Instructions for Compilation and Despatch

1. A War Diary is SECRET.
2. The War Diary takes the place of the Historical Record when on active service. (KR (Can) Para 1530). Its objects are: to supply authentic material for the history of the unit, and of the force; to furnish a historical record of operations; and to provide data upon which to base improvements in training, equipment, organization and administration.
3. Unless otherwise ordered, the original and duplicate copies are sent on the first day of the succeeding month, through the usual channels, to the AG 2nd Echelon, wherever that office may be. The triplicate copy may be held by the unit for three months and then forwarded, also through the usual channels, to AG, 2nd Echelon. In Canada all copies as above are sent through the usual channels to NDHQ; in England to Canadian Military HQ.
 - (i) District Officers Commanding will arrange to forward War Diaries to National Defence Headquarters addressed Director Historical Section, GS (War Diaries) with covering roll, in duplicate, showing unit from which received and number of copies in each case; the duplicate roll will be returned as a receipt.
 - (ii) Formations and Units in the Ottawa Area Command will forward War Diaries direct to National Defence Headquarters (addressed Director Historical Section, GS (War Diaries)).
4. Post-war disposal will be as under:—
 - Original—retained at Ottawa for historical purposes.
 - Duplicate—to British Record Office for historical purposes.
 - TriPLICATE—to unit for custody with unit records.
5. The War Diary will be entered up daily on MF M11 and rendered monthly in triplicate (Mbn Instr for CM 1937. App "C"). Each entry will be initialled by the officer detailed to keep the War Diary, which will be signed at the end of each month by the commander. (FSR Vol II, Sec 35, para 3 iii).

THE EXTRACTION AND RETENTION OF APPENDICES, MAPS, ETC, FROM A WAR DIARY IS AN OFFENCE
UNDER THE OFFICIAL SECRETS ACT

6. The following should be recorded daily as events occur:—

- (i) Important orders, instructions, reports, messages or despatches received and issued, and decisions taken. *Original documents* should be attached as appendices to the original copy of the War Diary; *copies* should, whenever available, be attached as appendices to the duplicate and triplicate copies of the War Diary.
- (ii) Daily map location, employment, movements and dispositions of unit headquarters and of batteries, companies, etc. March tables should be attached as appendices.
- (iii) Important movements of officers and matters relating to the duties of each branch of the staff. A complete set of the *routine orders and instructions*, *Part I Orders*, issued by the unit during the month should be attached as an appendix to the original copy.
- (iv) Detailed account of operations—to include:— Exact hour, location and circumstances of important occurrences. Movements and names of neighbouring units. Commanders of batteries, companies, etc, names of Officers and number of OR (i) engaged and (ii) battle casualties. Dispositions, activities and identity of enemy forces. Prisoners and trophies captured. Ammunition expended. Factors affecting operations, topographical and climatic. *Maps and sketches* showing dispositions of batteries, companies, etc, at important phases. The record of *communications*, both written and verbal, received or despatched during active operations as an appendix. A complete set of the *operation orders and instructions* issued during the month. Notes on conferences and *reports* rendered to higher formations, or received from lower formations, as appendices to the original copy.
- (v) Nature and description of trenches, field works or accommodation occupied or constructed. Meteorological notes.

- (vi) Changes in establishment or strength. Names and ranks of officers and number of OR. Attachment of units and individuals. Reinforcements. *Weekly Field Returns of Officers and OR* should be attached as appendices to the original copy. *Copy of Part II Orders* should be attached to the triplicate copy only. Changes in organization, stores, transport, etc.

7. It is essential that all copies of both text and appendices are legible. Appendices will be numbered and referenced to the text in the last column of the form. Current issues of any regimental publication should be attached.

8. It will be found convenient at the end of each month, when the War Diary is being completed and the correspondence in unit files for the month is being reviewed and distributed (FSR Vol I, sec 171, para 3) if the material considered to be of historical value in the light of the above is attached as appendices to the original copy of the War Diary, the file title and reference number being entered in conformity with the filing system.

