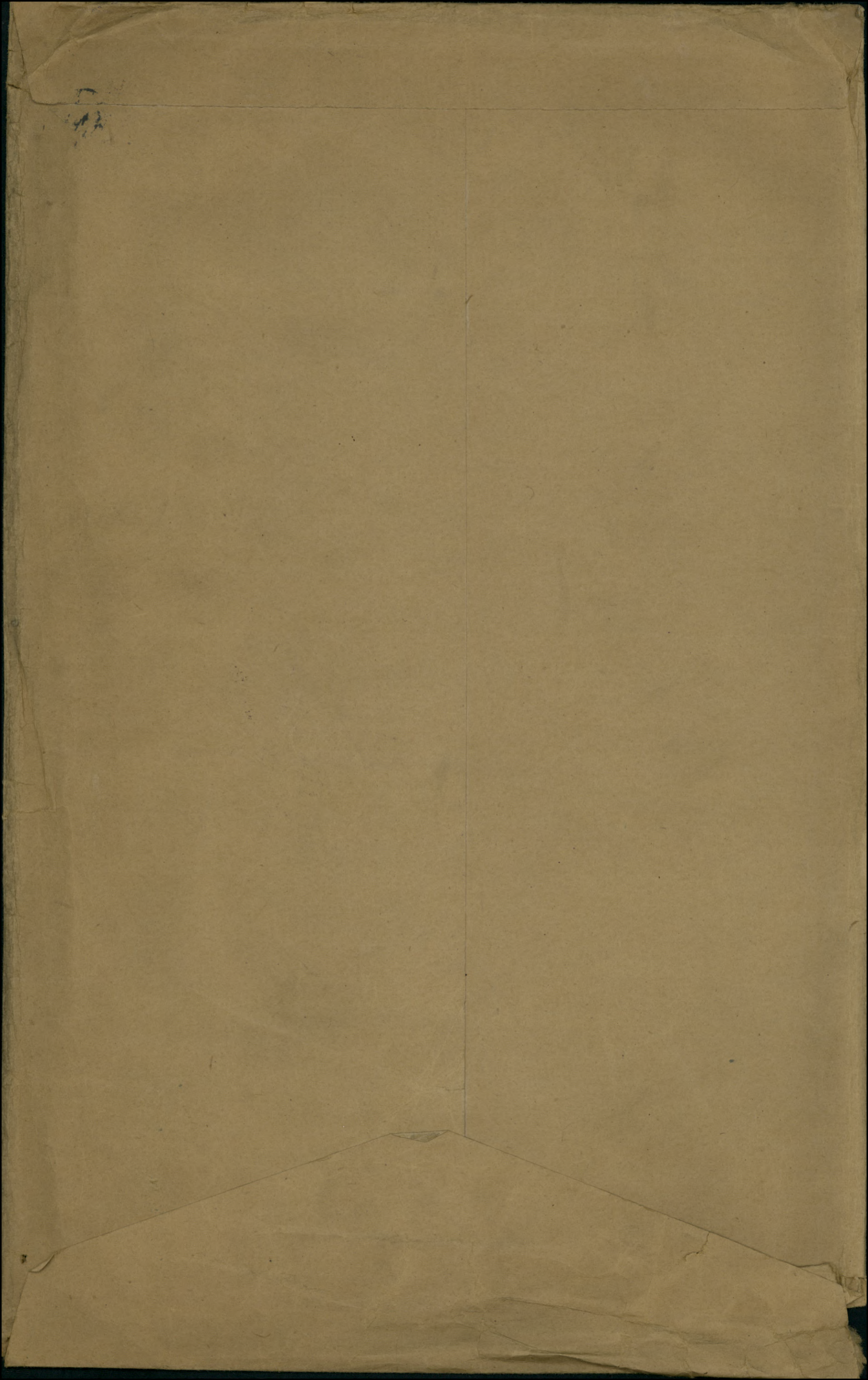

In reply to your letter dated May 13th, I have the honor to report that the marginally noted Officer is on the strength of the District Depot but I have ordered him to appear before a Board here for the purpose of having M.F.B. 380 made up. Copy of this will be forwarded to your office as soon as we can secure the appearance of the marginally noted Officer for a Board.

