COURT OF CHANCERY.—This Court has the like jurisdiction as the Court of Chancery in England, in cases of fraud, accident, trusts, executors, administrators, co-partnerships, accounts, mortgages, awards, dower, infants, idiots, lunatics and their estates, waste, specific performance, discovery and to prevent multiplicity of suits, staying proceedings at law prosecuted against equity and good conscience, and may decree the issue, repeal or avoidance of letters patent, and generally the like powers which the Court of Chancery in England possesses to administer justice in all cases in which there is no adequate remedy at law. *Chancellor*.—Hon. P. M. VanKoughnet. *Vice-Chancellors*.—Hon. Jas. Christie Palmer Esten and John Godfrey Spragge. *Master*.—Andrew Norton Buell.

COURT OF COMMON PLEAS.—This Court has the same powers and jurisdiction as a Court of Record, as the Court of Queen's Bench. *Chief Justice*—Hon. W. H. Draper, C. B. *Puisne Judges*—Hons. William Buell Richards and John Hawkins Hagarty.

HEIR AND DEVISEE COURT.—Commissioners, the Judges of the Superior Courts, and such other persons as may be appointed by commission under the Great Seal. Their duties are to determine claims to lands in Upper Canada, for which no patent has issued from the Crown in favor of the proper claimants, whether as heirs, devisees or assignees. Sittings at Toronto, first Monday in January and July in each year. *Clerk of Commissions*—W. B. Heward.

COUNTY COURTS.—Presided over by a resident Judge in each county. Their jurisdiction extends to all personal actions where the debt or damages claimed do not exceed £50; and to all suits relating to debt, covenant or contract, where the amount is ascertained by the acts of the parties or signature of the defendant, to £100. An appeal lies to either of the Superior Courts of Law. These Courts also possess equity powers, to the amount of £50, subject to an appeal to the Court of Chancery.

SURROGATE COURTS.—The jurisdiction of these Courts relate to all testamentary matters and causes, and to the granting or revoking of probate of wills, and letters of administration of the effects of deceased persons having estate or effects in Upper Canada. The County Judges are also Judges of the Surrogate Courts.

COURTS OF QUARTER SESSIONS.—Chairman, the County Judge in each county, who, with one or more Justices of the Peace, holds a Court of Quarter Sessions in his county four times a year for trials by jury in cases of larceny, misdemeanor and other offences.

RECORDERS' COURT.—In the Cities of Toronto, Hamilton, London, Kingston and Ottawa, the Recorders' Court takes the place of the County Sessions, the Justices for Counties having no jurisdiction in the Cities—the care of which is confided to the Recorder, Mayor, Aldermen and Police Magistrate of each. Sessions held 2nd Monday in January, 1st Monday in April and July, and 3rd Monday in November. *Recorders*—George Duggan, Toronto; Archd. J. McDonnell, Kingston; John E. Start, Hamilton; William Horton, London; J. B. Lewis, Ottawa.

INSOLVENT DEBTORS' COURT.—The County Judge in each county presides.

DIVISION COURTS.—For the summary disposal of cases by a Judge; but a jury of five persons may be demanded in certain cases. Their jurisdiction extends to actions of debt or contract amounting to £25; injuries or torts to personal chattels amounting to £10. Courts are held once in two months in each division, or oftener, at the discretion of the Judge.

There is one Grammar School in each County Town, which receives at least \$400 per annum from the government, and where the funds will admit of it, others may be established in different parts of the County. Pupils attending these Schools are prepared for matriculation in the Universities. There were 88 Grammar Schools, with 4,546 pupils, in Upper Canada, in 1860.

COMMON SCHOOLS.—Each Township is divided into School Sections of a suitable extent for one School; and in each of these Sections three Trustees are elected to manage its School affairs. In cities, towns and villages, the schools are managed by a Board of School Trustees, elected for the Municipality. There were 3,969 Common Schools, with 315,812 pupils, in Upper Canada, in 1860.

THE TOTAL NUMBER OF EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS of all kinds reported by the Educational Department as in operation in Upper Canada during 1860, was 4,379, attended by 328,839, pupils, and expending \$1,615,670 in their support.

THE BELLEVILLE SEMINARY.—This Institution is the property of the Methodist Episcopal Church, but free to all denominations. Ample accommodation is afforded for two hundred students. Both sexes are included in the provision: ladies being instructed in the ornamental as well as solid branches, and gentlemen being afforded a commercial mathematical and classical education. The Institution was incorporated in 1857. Rev. A. Carman, M. A., Principal and Professor of Mathematics; Rev. H. P. Shepard, B. A., Professor of the Latin and Greek Languages; H. S. Tarbell, B. A., Professor of Natural Science, and Rector of English Department. Miss Eliza A. Deavers, Preceptress and Teacher of Drawing, Embroidery and the French Language; Miss M. N. Treft, Teacher of Music, both Melodeon and Piano Forte. The first Session, which consists of twenty-nine weeks, or two terms, commences on the first Thursday in September, and ends about the middle of April following: the second session commences on the first Thursday in May, and continues thirteen weeks. There will be a vacation of a fortnight at Christmas.

EDUCATIONAL.

CENTRAL SCHOOL.—ARCHIBALD MACALLUM, Esq., PRINCIPAL.

This School was established in 1853, has 20 teachers, and an average attendance of about 1000 pupils. Sessions commence first Mondays in January and August. The course of instruction includes Reading, Writing, Arithmetic, Geography, Grammar, History, (Canadian, English and General,) Linear Drawing, Book-keeping, Human Physiology, Astronomy, Elements of Natural Philosophy and Chemistry, Algebra, Euclid, Mensuration and Trigonometry, Natural History, Botany and Geology, and the Latin, Greek and French Languages. The charge is a monthly fee of 25 cents, for which, besides tuition, all books, stationery &c., are provided. In the Grammar School department the fees are three dollars per term, and the pupils supply themselves with classical books. Any person desiring it, can remain at the school till prepared for entering the University.

In connection with the Central are six Primary or Ward Schools, all under the immediate charge and direction of the Principal, assisted by 32 Teachers.

There is a Library in connection with the School, containing 1000 vols., to which the pupils have free access.

All the Public Schools are under the management of a Board of School Trustees, consisting of two members for each Ward. The following gentlemen constitute the Board at present: Dr. W. L. Billings, Joseph Lister, Esq., St. Andrew's Ward; James Cummings and Thos. Collingwood, Esqs., St. Patrick's Ward; James Osborne and Robert Roy, Esqs., St. George's Ward; Thomas Tindill and George Coombs, Esqs., St. Lawrence Ward; Thomas White and William H. Melville, Esqs., St. Mary's Ward. Dr. Billings, Chairman; Thos. Beasley, Esq., Secretary; Rev. William Ormiston, D.D., Local Superintendent; Archibald Macallum, Esq., Principal.

Besides the above there are two or more private or select Catholic Schools in the city. The number attending we were unable to learn. For the above we are indebted to the Rev. Mr. Gordon, Vicar-General of Hamilton.