9. A good war diary makes possible the accurate and detailed reconstruction of circumstances, conditions and action.

NOTE: If monthly diary is more than one inch thick, use a second folder. If appendices are bulky, tie folder up with tape or string to make a firm package.

UNIT OFFICE FILING SYSTEM
AND RECORDS

"Every office will arrange for the filing and custody of its own correspondence." (FSR Vol I, Sec 171.3.)

1. *Titles and Numbering of Files*

A simple filing system adaptable for use in any military office at home or in the field is illustrated by the "List of File Titles" overleaf.

All documents handled by a unit fall into one or other of the nine categories enumerated, 1 to 9. The titles of the nine main divisions are based on British army operations, organization, administration and the regulations governing. Each title may be broken down into ten component parts or sub-titles, by adding a dash and subsidiary numbers 0 to 9. In turn each of these may be further broken down by adding a second dash and a third digit, and if necessary a third dash and a fourth digit. Thus 4-6-3 might be "Cooking Course at Kingston". According to circumstances, a fighting unit would expand the 1-3 prefix to accommodate all arms and services with which it may be concerned.

2. *Date reference*

The method outlined in FSR, Vol II, Appendix IV, will be used for all purposes, e.g., 2 Feb 40.

3. *Documents for Preservation*

The monthly review of correspondence (FSR Vol I, sec 171.3) is facilitated and future confusion avoided by jacketing the material in "Category ii" (i.e., "no longer required", etc) to conform with the system.

4. *Correspondence in the Field*

The functioning of the office of a formation or unit during active operations may be simplified by keeping a log or register of all orders and messages, written or verbal, received or sent during the action. This may conveniently be done by extending the use of the "Field Register of Communications Received or Despatched", (Army Form 2040, FSR Vol I, sec 171) to include verbal as well as written orders and messages in chronological order as received or sent.

Time of sending and of receipt are of importance second only to time of event, and should be entered both on the office copy of every field message or other document, and in the log or register. A carbon copy for contemporary reference of the commander or others concerned is desirable.

A brief precis of written orders, reports and messages, with the sender's number, is sufficient, for they will be kept on file. But particular care is necessary in making entries of times of moves and of verbal orders, reports or conversations, by telephone or otherwise, which in the stress of action, may not otherwise be recorded on paper. In battle, operations messages dealt with by one officer may number over twenty-five per hour for several hours on end.

The record should be kept convenient to the telephone. Entries may be made by a clerk, or by the officer on duty at the telephone.

Such a record is invaluable to the commander in making appreciations of the situation during the action, and in compiling his report on the action afterwards. It is contemporary evidence of the highest quality, and therefore is of the highest historical value, and should be attached as an appendix to the original copy of the War Diary, together with the original documents sent and received.



2. TYPHUS INOCULATION

1 Cases of typhus fever are occurring in the civil population of the entire area occupied by BAOR in Germany. These cases are increasing in number as a result of movement of refugees and low standards of living.

2 It is essential, therefore, that all troops be given the maximum protection, and re-inoculation of all ranks with anti-typhus vaccine will be undertaken as soon as possible and completed not later than 16 Mar 46.

3 All personnel, except those who have completed the initial course of protection, or have been re-inoculated with anti-typhus vaccine after 10 Nov 45, will be re-inoculated with 1.0 C.C. of anti-typhus vaccine.

3. ECONOMY

1 A label "Have you switched off that light" (BAOR Form 144) has been produced, and will be taken into use forthwith. Indents will be based on one form for each exit to all occupied rooms, etc., fitted with electric light, and will be fixed at approximately eye-height on the inside wall at the side of the door nearest the handle.

