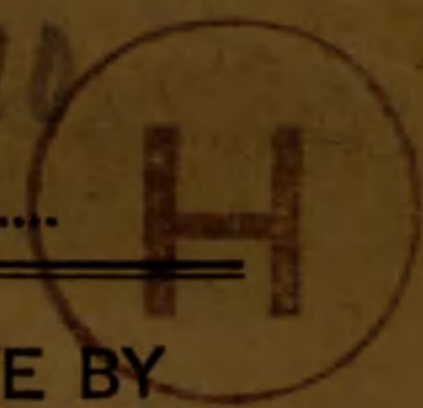

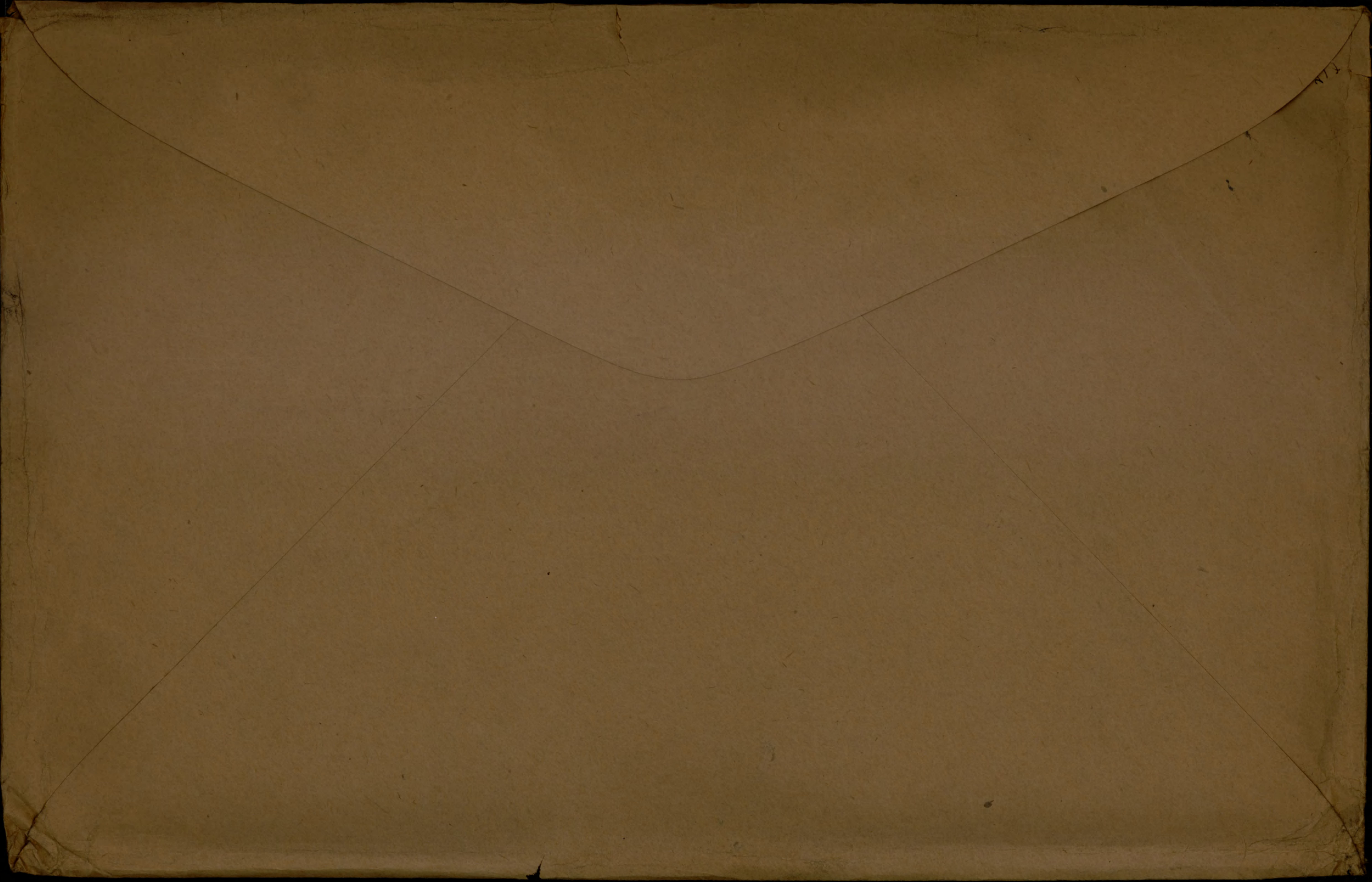

CONDITION ON ADMISSION AND PROGRESS OF CASE.

