





I was informed that a man had fallen down the ventilating shaft in the fo forward stoke hold I immediately went to the dispensary for stimulants and first aid kit then proceeding to the stoke hold. I found a man lying unconscious face downwards on a small heap of cinders. I had the man carried carefully into the engineroom where there was light. The mans condition was very low, pulse weak and slow. Stimulants were given with no noticeable effect, examination showed no bones broken. There was a small cut on the back of the head about an inche long, not deep, right side of the face bruised, no outward sign of any fracture of the skull. I considered that the mans condition was so serious that it did not warrant him being carried to the Ship's Hospital. Blankets were brought down and the man was made as comfortable as possible in the engineroom. The patients condition became gradually worse at 9.20 P. M. he died from what I judged to be shock and severe concussion of the brain. I was assisted in my exemination of the injured man by the Ship's Surgeon who arrived on the scene shortly after me. After making the man as comfortable as possible I reported to Capt. Scott, M. O. 259th. Bn. Can. Rifles, who retunred with me to the injured man.