2 BAOR Form 144 is now stocked by all stationery depots.

2. CIVILIAN LABOUR

1 All units employing civilians obtained through a Pioneer and Civil Labour Unit, on clerical, domestic and other duties in close association with military personnel, will ensure that they are medically examined and inoculated with TAB and Typhus vaccines by German doctors, by arrangement with MED at their Formation HQ.

2 Employing units will issue a medical inspection card (RAOR Form 145) in respect of each such employee and record thereon details of examinations and/or inoculations which will be signed, at the time, by the doctor.

3 The medical inspection card on completion will be retained by the employee and produced on demand to employing unit, doctor, or others authorized to carry out checks.

4 Employing units will notify MED at their Formation HQ, with a copy to the local Pioneer and Civil Labour Unit, monthly of all civilians examined and/or inoculated.

5 Supplies of BACR Form 145 will be obtainable by formations and units on application to the appropriate Advance Stationery Depot. Pending receipt of these forms, entries of examinations and/or inoculations will be made on a temporary card and the entries transferred when the forms become available.

3. FROST PRECAUTIONS

1. The restrictions on the types of vehicles in which Ethylene Glycol may be used, imposed by para 3 of Cdn RO(RAOR) No. 1826, is withdrawn. Ethylene Glycol may be used in vehicles of all types. Indents will be submitted forthwith and issues will be made as soon as possible.

2. (a) The strictest economy in the use of Ethylene Glycol is still necessary as stocks are only just enough to permit the increased issue authorized in para 1.

(b) Indents on RCASC will show the number of gallons of Ethylene Glycol required (being one third of the total capacity of the cooling system of the vehicles' mechanical equipment and plant) and will be accompanied by a certificate signed personally by the CO as follows:

"Certified that..... vehicles on charge to this unit are in permanent use. In accordance with Cdn RO(RAOR) No. 1921,..... gallons of Ethylene Glycol are required for them."

3. FROST PRECAUTIONS (cont'd)

2. (c) Units may hold up to 10% reserve.
3. (a) Vehicles held in GHQ Vehicle Parks will not be treated with Ethylene Glycol. Any vehicles delivered to GHQ Vehicles Parks filled with Ethylene Glycol will NOT be drained.
(b) Vehicle Parks will, however, be responsible for treating vehicles with Ethylene Glycol before issue. For this purpose Vehicle Parks may hold 50% of the total Ethylene Glycol required for all vehicles in the Parks on 1 Jan 46. When stocks of Ethylene Glycol in GHQ vehicle Parks fall below a third of the quantity required as at 1 Jan, indents for replenishment will be submitted.
4. No further Ethylene Glycol will be issued to units after 15 Mar 46. Vehicle Parks will aim at exhausting their holdings by 31 Mar 46, and units will eat down the 10% reserve authorized in para 2(c) above by that date.

2. FIRE DEFENCE

1 The incidence of fire in Mil Ests and units within 30 Corps District is rapidly on the increase. The monthly winter average of 35 fires, was passed in Jan by the middle of the month.

2 Since the cessation of hostilities nearly all fires have been due to carelessness in one way and another, but the increase referred to in para 1 above is directly attributable to the faulty installation of combustion stoves.

3 The two main faults are:-

- (a) Stoves standing on timber flooring having only a piece of sheet metal to insulate the stove from the flooring.
- (b) Stoves pipes being inadequately insulated from roof and wall timbers.

4 These faults are in direct contravention of "Regulations for Army Fire Services in War 1943", paras 38 and 39 of which read as follows:-

"38 COMBUSTION STOVES - The instructions for open fires apply to combustion stoves. These stoves are responsible for many outbreaks of fire and will not be used unless they conform to the following specification:-

- (a) Stoves will be securely fixed to the hearth, which base be of concrete or brick. The hearth will be surrounded with a raised curb. The stove pipe will be fixed rigidly by clips at 4 ft centres fixed to studding and roof members at a distance of not less than 10 in from the face of the finished wall or ceiling. Where stove pipes cannot be held by clips, they will be riveted or welded up in one length from the junction with the elbow to the roof.
- (b) Where the stove pipe passes through the roof proper precautions will be taken to protect the roof members and roof lining.
- (c) Matchboarding behind stoves and boilers will be replaced by asbestos wood or asbestos insulating board. Asbestos cement sheeting will not be used and the insulating board will not be fixed over other wall linings.