D.O.H. Major Armour, E.B.P. Oct. 8th, 1919.
Condition when finally boarded for discharge.

On 30-9-18 at Cambrai, G.S.W. of L. Forearm, thro wrist, causing extensive destruction of carpal and metacarpal bones. Transferred from C.S.S. to Rouen from here to Horton Hospital on 5-10-18 where four different operations were done on wrist for removal of bone. Splinters and infection, most of the carpus being excised. Transferred on 20-12-18 to I.O.D. Hospital, London where dressings for infected wound continued. Trans. 10-1-19 to Perkins Bull Hosp. where he developed Myriapelas in L. Arm and trans. to Can. Red Cross Hosp. and about 31-1-19 was sent home to Canada; wound still discharging. Adm. to D.O.H. 12-2-19 where wound healed about 30-4-19 and has remained healed ever since. Has been having hydrotherapy and massage for five months up to present time with slight improvement in strength of fingers and flexing thumb and first two fingers. On 30-9-18 65% of muscles on rt. side of chest wall in lower axilla, dressed at C.C.S. and on 5-10-18 was operated on at Horton Hospital where wound was excised and cleaned; wd. healed by 20-12-18 and has remained healed. Present disability dating from that time with slight improvement.

Mumps, Scarlet Fever, Double Pneumonia in childhood. Appendectomy in June 1914; no disability from any of these illnesses. Gassed, followed by Bronch. in October 1917 at Passchendale, cured, no disability. On 30-9-18 rec'd shell fragment in L. Temporal region of head fracturing L. parietal bone-healed, no disability. 1. **OBJ.**-marked atrophy of forearm, especially lower half, limitation of pronation, slt. limitation of supination, extensive scar involving dorsum of wrist and extending around ulnar side where it is depressed and adherent, ext. depressed adherent scar on radial side of wrist involving 1st metacarpals and 1st interosseous space. Ulnar scar very tender to touch, radial scar moderately so. Wd. healed. X-Ray shows loss of practically all of the carpal bones. Has no voluntary extension, no radial flexion, no ulnar flexion and 10 palmar flexion at wrist; this movement being slow, weak & painful. Dorsum of hand and fingers numb in feeling but can appreciate pain, heat and cold. Palm of hand and fingers numb but more sensitive to heat and cold than dorsum. Can open and close thumb slightly. Has 30° flexion voluntary at metacarpo-phalangeal joint, no active, but slight passive flexion at interphalangeal joint. Index finger carried in partial flexion can feel two distal phalanges sltly. with slt. extension of these phalanges. No active but slt. passive flexion & extension at metacarpo-phalangeal jt. middle finger carried in semi flexion has slight power of flexion and extension of two distal phalanges, slight passive movement at metacarpo-phalangeal joint but no active movement. Ring finger carried in slight flexion and extension of two distal phalanges, no voluntary and only slight passive movement at the metacarpo-phalangeal jt. Little finger - very slight voluntary flexion and extension of distal phalange but no other power. Has slight grip in index finger and in distal phalange middle finger. Hand is cyanosed and cold. **SUBJECTIVE** - Almost total loss of function of hand and wrist, has always to be watchful to protect it against injury. Always carries hand in wrist splint. Hand is useless to him as a Civil Engineer.

2. **OBJECTIVE** - Scar 4 1/2" x 1" in right midd. axilla, densely adherent to 6th, 7th and 8th ribs, keloid thickening presenting a ridge up the centre of scar. Scar quite tender to pressure. Wound healed. **SUBJECTIVE** - Any movement of the right shoulder that is at all extensive in amount, causes a painful pulling in region of scar. Has to guard against side being touched because of pain.

CONDITION ON DISCHARGE, Oct 7th. Has been under massage, Hydro, manipulation for 5 months, with but slight improvement. Has slight flexion & extension in 2 distal phalanges of 1st, 2nd & 3rd fingers; can open & close thumb slightly.

This Officer reports from Petrograd Hosp. - was evacuated from France 6-10-18. Received S.W.s. on the left side of head - fracturing L. Parietal Bone. Left hand causing extensive destruction of carpal and Medacarpal Bones - Flesh wound R. Lower axillary space. Scar of head wound was explored and sutured at C.C.S. - He suffered considerably from headache at first, this gradually declined and finally disappeared towards end of October. Left Ear discharged from a time, L. Hand was put in splints. Wound became infected and discharged pus for a time. Wound R. Lower axilla healed, normally. Had four operations on L. Hand Carpus was almost completely excised.