I have the honor to append hereunder copy of the reports and examinations made in the case of this Officer since March 13th. This is all the record we have of him at the present time, and embodies X Ray report and report on chest conditions, as well as Pathologist's report:-

"March 13th, 1918: Age 37. Occupation previous to enlistment, accounting.
Present Complaint: Shortness of breath. Night sweats. Distressing cough, when lying down.
Family History: While in West Africa had periodical attacks of malaria, and finally had black-water fever. Gonorrhoea 15 years ago. Habits: Twenty cigarettes per day. Two ounces of tobacco per week. Takes liquor in moderate quantities. Moderate amount of tea and coffee. Habits of living regarding sleep, etc., are normal.
Present illness: Was wounded at Passchendale about the 30th of Oct. 1917. Thinks he was gassed the night previously. The wound was by machine gun bullet and in right upper arm; the healing of which was normal and uninterrupted. While in Casualty Clearing Station began to vomit. After 24 hours in Clearing Station was transferred to Plymouth Hospital, Plymouth, England. While there he suffered from loss of voice for one week and severe spasmodic cough, worse on lying down, developed. The cough was accompanied by considerable expectoration. After a period of three weeks in Plymouth he was

transferred to Queen Alexandra Hospital, at Millbank, London. It was found here that in addition to his chest condition he was afflicted with what is called trench mouth. Remained under treatment in this Hospital until Nov. 18th, 1917. Was given medication for the chest condition and a local application for the mouth condition. Boarded and given a month's sick leave. Was marked unfit for general service on Dec. 28th, 1917, after reporting from sick leave, for four months, and light duty for two months, being granted permission to return to Canada. Arrived in Winnipeg on Feb. 12, 1918. Was boarded the 26th of Feb. 1918. Treatment was recommended to consist of thorough examination, followed by proper treatment.

Present Condition: Pain: An aching pain is experienced along the lower border of the ribs on both sides, aggravated by taking deep breath. **Respiratory:** Has a feeling of nasal obstruction. Considerable dropping of mucous in the throat and a severe spasmodic cough, occurring chiefly when the patient lies down, and accompanied by copious expectoration, muco-purulent material, without fetid odor. Very short of breath, particularly on exertion. Slight palpitation on exertion. **Gastro-intestinal:** Appetite good. A feeling of fullness in the epigastrium several times a week, and coming immediately after meals. Vomits first thing in the morning; generally coming as the termination of a spell of coughing. No gas in stomach. Bowels normal. **Nervous:** Frequent severe headaches in frontal region and at nape of neck - almost continuous. Vision and hearing impaired. Would sleep well were it not for a troublesome cough. Has frequent nightmare. No mental depression. **Genito-urinary:** Negative.

General: Present weight, approximately, 173 lbs. Past weight 173; average weight, 160. Standard weight, 160. Height, 5' 8½".

Physical Examination: Very well developed and nourished.

Head: No stigmata nor congenital abnormalities. Skin and mucous membranes free from eruptions; good color. Pupils equal and regular. React to light and convergence. Ocular movements normal. Breathing through the nostrils obstructed. Considerable pyorrhea with retraction of gums. Teeth in fair condition otherwise. Pharynx congested. Excess of mucous present.

CHEST: Lungs negative, to percussion. Auscultation reveals the presence of mucous and rales in the bronchial area of both lungs. **SUMMARY:** Aching pain lower border of ribs, both sides; aggravated by deep breathing. Occasional fulness in epigastrium after meals. Vomits in morning. Frequent severe headaches in frontal region. Sleep interrupted by coughing. Breathing through nostrils obstructed. Pyorrhoea with retraction of gums. Pharynx congested. Excess of mucous present. Mucous rales in bronchial area, both lungs.

X-Ray examination does not show any area suggestion of tuberculosis. Peribronchial markings are somewhat too well marked.

Report of sputum examination is not yet available.

Recommendation: Examination of nose and throat; also sinuses; by Capt. McKenty. X-Ray sinuses - Dr. Mathers.

March 13-18. Pathological report on sputum - negative.

