**I****WAR DIARIES, CA****Instructions for Compilation and Despatch****1. A War Diary is SECRET.**

2. The War Diary takes the place of the Historical Record when on active service. (KR (Can) Para 1530). Its objects are: to supply authentic material for the history of the unit, and of the force; to furnish a historical record of operations; and to provide data upon which to base improvements in training, equipment, organization and administration.

3. Unless otherwise ordered, the original and duplicate copies are sent on the first day of the succeeding month, through the usual channels, to the AG 2nd Echelon, wherever that office may be. The triplicate copy may be held by the unit for three months and then forwarded, also through the usual channels, to AG, 2nd Echelon. In Canada all copies as above are sent through the usual channels to NDHQ; in England to Canadian Military HQ.

(i) District Officers Commanding will arrange to forward War Diaries to National Defence Headquarters addressed Director Historical Section, GS (War Diaries) with covering roll, in duplicate, showing unit from which received and number of copies in each case; the duplicate 'roll' will be returned as a receipt.

(ii) Formations and Units in the Ottawa Area Command will forward War Diaries direct to National Defence Headquarters (addressed Director Historical Section, GS (War Diaries)).

4. Post-war disposal will be as under:—  
Original—retained at Ottawa for historical purposes.  
Duplicate—to British Record Office for historical purposes.  
Triplicate—to unit for custody with unit records.

5. The War Diary will be entered up daily on MF M11 and rendered monthly in triplicate (Mbn Instr for CM 1937. App "C"). Each entry will be initialled by the officer detailed to keep the War Diary, which will be signed at the end of each month by the commander. (FSR Vol II, Sec 35, para 3 iii).

**II**

6. The following should be recorded daily as events occur:—

- (i) Important orders, instructions, reports, messages or despatches received and issued, and decisions taken. *Original documents* should be attached as appendices to the original copy of the War Diary; *copies* should, whenever available, be attached as appendices to the duplicate and triplicate copies of the War Diary.
- (ii) Daily map location, employment, movements and dispositions of unit headquarters and of batteries, companies, etc. March tables should be attached as appendices.
- (iii) Important movements of officers and matters relating to the duties of each branch of the staff. A complete set of the *routine orders and instructions, Part I Orders*, issued by the unit during the month should be attached as an appendix to the original copy.
- (iv) Detailed account of operations—to include:— Exact hour, location and circumstances of important occurrences. Movements and names of neighbouring units. Commanders of batteries, companies, etc, names of Officers and number of OR (i) engaged and (ii) battle casualties. Dispositions, activities and identity of enemy forces. Prisoners and trophies captured. Ammunition expended. Factors affecting operations, topographical and climatic. *Maps and sketches* showing dispositions of batteries, companies, etc, at important phases. The record of *communications, both written and verbal*, received or despatched during active operations as an appendix. A complete set of the *operation orders and instructions* issued during the month. Notes on conferences and *reports* rendered to higher formations, or received from lower formations, as appendices to the original copy.
- (v) Nature and description of trenches, field works or accommodation occupied or constructed. Meteorological notes.

(vi) Changes in establishment or strength. Names and ranks of officers and number of OR. Attachment of units and individuals. Reinforcements. *Weekly Field Returns of Officers and OR* should be attached as appendices to the original copy. *Copy of Part II Orders* should be attached to the triplicate copy only. Changes in organization, stores, transport, etc.

7. It is essential that all copies of both text and appendices are legible. Appendices will be numbered and referenced to the text in the last column of the form. Current issues of any regimental publication should be attached.

8. It will be found convenient at the end of each month, when the War Diary is being completed and the correspondence in unit files for the month is being reviewed and distributed (FSR Vol I, sec 171, para 3) if the material considered to be of historical value in the light of the above is attached as appendices to the original copy of the War Diary, the file title and reference number being entered in conformity with the filing system.

9. A good war diary makes possible the accurate and detailed reconstruction of circumstances, conditions and action.

NOTE: If monthly diary is more than one inch thick, use a second folder. If appendices are bulky, tie folder up with tape or string to make a firm package.

UNIT OFFICE FILING SYSTEM  
AND RECORDS

"Every office will arrange for the filing and custody of its own correspondence." (FSR Vol I, Sec 171.3.)

1. *Titles and Numbering of Files*

A simple filing system adaptable for use in any military office at home or in the field is illustrated by the "List of File Titles" overleaf.

All documents handled by a unit fall into one or other of the nine categories enumerated, 1 to 9. The titles of the nine main divisions are based on British army operations, organization, administration and the regulations governing. Each title may be broken down into ten component parts or sub-titles, by adding a dash and subsidiary numbers 0 to 9. In turn each of these may be further broken down by adding a second dash and a third digit, and if necessary a third dash and a fourth digit. Thus 4-6-3 might be "Cooking Course at Kingston". According to circumstances, a fighting unit would expand the 1-3 prefix to accommodate all arms and services with which it may be concerned.

2. *Date reference*

The method outlined in FSR, Vol II, Appendix IV, will be used for all purposes, e.g., 2 Feb 40.