Nerves and vessels not injured. There is a large granulating wound on front of wrist. Styloid process of ulna and Metacarpal bone of index finger fractures. Wounds are in splint and sling. There is slight movement in thumb, index and middle fingers. He is somewhat pale, is somewhat underweight. Is otherwise normal.

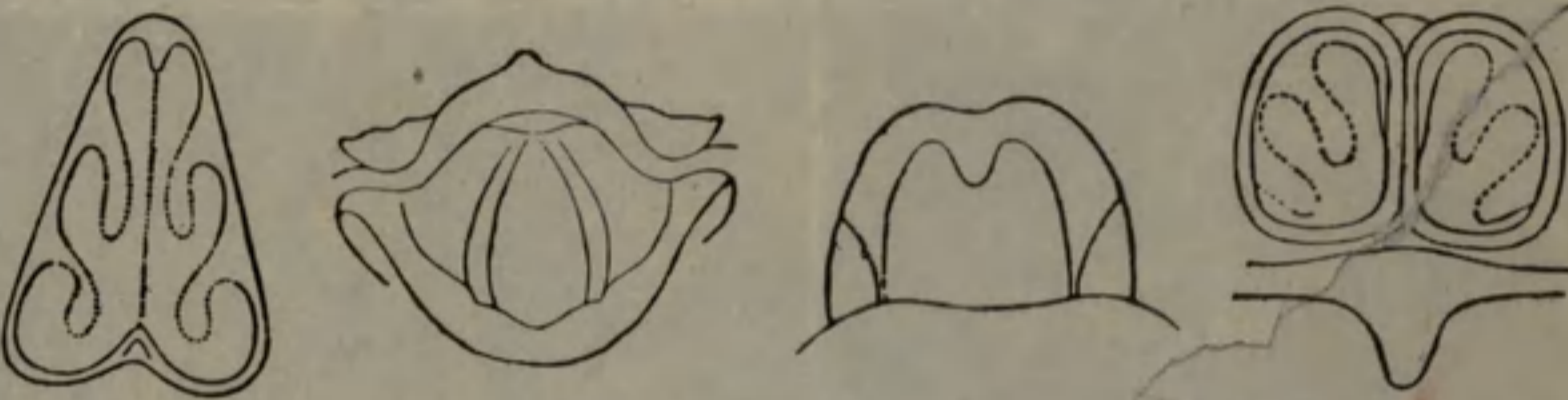

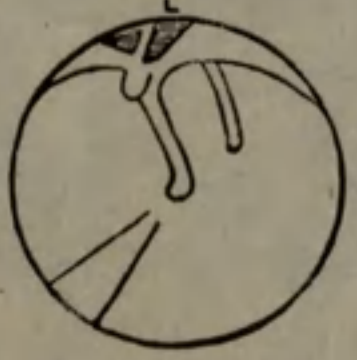

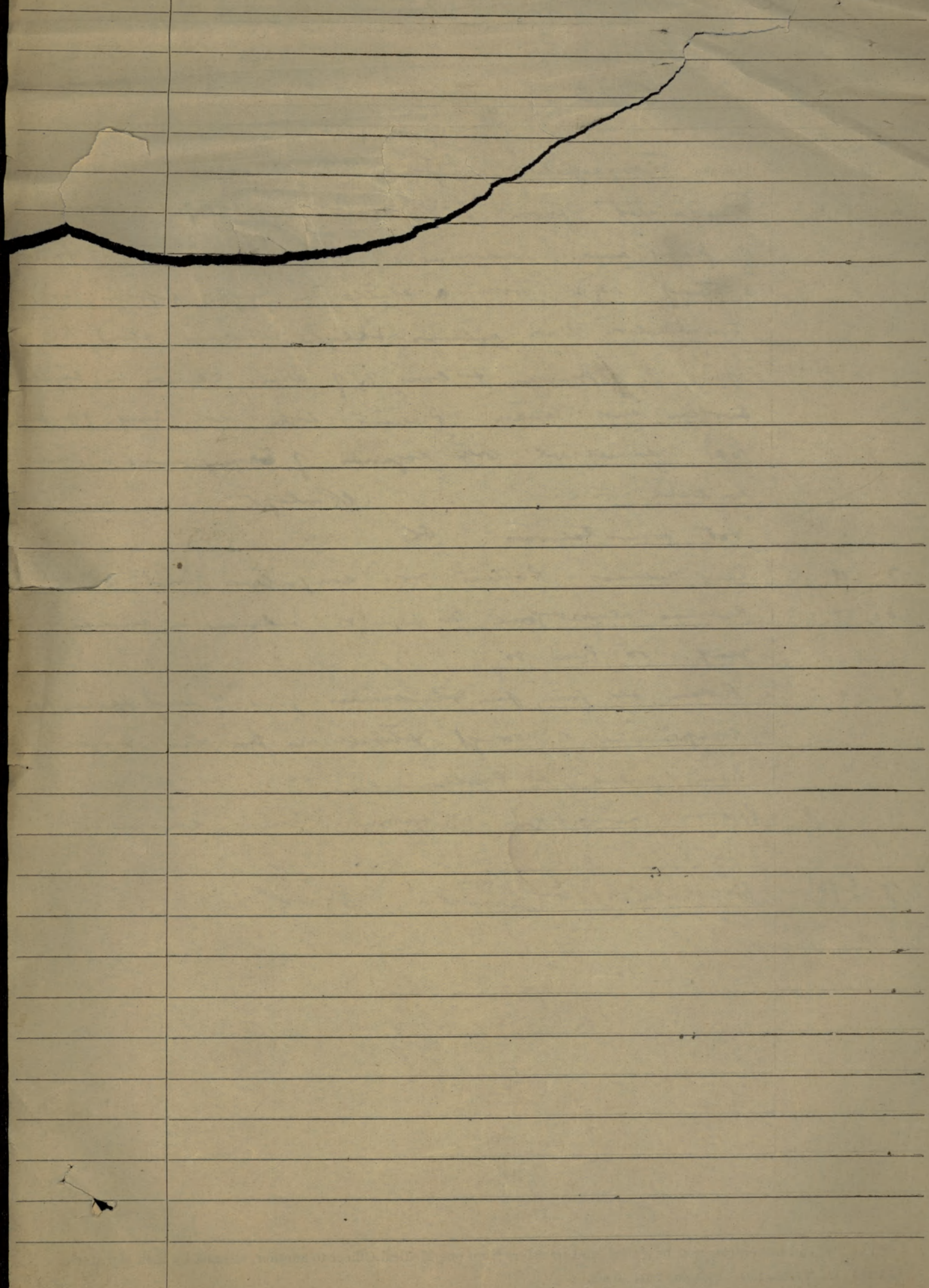

INSTRUCTIONS WHICH MUST BE READ BY MEDICAL OFFICERS

1. In using this Form the "Instructions issued for the guidance of Medical Officers serving on Medical Boards" issued by the B.P.C. and instructions issued by Militia H.Q., Ottawa, will be carefully followed.
2. The Medical Officer in charge of the case is responsible for the proper completion of Sections 1 to 17 of this Form and will obtain the signature of the invalid to the "Statement," page 3. The President of the Board of Medical Officers is responsible for the proper completion of sections reserved for recording the "Opinion of the Medical Board."
3. In answering the questions, Medical Officers will carefully obtain and record the invalid's statements concerning his condition. They will distinguish observations made by themselves from hearsay. They will distinctly state the authority for statements not resulting from their personal observation; it must be made clear whether such statements are obtained from the invalid concerned, from witnesses, or from documents, Regimental or otherwise.
4. Special care is required in answering question 9. Read the questions carefully. All questions must be answered.
5. If space provided under any section is insufficient add another sheet. Such sheets must be initialled by the Medical Board.