Faulty combustion stoves will be reported to the RE works services.

39 OVERSTOKING - The overstoking of combustion stoves is forbidden. Vents will not be left open until the stove pipe becomes red-hot or when the room is vacated. If wood is being burned, the vents will be kept closed."

5 The attention of all concerned will be directed to these instructions.

2. MEALS - OLDENBURG

1 The number of personnel reporting to 1 Cdn Leave Centre Pool, OLDENBURG for free meal tickets has increased greatly in recent weeks. Investigations reveal that the majority of such personnel claim to be on duty (e.g. collecting sups or Pol from 131 DID) but are only able to produce work tickets as proof of such duty. Normally, such personnel should carry haversack lunches, because rations for odd meals are not underdrawn by units concerned.

2 Effective immediately, and in order to prevent the double issue of free rations (i.e. one issue to unit and one issue to hotel or club), all personnel being despatched by units to the OLDENBURG area on duty or otherwise will:-

- (a) ensure that personnel are provided with haversack lunches.
- or (b) acquaint such personnel with the fact that it will be necessary to pay for meals obtained from hotels or clubs in OLDENBURG.
- or (c) provide such personnel with a chit signed by the adjt of the unit concerned to the effect that the personnel concerned are on duty and that it has been impracticable to provide the personnel with haversack lunches. Chits will be presented to 1 Cdn Leave Centre Pool in order to obtain free meal tickets.

3 The provisions of para 2 will in no way affect personnel who are actually in transit in the OLDENBURG area and thus entitled to free rations.

2 Instances are continually being reported of lifeboats being used for miscellaneous duties entirely unconnected with emergencies. This result in lifeboats being away from their sta for long periods, which might have serious consequences.

3 It is requested therefore that you will promulgate to all concerned in your comd that:-

- (a) The GERMAN Lifeboat Institution ops under the order of NAVAL OIC CUXHAVEN, to whom all matters other than emergencies should be referred.
- (b) The lifeboat s/are intended for emergency use only, and may be called out at once on application to the nearest Coastal Rescue R/T Sta Naval Authority, or Duty Staff Offr, Naval OIC, CUXHAVEN (Tele CUXHAVEN Navy Ext 3232).
- (c) All lifeboats are fitted with R/T and can communicate with the Coastal R/T Rescue Sta, with each other, or with the GLI Service Director's HQs in CUXHAVEN. They op on 1650 Kc/s (International Distress Wave).
- (d) Lifeboats should NOT used for purposes other than distress (i.e. saving life or property, assisting in sal op, piloting, etc) except in cases of absolute necessity, when no other suitable craft is available.

2. SAFEGUARDING OF VEH'S

1. Vehs will NOT be left unattended unless the veh is either locked up in a secure place, placed in an authorized mil car pk, or the dvr is alone on an op journey and by reason of op necessity it is imperative from him to leave the veh unattended.

2. All vehs whenever left will be immobilized.

3. An authorized mil car pk means a place enclosed by wire or barricade, or other means whereby access is denied except through entrance or exit controlled by a mil gd. It does NOT mean the open street or rd outside an office where NO org control of vehs can be exercised.

4. In all other cases, vehs will be attended by having the dvr or his deputy remain with the veh.

5. Disciplinary action will be taken in regard to any breach of this order. In cases where there is a loss of a veh through noncompliance, offenders will be held to have a financial responsibility in respect of the loss unless they can prove that it was operationally necessary to leave the veh unattended.