3. *Documents for Preservation*

The monthly review of correspondence (FSR Vol I, sec 171.3) is facilitated and future confusion avoided by jacketing the material in "Category ii" (i.e., "no longer required", etc) to conform with the system.

4. *Correspondence in the Field*

The functioning of the office of a formation or unit during active operations may be simplified by keeping a log or register of all orders and messages, written or verbal, received or sent during the action. This may conveniently be done by extending the use of the "Field Register of Communications Received or Despatched", (Army Form 2040, FSR Vol I, sec 171) to include verbal as well as written orders and messages in chronological order as received or sent.

Time of sending and of receipt are of importance second only to time of event, and should be entered both on the office copy of every field message or other document, and in the log or register. A carbon copy for contemporary reference of the commander or others concerned is desirable.

PRESERVE IMPORTANT ORIGINAL DOCUMENTS FOR POSTERITY

VI

A brief précis of written orders, reports and messages, with the sender's number, is sufficient, for they will be kept on file. But particular care is necessary in making entries of times of moves and of verbal orders, reports or conversations, by telephone or otherwise, which in the stress of action, may not otherwise be recorded on paper. In battle, operations messages dealt with by one officer may number over twenty-five per hour for several hours on end.

The record should be kept convenient to the telephone. Entries may be made by a clerk, or by the officer on duty at the telephone.

Such a record is invaluable to the commander in making appreciations of the situation during the action, and in compiling his report on the action afterwards. It is contemporary evidence of the highest quality, and therefore is of the highest historical value, and should be attached as an appendix to the original copy of the War Diary, together with the original documents sent and received.

### UNAUTHORIZED POSSESSION OF WEAPONS - COURTS OF INQUIRY

2. SECURITY VETTING OF ALIEN MARRIAGE APPLICATIONS.

1. Effective immediately GI(b) will NO longer carry out security investigations of proposed brides in accordance with Cdn RO (BAOR) 780.

2. Following action will be taken to ensure proposed alien brides are politically trustworthy.

DUTCH

(a) Unit concerned will ensure that the proposed bride is issued with a certificate of political reliability either by the POLITIEKE OPSPOORINGSDIENST (POD) (Political Research Service) or BUREAU NATIONALE VEILIGHEID, SCHEVENINGEN, THE HAGUE.

(b) Branches of the POD are located in all towns. All branches can issue certificates, providing the girls are politically reliable.

(c) A certificate issued by one of the above orgs will be fwd with each application for marriage where the proposed wife is Dutch. It will NOT of course be required in cases where GI(b) have already given security approval, indicated on Appx 'A'.

(d) The certificates mentioned above are quite apart from the certificate of good moral behaviour which is required in all cases.

BELGIAN AND FRENCH

(e) Unit concerned will ensure that the proposed bride is issued with a certificate of political reliability from both a burgomaster and chief of police.

(f) These certificates will be fwd with each application for marriage where the proposed wife is Belgian or French. They will NOT of course be required in cases where GI(b) have already given's ecurity approval, indicated on Appx 'A'.

(g) Para 2(d) above equally applies to Belgian and French marriages.

3. Alien marriage applications will continue to be fwd through normal channels to the HQ or to Cdn Sec 1 Ech HQ BAOR, as the case may be, for necessary approval.

4. In the case of Cdn Sec 1 Ech HQ BAOR an offr in that HQ will sign for GI(b) on Appx 'A' provided the necessary certificate(s) of political security of the proposed wife has been obtained as above, and there are no other known objections.

## 2. SPEED LIMITS - 3 CID (CAOF) AREA

3 Cdn Inf Div ROs No. 7,90 and 107 are combined, amended and republished herewith for the attention of all concerned:

1. All mil vehs (Brit or Cdn) will adhere to the following maximum speed limits within the area controlled by 3 C.I.D. CAOF:

Cars over 10 HP .....	50 mph

Motorcycles.....	40 mph
Trucks, Heavy Utility (HUC,HUP and HUW)....	35 mph
Trucks, all types except Jeeps.....	35 mph
Load carriers exceeding 3 tons load capacity	35 mph
Coaches and Troop Carriers.....	35 mph
Cars and Jeeps with trailers.....	35 mph
Tracked Vehicles (incl Tractors) when NOT towing.....	20 Mph
Tracked vehicles (incl Tractors)when towing	.20 mph
Tractors (Wheeled) when NOT towing.....	30 mph
All other vehs (incl Tractors Wheeled towing Arty eqpts) when towing independent trailers	20 mph
Tk Tptrs (incl Tk Rec Tptrs) with a load capacity of 20 tons or over.....	20 mph

2. Storn disciplinary action will be taken against the driver of any veh exceeding the above speed limits.

3. The above speed limits are applicable to all UD/CM vehs, incl requisitioned and captured vehs, proceeding individually, but do not apply to vehs travelling in convoy for which speed have been laid down in op or other instrs. Compliance with the above maximum speed limits will not absolve any dvr from his obligation to drive with due care and regard for safety, having regard to the prevailing conditions.

4. Occasions of op necessity may justify speeds in excess of the above scale. Such occasions should whenever possible be covered by the written authority of a responsible offr.

