THE CITY OF HAMILTON.

The site of the city of Hamilton was originally covered with a dense growth of tall, coarse serrated Indian grass. The land between the mountain and the bay consisted chiefly of deep ravines and patches of swamp, affording a favorite haunt for rattle-snakes, frogs and quail. The monotony of the immense patches of Indian grass was relieved here and there by a tall water elm and close, low and almost impenetrable shrubbery, which formed a safe retreat for packs of wolves. On the plot now occupied as the Market Square there was a particularly dense growth of this thicket, which was the rendezvous of wolves innumerable.

When this part of Canada was first settled a deer trail extended over the brow of the mountain, and passed where the reservoir is now situated to the bay. An Indian trail extended from the villages on the Grand River through the Dundas valley down to the bay, near the foot of Emerald street, near which the Indians had a burial mound. This hill was fifteen feet high and fifty in diameter, and though almost levelled now by nearly a century of cultivation, its site can still be traced. A large number of mortuary remains, flint spear and arrow-heads, stone hatchets, wampum, pottery, etc., seems to indicate that this was the scene of a sanguinary conflict many years ago. This view is strengthened by a tradition among the Indians that a small tribe called the Attawandarons was here completely destroyed.

In the year 1778 Robert Land settled on three hundred acres, occupying the greater part of the east end of the city between the mountain and the bay. Here he sowed the first acre of wheat, breaking up the land with a hoe and harrowing it with brush loaded with stones. For a long time after the arrival of Land very few settlers came here. Immigrants preferred the high grounds of Auster and Barton. Stoney Creek and Ancaster were places of considerable importance before Hamilton was more than a mere hamlet, yet it appeared to have been a sort of rendezvous for the surrounding neighborhood. At a very early period a man named Smith built a tavern on the site of Charlton's vinegar works, corner of King and Wellington streets, and a lodge of Freemasons met here as early as 1795. In 1796 and following years a considerable number of settlers arrived. In 1812 the following occupied the site of the city, Robert Abel and Ephraim Land, John Aikman, Col. Richard Beasley, Peter Ferguson, James Mills, Peter Hess, Nathaniel Hughson, David Kirkendall and Captain James Durand. A man named Barnum kept a tavern on the north-west corner of King and James streets, and owned the land from King to Merriek. In 1813 a portion of the site of Hamilton was laid out in town lots by Geo. Hamilton, at that time and for many years after member of Parliament for Gore District. In 1814 a frame building on the corner of King and John was occupied as a store by William Sheldon; Black, Carpenter, Shute and Knight, were the first cabinet-makers; John Aikman was the first wagon-maker, and Edward Jackson the first tinsmith. McQueen & Co owned the first foundry and stone building, which occupied the site of the present Royal Hotel. Thos. Reynolds owned the first blacksmith's shop, which was situated on the corner of King and Ferguson avenue. John Law kept the first district school. Barnum was succeeded by Andrew or "Yankee" Miller, who kept the tavern till it was destroyed by fire. In 1823 twenty-six charters were granted for the construction of the Burlington Bay and Desjardin's Canals. These works gave a great impetus to the prosperity of the village. In 1833 the town of Hamilton was incorporated; three years later the population was 2,846, and the assessed value £44,020. In

1838 the population had increased to 3,338, and the assessed value was £52,130. The City of Hamilton was incorporated in 1846, the population then being 6,832, and the assessed value £113,720. In the following year the first Council was elected and was composed of Messrs. Colin C. Ferrie, Mayor; Alexander Carpenter, Chas. O. Counsell, N. Ford, L. B. Freeman, D. C. Gunn, David Kelly, Andrew Miller, Samuel Mills, H. R. O'Reilly and H. B. Wilson. In 1846 Captain Geo. A. Armstrong was appointed Police Magistrate. On the 17th of March 1863 the present Police Magistrate, Mr. Jas. Cahill, was appointed. In 1854 Mr. Thomas Beasley was appointed City Clerk, and still retains the office.

Hamilton has several fine buildings, public and private, and many elegant residences, surrounded by beautiful grounds in the outskirts of the city, which have more than a local celebrity. The churches, banks and many of the stores, chiefly built of stone and brick, are handsome structures. The new Court House, erected in 1878, is one of the finest edifices of the kind in the Dominion. It fronts on Prince's Square, and is 168 feet in length; the breadth of the main building is 74 feet and that of each of the wings 64 feet.

The County Jail, on Barton street, was completed in 1875, at a cost of about \$40,000, and John Henery, formerly Chief of Police, was appointed Governor.

The Asylum for the insane, Hamilton, is the finest structure of its kind in the Dominion. It is beautifully situated on the top of the mountain, in Barton township, overlooks the city, and has by far the most charming views of any public edifice in Canada. It first received patients on St. Patrick's Day, 1876. One hundred acres are attached and fenced with picket. An orchard and avenue are planted. A coal shed and mortuary are built, fine airy courts, a carpenter shop, out buildings, and excellent stables, and a house for the officials. J. M. Wallace, M. D., Medical Superintendent, Theo. S. Covernton, M. D., Assistant Superintendent, Bidwell Way, Bursar.

