HAMILTON.

Hamilton, one of the chief cities of Western Canada, is situated on the South-western extremity of Burlington Bay. It was laid out in the year 1813, and occupies the gradually rising grounds between Burlington Bay and the Mountain, a distance of about two miles. This place is admirably adapted for the site of a city, affording every facility for perfect sewerage, and rendering more successful its sanitary regulations. The city is regularly laid out, most of the streets crossing each other at right angles. King street, running through the city from East to West, is the principal; on its North side are numerous and extensive retail shops, while its South side is occupied with some large wholesale houses; its buildings are of brick and stone, many of which are of the most costly styles of architecture. Besides these, it has its share of elegant private residences, for which the city is noted. James street crosses King street at right angles, and reaches from the Bay on the North to the Mountain on the South, in the vicinity of which are situated the palatial residences with richly ornamented grounds of its wealthy citizens. James is the chief retail street in the city, and is adorned with the finest specimens of architecture. East of and parallel to James street is John street, the principal thoroughfare of the surrounding country. It contains numerous fine private residences and elegant churches. McNab street is West of James street. Some large wholesale establishments are situated on this street. York street runs in a westerly direction from James street to "Dundurn," the residence of the late Sir Allan McNab. At its Western extremity are the beautiful grounds of the Burlington Cemetery. It is the inlet to the city for the Northern and Western portions of the surrounding country, and is studded with many fine private residences, evincing a high degree of refinement and wealth. Main street, broad and central, runs through the city from East to West. Of the remaining streets, Hughson and Catherine are the most important. The chief business portion of the city is situated about a mile back from the Bay, and approaches the base of the Mountain, from the summit of which can be obtained a magnificent view of the Bay, the lake at a distance, the city below, as also the rich and fertile country that forms the back ground of this beautiful picture, perhaps not surpassed in Canada. However pleasing a birds-eye view of the city and its surroundings may be, we are not at all disappointed upon a more minute examination. In beauty of architecture its buildings, both public and private, indicate an advancement not surpassed by cities older and more favored. From the time that the first store-house was erected on the Burlington Beach to the present moment, Hamilton has progressed favorably. The completion of the Burlington Bay Canal in 1834, was the first public improvement that advanced the interests of the city. It removed the obstruction caused by the sand bar separating the Lake from the Bay, and secured uninterrupted access to the latter. The position of Hamilton was early recognized as being highly favorable to securing for it the monopoly of the wholesale trade of the Western

peninsula. The attainment of that object ceased to be a matter of speculation or uncertainty when the Great Western Railway was constructed from the Niagara River *via* Hamilton to the Detroit River, a distance of over two hundred miles, intersecting and developing the most productive portions of the Province, and gaining for us the traffic of the Upper Lakes and "the West." In 1845 the city of Hamilton contained only a little over 6,000 inhabitants; in 1850 it had increased to 10,000, since which period (except temporarily) it has gone on steadily improving in size and prosperity, much of which it owes to the Great Western Railway, during the first five years of whose existence the city doubled its population, and in a corresponding degree increased its manufactures, its commerce, and its wealth. It is generally admitted that the Railway has done more for Hamilton than all other enterprises combined. This, along with its advantageous position at the head of navigation of Lake Ontario, with its central situation, makes it the emporium of an extensive grain and produce trade, and gives it unsurpassed and peculiar advantages as a manufacturing point, as well as for the carrying on of a profitable wholesale trade, in which department the city offers more inducements to retail buyers, than any other city in Canada with the exception of Montreal. The wholesale merchants are direct importers, and consequently are enabled to give their customers the benefit.

HAMILTON AGRICULTURAL WORKS—Situatd at the foot of Wellington Street, North side G.W.R.—was established in 1846—manufactures mowers, reapers, threshing machines, &c., &c.—use an engine of 30 horse-power—keep from 30 to 40 hands employed, and turn out about \$50,000 worth of work annually. P. Sawyer, proprietor.

GORE MARBLE WORKS—Situatd on the corner of Merrick and Bay Streets, established in 1854 by James Pollock; now carried on by Day, McComb, & Co.

PROVINCIAL MARBLE WORKS—Situatd on the junction of York and Merrick Streets, established in 1851, by H. H. & M. Hurd, and now carried on by Hurd & Roberts.

THE McNAB STREET FOUNDRY—Carried on by James Stewart & Co., was established in 1845. They employ forty men, and an engine of ten horse-power.

YORK STREET MACHINE SHOP AND STEAM ENGINE WORKS—John Doty, proprietor—manufacturer of oil mining tools, pumps, artisan tubing, steam engines, mill gearing, &c., situated on York Street, between Bay and Caroline. Employs 30 men.