5. (a) The speed limit for all towns and villages is 30 mph or 48 km per hr.

  - (b) All applications for discharge in the UK from personnel posted or attached to such Cdn Repat Depot will be submitted to the Discharge Board above-mentioned who will consider the application and after interviewing the applicant will make recommendations and submit same to CINHQ for approval.
13. OFFICERS: Officers desirous of being discharged in the UK, on being posted or attached to the appropriate Cdn Repat Depot or at any time after being officially informed that he is about to be repatriated, will complete an application on Form CF A383. The material referred to in para 7 above will accompany the application which will be fwd through normal channels to CINHQ (Attention MS).

Every day ships dock at our ports and trains move over the rails to Canadian cities towns and hamlets bringing home those legions whose victory over the enemies of freedom have won us the happy years ahead. This Christmas will not see happiness in every Canadian home, many of your comrades have made the greatest human sacrifice that this day of peace might be possible. All of us remember the price that they paid and will not forget them in the happy hours of this holiday season. To the soldiers of Canada both those in uniform and those who have returned to civilian life I extend the wish that the new year will bring all prosperity and joy which has been in your hearts and minds through the troublesome days of the past.

f) MISCELLANEOUS

1. Investigations are being made in HOOKSIEL regarding certain former Nazis Officials who are still holding responsible civic positions.

2. The aim of these investigations is to clean the administration of the a/m village.

3. Very good reports are expected from these investigations as we are in possession of authentic documents proving the accusations which will be made against the persons concerned.

1. It is reported that there are a number of Polish Offrs operating in the Brit Zone without authority.
2. The Polish authorities agree that unauthorized Polish Offrs should be arrested. Mil Gov at 30 Corps HQ will therefore ensure that all Polish Offrs working in 30 Corps Dist are equipped with proper credentials which are either on AF B2606A or a card issued by and bearing the stamp of the Polish Mil Mission or Polish Liaison HQ BAOR. In the majority of cases it will be the latter.
3. When it is found that a Polish Offr does not possess one or both of these documents he will be detained and reported immediately by phone to the Int Office and not released until further instrs.
4. In addition to liaison and visiting Offrs there are also Offrs of the Polish Armed Forces. These Offrs are at liberty to move freely about the Brit Zone subject only to such restrictions as are imposed on the mov of Brit Offrs, i.e. authority for the journey and means of identity (AF B2606 A).

## APPENDIX "E"

Herewith the details concerning the Sten Practice Course.

### 1. STEN Practice Course

It is to be clearly understood that this is a practice with NO repeat NO live ammunition.

The suggested method of running the Course is as follows:-

- (a) A section only to be allotted the course.
- (b) Three or more NCO's are required to accompany the men round the course. These NCO's must have previously reconnoitred the course to ascertain the position of the targets.
- (c) One man at a time to start off from the starting point with one NCO. The latter to take note of the action of the firer at each stage, as to whether the enemy was seen, if prompt action was taken, and if so, how far it might have been effective.
- (d) Suggested interval between each competitor- 2 minutes.
- (e) Additional marks awarded if completed in the standard time or five minutes and deductions for every minute over.

The above can be run on a competitive basis.

The Weapon Training Staff will alter the position of the targets on the 1st of each month, or more often as required. Persons other than the W.T. Staff will not move or alter any of the targets.

Coys are requested not to damage the Course in any way and to confine the activities of the competitors to the course as indicated by the white arrows.

## APPENDIX "F"

### Observation Course

The object of this course is to train a man to observe and to memorise what he has seen.

Each site is numbered and the following is the suggested method in which to run this competition.

(a) A number of articles are laid out alongside the peg which is numbered, and are already in position.

A list of these articles are as shown

1. 3 sandfilled 2"mortar bombs.
2. A shovel
3. Foxhole (already dug)
4. Bren gun, less magazine
5. Empty Grenade box
6. Bren magazine
7. Small pack
8. Dead body (German infantry uniform)
9. 5 round .303 (D.D Rounds)
10. Respirator (no haversack)
11. 2 corrugated iron sheets (in position)
12. 2 MG Holts
13. A bunker (already dug)
14. An Italian rifle
15. 4 empty sandbags (in posetion)
17. Bren gun spare parts waller
18. Tellermine crate (empty)
19. German Forage cap
20. 2 Angle iron pickets (in position)

Items Nos 1,5,7,8,12,14, and 19 can be drawn from W.T. Stores when required.

The above may be changed or varied according to the requirements of the Company.

(a) Each competitor is set off and is told the total number of sites, i. e. 20. It is not necessary for all competitors to set off at site No1. In order to save time and keep the Section interested, they can be divided to commence at a specified site. In order to ensure that all start at rhe same time, this can be done by signal-blast on a whistle, etc. No notes will be allowed.

(b) A time limit may be imposed.

(c) At the end, each competitor has to record what he has seen. In order to simplify this it is suggested that the number indicators are left in each place. The competitor will then write down or state to the supervising NCO what he has seen at each site.

Points will be awarded for each article mentioned and additional points if he is able to state the correct article or articles at each numbered indicator.

The above can be made as an individual, section or platoon competition.