March 15th, 1918.

X-Ray report apparently normal - no pus visible. To report to office for endoscopy.

Physical examination: Very well developed and nourished. Head: No stigmata nor congenital abnormalities. Skin and mucous membranes free from eruptions; good color. Pupils equal and regular. React to light and convergence. Ocular movements normal. Breathing through the nostrils obstructed. Considerable pyorrhoea with retraction of gums. Teeth in fair condition otherwise. Pharynx congested. Excess of mucous present. Chest: Lungs negative, to percussion. Auscultation reveals the presence of mucous and rales in the bronchial area of both lungs. PRESENT COMPLAINT: Shortness of breath. Night sweats. Dis-
tressing cough, when lying down.

Family History: not significant.

Past History: While in West Africa had periodical attacks of
malaria, and finally had black-water fever. Gonorrhoea 15
years ago. **Habits:** Twenty cigarettes per day. Two ounces
of tobacco per week. Takes liquor in moderate quantities.
Moderate amount of tea and coffee. Habits of living regard-
ing sleep, etc., are normal.

Present illness: Was wounded at Passchendaele about the 30th of
Oct. 1917. Thinks he was gassed the night previously. The
wound was by machine gun bullet and in right upper arm; the
healing of which was normal and uninterrupted. While in
Casualty Clearing Station began to vomit. After 24 hours
in Clearing Station was transferred to Plymouth Hospital,
Plymouth, England. While there he suffered from loss of
voice for one week and a severe spasmodic cough, worse on
lying down, developed. The cough was accompanied by con-
siderable expectoration. After a period of three weeks in
Plymouth he was transferred to Queen Alexandra Hospital, at
Millbank, London. It was found here, that in addition to
his chest condition he was afflicted with what is called
trench mouth. Remained under treatment in this Hospital
until Nov. 18th, 1917. Was given medication for the chest
condition and a local application for the mouth condition.
Boarded and given a month's sick leave. Was marked unfit
for general service on Dec. 28, 1917, after reporting from
sick leave, for four months, and light duty for two months,
being granted permission to return to Canada. Arrived in
Winnipeg on Feb. 12, 1918. Was boarded the 26th Feb. 1918.
Treatment was recommended to consist of thoro examination,
followed by proper treatment.

Present Condition: Pain: An aching pain is experienced along the
lower border of the ribs on both sides, aggravated by taking
deep breath. **Respiratory:** Has a feeling of nasal obstruct-
ion. Considerable dropping of mucous in the throat and a
severe spasmodic cough, occurring chiefly when the patient
lies down, and accompanied by copious expectoration, muco-
purulent material, without fetid odor. Very short of breath,
particularly on exertion. Slight palpitation on exertion.

Gastro-intestinal: Appetite good. A feeling of fullness
in the epigastrium several times a week, and coming immedi-
ately after meals. Vomits first thing in the morning; generally
coming as the termination of a spell of coughing. No gas in
stomach. Bowels normal.

Nervous: Frequent severe headaches in frontal region and at
nape of neck - almost continuous. Vision and hearing un-
impaired. Would sleep well were it not for a troublesome
cough. Has frequent nightmare. No mental depression.

Genito-urinary: Negative.

PHYSICAL EXAMINATION: Very well developed and nourished.

HEAD: No stigmata nor congenital abnormalities. Skin and mucous membranes free from eruptions; good color. Pupils equal and regular? React to light and convergence. Ocular movements normal. Breathing through the nostrils obstructed. Considerable pyorrhoeas with retraction of gums. Teeth in fair condition otherwise. Pharynx congested. Excess of mucous present.

CHEST: Lungs negative, to percussion. Auscultation reveals the presence of mucous and rales in the bronchial area of both lungs.

SUMMARY: Aching pain lower border of ribs, both sides; aggravated by deep breathing. Occasional fulness in epigastrium after meals. Vomits in morning. Frequent severe headaches in frontal region. Sleep interrupted by coughing. Breathing through nostrils obstructed. Pyorrhoea with retraction of gums. Pharynx congested. Excess of mucous present. Mucous rales in bronchial area, both lungs.
