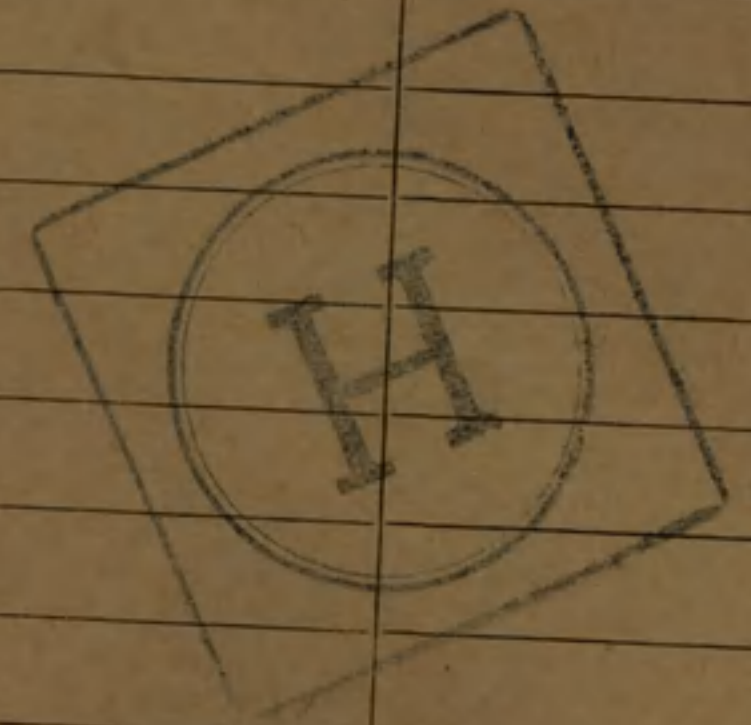

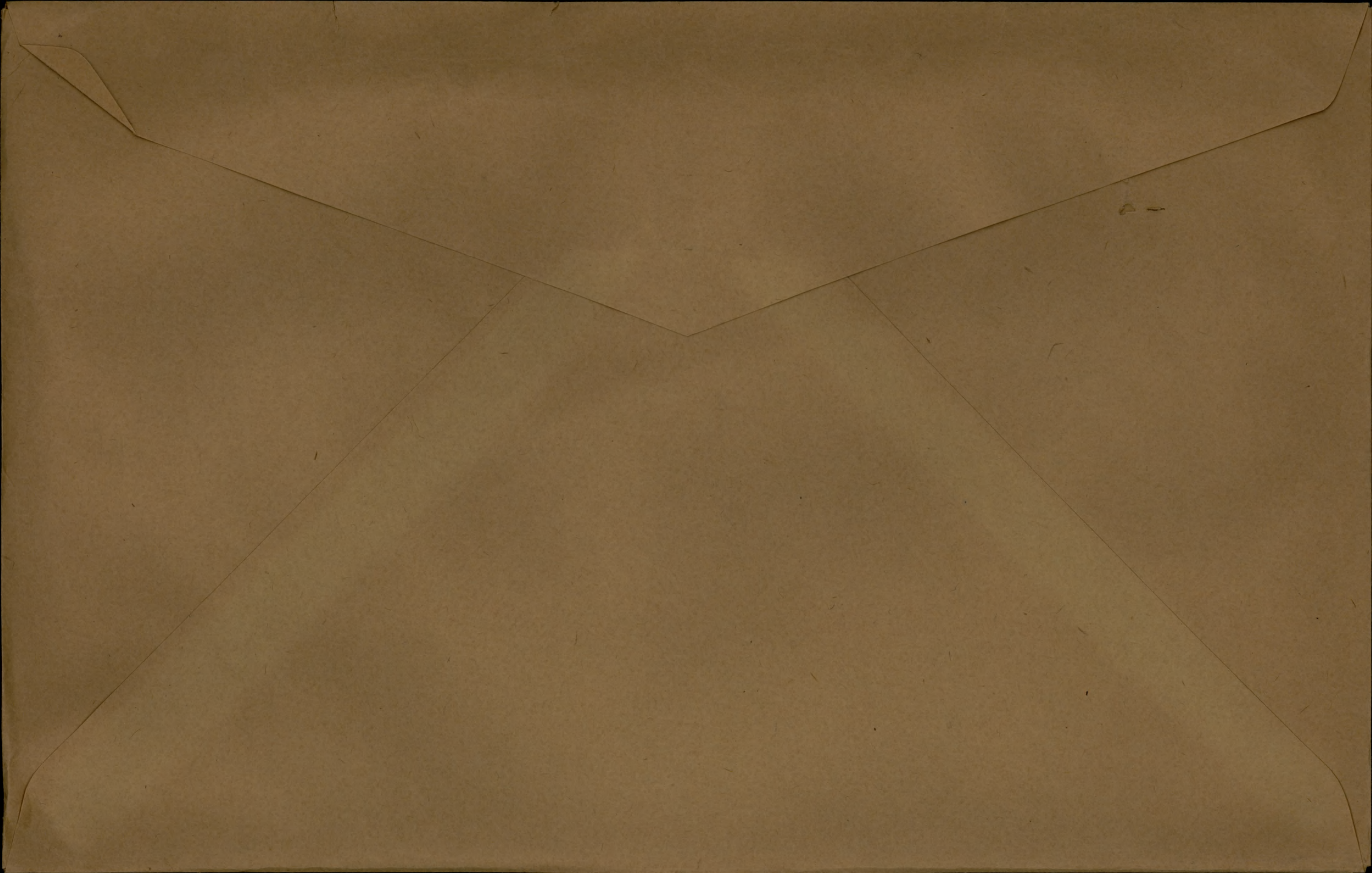

You will remember that in my letter of January 22nd, I informed you that I had operated on the above, my nephew, in the Preston Royal Infirmary, removing his appendix, which was thickened and congested and which