The magnificent building of the Hamilton Provident and Loan Society, now in course of erection, will form one of the most attractive ornaments of the city. It is situated on the corner of King and Hughson streets. David B. Dick, architect; Robert Chisholm, contractor.

A new Post Office and Custom House are soon to be erected.

The situation of Hamilton, as a trade centre is equal to that of any other city in the Dominion, being connected with all the American and Canadian lines of Railway by the Great Western and Hamilton and North Western. The city is the seat of extensive manufactures. There are several iron foundries, some of them among the largest in the Dominion, a rolling mill, three sewing machine factories, two large glassworks, and many other branches of productive industry, giving constant employment to large numbers of operatives. (See *Subscribers' Classified Business Directory*.)

The present population of the city, January 1880, may be estimated at about 35,000; real estate, \$12,735,670; assessable income, \$535,490; personal property, \$2,110,260.

The city sends two members to the Federal Parliament and one to the Provincial; the former are Messrs. F. E. Kilvert and Thomas Robertson. Mr. J. M. Gibson is the Local representative.

The city possesses an excellent system of drainage and magnificent water-works. The supply to the reservoir, the capacity of which is 9,000,000 imperial gallons, is brought from Lake Ontario, a distance of 3½ miles.

Hamilton is distant from Suspension Bridge, 43 miles; St. Catharines, 31; Toronto, 39; Barrie, 95; Collingwood, 108; Port Dover, 42; Montreal, 372; Quebec, 552; Detroit, 186; New York, 611; and from Buffalo 70.

HISTORY OF THE CHURCHES.

CHURCHES OF ENGLAND.

Diocese of Niagara—Rt Rev. T. B Fuller, D. D, Lord Bishop.

Christ Church Cathedral—The congregation of this church was organized about 1835, and a church was erected in 1837 on the site of the present edifice. The Rev. J. G. Geddes, Dean of Niagara, was in charge of this parish for 44 years, leaving it at the close of the year 1879. The Cathedral is one of the chief ornaments of the city. We regret that we have been unable to obtain the required information concerning this church before going to press. A full description will be given in our next issue.

Church of Ascension—This parish was erected in 1839. The site on which the church stands was the gift of the late Richard Juson; an addition was made to the site by the purchase of an adjoining lot, on which a school house has been erected. The church is built of native stone. Number of sittings 700. The tower contains a peal of five bells. Cost of the church about \$18,000. The late Rev. John Hebden, M.A., was the first rector, and was succeeded by the present incumbent, Rev. James Carmichael.

St. Thomas, corner Main and West avenue. The church is built in the Norman or early English style, and has a very neat and tasteful appearance. It is built of stone. Number of sittings about 400. The Rev. W. B. Curran, incumbent.

St. Marks', Bay street—Was opened for divine service in the spring of 1878. Rev. R. G. Sutherland, rector.

All Saints, corner King and Queen. This beautiful church was completed in 1873, at a cost of about \$15,000—the munificent gift of the late Hon. Samuel Mills. It is built of mountain stone, and has a seating capacity of 450. The first pastor, Rev. R. G. Sutherland, (now of St Marks), was

succeeded by Rev. C. E. Thompson, the present incumbent.

REFORMED EPISCOPAL.

St. James' Reformed Episcopal Church, corner Hunter and Park sts. This, the youngest though not by any means the least of Protestant church organizations, was planted in this city in June 1876, since which time it has grown rapidly both in numbers and influence. The building occupied by this congregation is plain but substantial and capable of seating about 500 persons. The rector is the Rev. J. B. Fitzpatrick, formerly of Jacksonville, Fla., who as a pastor and preacher holds a leading position.

PRESBYTERIAN CHURCHES.

Knox Church, corner James and Cannon streets. This is the oldest Presbyterian congregation in the city, having been organized in 1833. The Rev. Alex. Gale was the first minister. The present edifice was erected in 1845. Mr. Gale was succeeded by the Rev. Ralph Robb. This gentleman died in 1850, when the Rev. George Paxton Young, now Professor of Metaphysics and Ethics, Toronto University, was inducted. In 1854 Rev. Robert Irvine, D. D., accepted the charge. In 1858 the church was enlarged by the addition of a transverse wing; and at the same time a commodious stone manse was erected. The value of the whole church property is estimated at about \$30,000. Its seating capacity is about 1,200. Dr. Irvine was succeeded in 1864 by the Rev. A. B. Simpson, who was followed by Rev. W. H. Rennelson, who, on his death, was succeeded by the Rev. John James, D.D., the present pastor.

St. Paul's, (formerly St. Andrew's), James street south. The congregation was formed in 1833. For some time service was conducted in the old Court House, Princes' Square, and afterwards in the wooden structure on

the corner of Jackson and Charles streets, now the German Roman Catholic church. The Rev. Mr. Gale, the first pastor, was succeeded in 1846 by the Rev. Alex. Mackid, who was followed by the Rev. Mr. Macnee in 1850. In 1853 the Rev. Robt. Burnett was inducted, and occupied the pulpit until the appointment of the present incumbent, the Rev. R. J. Laidlaw. The foundation stone was laid in 1855, and the church was opened for divine service two years after. It is built of mountain stone, and the principal doorway, James street, is remarkable for the great beauty of its finish and design. It is capable of seating 1,000 persons, and is 110 x 64 feet in dimensions. The total cost was about \$40,000.