D. MOORE & Co.'s IRON FOUNDRY—Situatd on Catherine Street. They employ a number of hands, and manufacture stoves, tin-ware, and machinery castings to the value of \$125,000 per annum.

EMPIRE FOUNDRY—Situatd on Bay Street, owned by Copp & Bro. Was established in 1857. About two years ago they erected large and substantial stone buildings for the foundry and machine shop. They give employment to forty hands.

HAMILTON IRON WORKS—John Thomas & Co., manufacturers of all kinds of portable and stationary engines. Situatd on Rebecca Street, between John and Catherine, established in 1851, employ 70 hands, and turn out work annually to the value of \$80,000.

MARY STREET FOUNDRY—Established in 1845. Employs 20 hands, manufactures parlor grates, ploughs, &c., &c. Turnbull & Co., proprietors.

CITY BRASS FOUNDRY—Situatd on King Street West, established in 1852. H. & R. Young, proprietors.

ENGINE BUILDERS AND BOILER MAKERS—F. G. Beckett & Co. have one of the most extensive establishments in Canada. It is situatd on Simcoe Street between James and McNab streets, near the Bay. John Thomas & Co., who employ a number of hands, and George Northey, corner of Wellington and King William Streets, are in the same line.

E. & C. GURNEY'S IRON FOUNDRY was erected in 1843. They employ 100 hands, and an engine of 20 horse-power is used for propelling the machinery. They manufacture stoves, hollow-ware, tin-ware, and machine work of every description.

BELLOWS—Dallyn & Sons are the only makers in the city. Their shop is on James Street.

BROOM MAKING.—There are three or four firms, each of which does an extensive business, employing several hands.

BRUSH MANUFACTURING.—In this branch of industry there are several establishments.

CARRIAGE AND COACH BUILDERS.—The Burlington Carriage Factory, situated on King Street West near Caroline, is one of the most extensive.

CITY COACH FACTORY.—J. P. Pronguey, proprietor. Employs 25 hands, and turns out \$25,000 worth of work per annum.

HAMILTON COACH FACTORY.—Owned by H. G. Cooper & Co. Employ 50 hands, and turn out about \$25,000 worth of Coaches, Carriages, &c., per annum.

COFFEE AND SPICE MILLS.—Carried on by Samuel Cann. Employs 8 hands and uses steam power to the extent of six horses.

CONFECTIONERY AND BISCUIT MANUFACTURING.—The principal establishments in this branch of business are those of Z. Pattison, situated on Cannon Street, between Bay and Park, who employs about 20 hands; and that of J. C. Chilman, King Street West, who employs 16 hands—also W. T. Ecclestone, on King Street, near James, who employs a number of men in the manufacture of biscuits, confectionery, &c.

COOPERAGES.—The most extensive of which is that owned by Wm. Woolley, who employs four hands, and an engine of five horse-power in the manufacture of cooper work, wooden bowls, tanks, &c.

FURNITURE.—This branch of industry is well represented, there being several extensive establishments in the city, among which might be mentioned that of James Read, situated on the corner of King and Bond streets; established in 1841. Twenty men are constantly employed, and \$20,000 worth of cabinet work turned out per annum.

HOSE (PIRE).—E. Kraft and Wm. Inkson are the manufacturers in this line of business. They employ each about 10 hands. They are also manufacturing saddles, harness, trunks, valises, &c.

HAMILTON GLASS MANUFACTORY.—Situated on Hughson-st.; carried on by Rutlerford & Co.

SEWING MACHINES.—R. M. Wadzer & Co., James, corner of Vine; established in 1861, since which time they have manufactured between nine and ten thousand machines, and are now manufacturing from 70 to 75 per week. They use an engine of ten-horse power, and employ 75 hands. \$160,000 worth of machines annually.

CANADIAN FELT HAT WORKS.—Situated on Wellington-st., near the G.W.R., established 1862; have an engine of 26 horse power. It is one of the most important factories of the kind in Canada, employing about 150 hands, and manufacturing from 45 to 60 dozen hats per day, for which home market is readily found.

MELODEON MANUFACTORY.—Situated on King-st., West, in which a number

of hands are employed, and the instruments turned out are considered to be of a superior quality and finish. Thomas W. White, proprietor.

PIANO FORTES.—Western Piano Forte Factory was established by Chas. L. Thomas, in the year 1856, who employs a number of men.

POWDER.—The Hamilton Powder Co. have an office on King-street. The works are situated in the Township of Nelson, Co. of Halton.

ROPE AND CORDAGE.—Great Western Rope Works, situated on the corner of Mary and Oak-streets, were established in 1854, and are now carried on by Alex. Main & Co., who employ a number of hands, and turn out work to the value of about \$20,000 per annum.