had caused his previous attack of abdominal pain, etc. I then said that I thought at the end of six weeks (which will run to Thursday, March 4th) he ought to be in good health and ready to return to his duties.

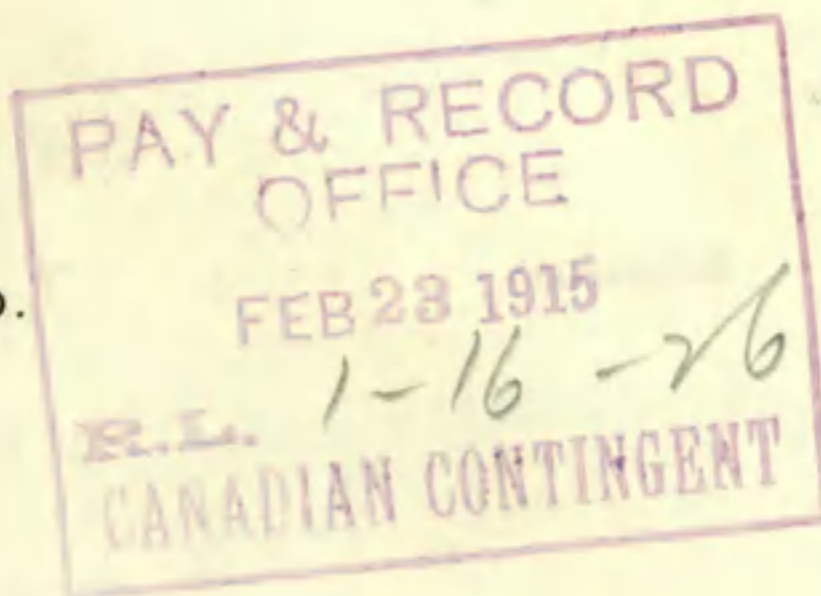



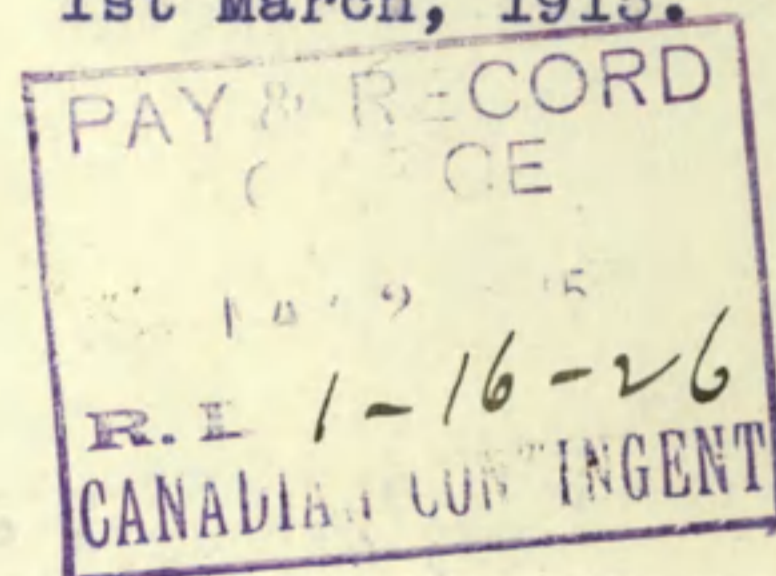