6. This order to be explained to all dvrs and republished in Coy order.

3. DISCIPLINE

1. The maintenance of a high standard of discipline in the CAOF, particularly in respect to the offences of absence without leave and exceeding the authorized speed limit, demands that all commanding offrs be fully aware of the gravity of these offences, and that such offences receive punishments which will effectively deter the commission of a second offence or the commission of a first offence by a new offender.

2. The punishment which is awarded to a soldier is entirely a matter for the discretion of the commanding offr concerned. While each individual case must be considered by commanding offrs on its merits, and it is not possible to lay down a firm standard scale of punishment, the scale set out below is not considered excessive and will indicate to commanding offrs the grave view that is taken of the offences named.

2. AUTOMATIC FIREARMS - IMPORTATION INTO CANADA

1 The importation into Canada of automatic firearms, except for the use of a public authority, is prohibited by law and every person other than a public authority who imports into Canada any such automatic firearm or, without having a permit therefor, has in his possession or sells or offers for sale or purchases any such automatic firearm, shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine of \$5000 and to imprisonment for 5 years. A permit can only be obtained on application stating the use to which such firearm will be put and the reason why a permit is required.

2 "Automatic firearm" means and includes any machine gun, sub-machine gun, automatic rifle, machine carbine or any magazine or belt fed weapon, with or without biped mount, which will fire bullets in rapid succession without manual reloading during one pressure of the trigger, but does not mean and include automatic pistol. Under the Criminal Code of Canada, automatic pistols and revolvers must be registered with the Royal Canadian Mounted Police and any person having in his possession any automatic pistol or revolver which is not registered, is guilty of an offence and liable to a fine of \$50 and to imprisonment for 30 days.

3. CONFIDENTIAL CORRESPONDENCE - MOs

1 To assist in the control of VD, soldiers infected are infm that the questionnaires they are required to complete will be treated as confidential documents. This policy assists in obtaining correct infm.

2 In order to gain the maximum value from these reports, it is essential that all correspondence addressed to Unit MOs and franked "CONFIDENTIAL" will be treated as such, and fwd direct to Unit MOs without prior opening in Unit Orderly Rooms.

3 COs will be responsible that this procedure is followed.

	Tk Tptrs (incl Tk Rec Tptrs) with a load capacity of 20 tons or over.....	20 mph

2 Severe disciplinary action will be taken against the driver of any veh exceeding the above speed limits.

3 The above speed limits are applicable to all WD/CM vehicles, including requisitioned and captured vehicles, proceeding individually, but do not apply to vehicles travelling in convoy for which speeds have been laid down in operational or other instructions. Compliance with the above maximum speed limits will not absolve any driver from his obligation to drive with due care and regard for safety, having regard to the prevailing conditions.

4 Occasions of operational necessity may justify speeds in excess of the above scale. Such occasions should whenever possible be covered by the written authority of a responsible officer.

5 This Order in no way restricts the authority of local comds to impose speed limits within built-up areas or upon other roads within the areas under their control which they consider require special restriction. Only under exceptional circumstances should such restriction impose a limit of less than 30 mph which will be the general limitation in all towns, villages and built-up areas. Local comds will ensure that notices of such speed limits are prominently displayed.

6 Officers, warrant officers, and NCOs travelling in vehicles as passengers will ensure that drivers comply with the provisions of this Order.

7 Where the provisions of this Order conflict with MT Drivers' Regulations and Overseas RO 5513 as amended, the provisions of this Order will prevail.

c) Security of Material.

All army material is kept within Bn lines and under constant watch.

d) Security of Access.

The situation is most assuring. Not a single case of anyone coming in camp without permission, has been reported.

e) Security of Personnel.

Recent news on the Repatriation of Occupational Forces have certainly help in strengthening the moral of our troops. The latter are performing their duties with real enthusiasm.

f) Miscellaneous.

It is believed that german girls are being threatened by the male sex because of their friendship with our troops.

On the other hand, no case of violence yet, has been reported.