SCALE WORKS.—Provincial Scale Works, established in 1856, are situated on James-street, opposite the Bank of Upper Canada, carried on by Gurney, Ware & Co. They use twenty-five horse steam power, and give employment to about 20 men.

SOAP AND CANDLES.—There are three firms doing each a large business in this line, viz.: one situated on Bay-street, owned by John Judd; another on the corner of Bowery and Main-streets, carried on by James Walker, and the other in East Avenue, near King, owned by David Morton.

VINEGAR WORKS.—The Hamilton Vinegar Works, established in 1845, situated on King-st.

WHIP FACTORY.—Situated on Rebecca-street, between John and Catherine, employs 15 hands. Turns out work annually to the value of \$12,000.

TOBACCO AND CIGAR FACTORIES.—There are a number of firms, one of the principal of which is carried on by Charles A. Birge.

SPRING BREWERY.—P. Grant & Co., proprietors. The amount paid by this firm to the Government since July, 1862, when the excise duty was raised, has been about one-ninth part of the whole excise duty collected in Upper Canada on malt liquors.

ROLLING MILLS.—The Rolling Mills erected by the Great Western Railway Company give constant employment to over three hundred men. The building is 170 feet in length, 100 feet in width, 35 feet in height to the eaves, and running from thence to about 70 feet in the centre of the roof. The roof is formed of cross-beams. The engine foundation is of stone—12 feet high, 16 feet wide, and 35 feet long. There are about 7000 cubic feet of stone in all. The curling bed is formed of an inclined plain. The large engine is a high-pressure, vertical engine, with 24-inch cylinders, three feet stroke, and makes sixty revolutions per minute. The fly-wheel is 24 feet in diameter, and weighs 35 tons. The small engines are horizontal, and have two cylinders each, with a line 10½ inches in diameter, 20-inch stroke. One engine of 400 horse-power is used, together with two smaller engines of 20 horse-power each. There are five boilers, two of which are 30 feet long, and 30 inches in diameter, and two 40 inches in diameter.—The saws are four feet in diameter, and make 1000 revolutions per minute.

About 4000 tons of coal will be consumed for the manufacture of 6000 tons of new rails.

EDUCATIONAL.

ROMAN CATHOLIC.—There are two Separate Schools in Hamilton under the control of the Roman Catholic Church, one of which is in St. Mary's and the other in St. Patrick's Ward. Besides these, there are several private schools. Loretto Convent, situated on King-st. West, is under the superintendence of the Ladies of Loretto. This is a seminary for the education of young ladies. The course of instruction comprises every branch suitable to the education of such.

WESLEYAN FEMALE COLLEGE, in connection with the Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church in Canada, (incorporated by Act of Parliament.) The course of study embraces a primary, preparatory, academic and collegiate department.—Miss E. A. Adams, Principal..

UPPER CANADA INSTITUTE FOR THE DEAF AND DUMB.—This institution is situated on King-st. West, Florence Block; established 1858. The buildings are neatly and comfortably furnished. There are about seventy pupils attending the school, sixty-five of whom are deaf mutes, and five blind. The above institution is under the management of a Board of Commissioners appointed by Government, viz: Chairman, Rev. W. Ormiston, D.D.; Rev. Egerton Ryerson, D.D., L.L.D., Chief Superintendent of Education for Upper Canada, Mayor Magill, M.P.P., Judge Logie, Ebenezer Stinson, Esq., John McKeown, Esq.; Secretary, George Ryall, Esq., M.D. *Officers of the Institution.*—Resident Superintendent, John B. McGann, Esq.; Professors and Teachers, John G. Terrill, Esq., James T. Watson, Esq., Miss McGann; Medical Superintendent, Geo. Ryall, Esq., M.D.; Matron, Miss Clark. The charge for tuition and board is from \$50 to \$100 for parents able to pay. Government appropriated \$3,000 for the year 1865. Counties' Council support twenty-two out of the number attending, and parents twenty of the number in the school.

CENTRAL SCHOOL.—Archibald Macallum, Esq., B.A., Principal.

This school was established in 1853, has 22 teachers, and an average attendance of about 1100. In connection with the central are 8 primary, or ward schools, all under the immediate charge and direction of the Principal, assisted by 18 teachers.

Sessions commence second Monday in January, and second Monday in August. The course of instruction includes reading, writing, arithmetic, geography, grammar, history, (Canadian, English, and General) lineal drawing, book-keeping, human physiology, astronomy, elements of natural philosophy, chemistry, algebra, Euclid, mensuration, trigonometry, French, natural history, botany, geology, and the Latin and Greek languages. The charge is a monthly fee of

25 cents, for which, besides tuition, all books, stationery, &c., are provided. In the Grammar School department the students are charged \$3 00 per term of three months, and furnish their own books, in classics; and 12½ cents in the primary and intermediate divisions.