6. A note will be made of attached papers by the Medical Board under the section "Opinion of Medical Board."
7. Under no circumstances may information other than that in sections 7, 8, 9 and 10 be communicated to the invalid, directly or indirectly.
8. The nomenclature of diseases must be followed, if possible, as described in "List of Diseases" printed in the order in which they appear in the Annual Report on the Health of the Army, published in London (1915), by Messrs. Harrison & Sons.

1. On 30-9-18 at Cambrai, G.S.W. of L. Forearm, thro wrist causing extensive destruction of carpal and metacarpal bones. Transferred from C.C.S. to Rouen, from here to Horton Hospital on 5-10-18 where four different operations were done on wrist for removal of bone. Splinters and infection, most of carpus being excised. Transferred on 20-12-18 to I.O.D.E. Hospital, London, where dressings for infected wound continued. Transferred 10-1-19 to Perkins Bull Hospital where he developed Erysipelas in L. Arm and transferred to Can. Red Cross Hospital and about 31-1-19 was sent home to Canada; wounds still discharging. Admitted D.O.H. 12-2-19 where wound healed about 30-4-19 and has remained healed ever since. Has been having hydrotherapy and massage for five months up to present time with slight improvement in strength of fingers and flexing thumb and first two fingers.

2. On 30-9-18 G.S.W. of muscles on right side of chest wall in lower axilla pressed at C.C.S. and on 5-10-18 was operated on at Horton Hospital where wound was excised and cleansed; wound healed by 20-12-18, and has remained healed. Present disability dating from that time with slight improvement.