Central, corner Macnab and Jackson. This church was erected in 1858. It is an elegant structure of white pressed brick, 176 x 72 feet, capable of seating 1,500 persons, and cost about \$35,000. The congregation was organized about 37 years ago. The successive pastors were Rev. Messrs Dalrymple, Hogg, Ormiston and McColl. In 1877 the Rev. Samuel Lyle, the present pastor, accepted the charge.

Macnab Street Church. This congregation was organized in 1854, and then consisted of about 40 persons. Their first place of worship was in Mechanics' Hall. In 1855 a church was erected and the Rev. David Inglis was appointed pastor. The present building was opened for service in June, 1857. It is built in the gothic style, of stone procured from the mountain adjoining the city, and is capable of seating 1,300 persons. Rev. D. H. Fletcher is the present pastor.

St John's, cor King and Emerald. Rev Thos Goldsmith, pastor.

METHODIST CHURCHES.

The Methodists have the honor of being the first religious community to organize a congregation in Hamilton. The King street church, the first in the city, was erected in 1824. In 1833 the population of the village being about 1,000. The Rev. Messrs. James Evans and Edwin Ryerson officiated. Mr. David Springer was class-leader.

The members numbered 140, and the first Sabbath school was organized in this church.

In 1840 John street church was erected on the site of the building formerly used by the Presbyterians, and was rebuilt on a much larger scale in 1878. Rev L Gaetz, present pastor.

The Macnab street church was opened December 1st, 1851. The Revs. John Carrol and John Breden were the first pastors.

The Centenary church, one of the finest in the city, was founded in 1863. It is built of red pressed brick, in the Romanesque style of architecture, and cost about \$30,000. The successive pastors were Revs. Messrs. John Potts, Wm. J. Hunter, Hugh Johnston, Wm. Williams. The Rev. W. W. Ross is the present pastor.

German Methodist church, Rebecca street, was erected in 1862. The Rev. Mr. Kappelé is the present pastor.

Primitive Methodist church, corner Hughson and Gore. Rev. Jas. Goodman is the present pastor.

Methodist Episcopal church, corner John and Gore. Rev. J. S Williamson, pastor.

British Methodist Episcopal church, (colored), John street north. Rev. J. O'Banyoun, pastor.

The Hannah street church was opened in 1875. Ministers, Revs. J. W. Cooley, J. M. Hodgson and the present incumbent, F. H. Sanderson.

Zion Tabernacle, corner Napier and Pearl. Rev. J. Scott, pastor.

BAPTIST CHURCHES.

Baptist church, organized 23rd Dec., 1843. On the 7th January, 1844, recognition services were held at Thornton's school house, when twelve persons were recognized as the Baptist church of Park street, Hamilton. The Rev. Alfred Booker was the first pastor. This gentleman was one of the victims of the Desjardin's bridge

Railway accident on March 12th, 1857. His successors were Revs. Messrs. Burke, Bates, Crawford, Brown, Wilson and Richardson. Rev. William Stewart is the present pastor.

Baptist church, (colored), Macnab street north. Rev. Robert Jones, pastor.

CONGREGATIONAL CHURCH.

Congregational church, cor. Hughson and Cannon. The first church belonging to this congregation was built about 42 years ago. The pastors were Revs. Messrs. Dyer, Wastell, Osborne, Robinson and Ebbs. In 1858 Rev. Thos. Pullar took charge, and on the 4th October the foundation stone of the present edifice was laid. It is a simple and elegant building, and is capable of seating about 500 persons. On the death of the last named pastor the Rev. Henry Saunders was appointed. Mr. Saunders died in 1878, and was succeeded by the Rev. Joseph Griffith, the present pastor.

ROMAN CATHOLIC CHURCHES.

In the year 1838 the first Roman Catholic church in Hamilton was

erected by the late Vicar General McDowell, who was the first resident Priest in the city. Previous to this, services were held in private houses. This was a frame building on the site of St. Mary's. In 1847 the Rev. E. Gordon, who succeeded Vicar General McDowell, greatly enlarged the church. In 1856 Hamilton was created an Episcopal See under the late Right Rev. Bishop Farrell. In 1859 the church was destroyed by fire, unhappily, a few days after the insurance had expired. The present beautiful structure was erected soon after. It is built in the Gothic style, of red brick with white brick arches and cut stone facings. The interior decorations of the church are remarkable for their beauty. On the death of Bishop Farrell, in 1873, the Rt. Rev. P. F. Crinnon, D. D., the present Bishop, was appointed.

St. Patrick's church, King street, was completed in 1877. It is built of Ohio stone, 150 feet in length and 60 in breadth. It cost about \$50,000. It is one of the most beautiful churches in the city and justly admired by all who see it. The ceiling is magnificently frescoed. Two costly stained glass windows have been recently put in the sanctuary.

There is also a German Roman Catholic church, a frame structure, corner Charles and Jackson streets.