Each room is furnished with an excellent and complete set of apparatus, &c., for illustrating the elements of natural philosophy, chemistry, and physiology, in addition to blackboards, maps, charts, &c. There is a library in connection with the school, containing 1,500 volumes.

The school-house is situated in St. George's ward, and is a very handsome edifice, two stories high, built of cut stone, in a prominent position, near the centre of the city, and presents an imposing and attractive appearance. The house is divided into twenty apartments, and contains seats for 1250 pupils.

All the Public Schools are under the management of a Board of School Trustees, consisting of two members for each Ward. The following gentlemen constitute the Board for this year, 1866:—

The efficiency of this school is appreciated throughout the Province, and regarded as a model.

COURTS.

COURT OF ERROR AND APPEAL.—Judges of the Court: Hon. P. M. Vankoughnet, Chancellor of Upper Canada, Hon. W. H. Blake,—combined with the Judges of the Chancery, Queen's Bench, and Common Pleas Courts.

COURT OF QUEEN'S BENCH.—The jurisdiction of this Court extends to all manner of actions, causes, and suits, criminal and civil, real, personal, and mixed, within Upper Canada. Chief Justice, Hon. W. H. Draper, C. B.; Puisne Judges, Hon. John Hawkins Hagarty, D.C.L., and Hon. J. C. Morrison.

COURT OF CHANCERY.—This Court has the like jurisdiction as the Court of Chancery in England, in cases of fraud, accident, trusts, executors, administrators, co-partnerships, accounts, mortgages, awards, dower, infants, idiots, lunatics, and their estates, waste, specific performances, discovery, and to prevent multiplicity of suits, staying proceedings at law prosecuted against equity and good conscience, and may decree the issue, repeal, or avoidance of letters patent, and generally the like powers which the Court of Chancery in England possesses to administer justice in all cases in which there is no adequate remedy at law. Chancellor, Hon. P. M. Vankoughnet,

D.C.L.; Vice-Chancellors, Hon. Oliver Mowat, and Hon. John Godfrey Sprague; Master, Andrew Norton Buell.

COURT OF COMMON PLEAS.—This court has the same power and jurisdiction as a Court of Record, and as the Court of Queen's Bench. Chief Justice, Hon. W. B. Richards; Puisne Judges, Hons. A. Wilson, and J. Wilson.

HEIR AND DEVISEE COURT.—Commissioners, the Judges of the Superior Courts, and such other person as may be appointed by commission under the Great Seal. Their duties are to determine claims to lands, in Upper Canada, for which no patent has issued from the Crown in favor of the proper claimants, whether as heirs, devisees or assignees. Sittings at Toronto, first Monday in January and July in each year. Clerk of Commissioners, W. B. Howard.

COUNTY COURTS.—Presided over by a resident Judge in each County. Their jurisdiction extends to all personal actions where the debt or damages claimed do not exceed £50; and to all suits relating to debt, covenant or contract, where the amount is ascertained by the acts of the parties, or signature of the defendant, to £100. An appeal lies to either of the Superior Courts of Law. These courts also possess equity powers to the amount of £50, subject to an appeal to the Court of Chancery.

SURROGATE COURTS.—The jurisdiction of these courts relates to all testamentary matters and causes, and to the granting or revoking of probate of wills, and letters of administration of the effects of deceased persons having estate or effects in Upper Canada. The County Judges are also Judges of the Surrogate Courts.

RECORDER'S COURT.—In the cities of Toronto, Hamilton, London, Kingston, and Ottawa, the Recorder's Court takes the place of the County Sessions, the Justices for counties having no jurisdiction in the cities—the care of which is confined to the Recorder, Mayor, Aldermen, and Police Magistrate of each. Sessions held 2nd Monday in January, 1st Monday in April and July, and 3rd Monday in November. Recorders—Geo. Duggan, Toronto; James O'Reilly, Kingston; John E. Start, Hamilton; William Horton, London; J. B. Lewis, Ottawa.

INSOLVENT DEBTOR'S COURT.—The County Judge in each county presides.

DIVISION COURTS.—For the summary disposal of cases by a Judge; but a jury of five persons may be demanded in certain cases. Their jurisdiction extends to actions of debt or contracts amounting to £25; injuries or torts to personal chattels amounting to £10. Courts are held once in two months in each division, or oftener, at the discretion of the Judge.

Michaelmas begins third Monday in November, and ends Saturday of the ensuing week. Long vacation from 1st July to 21st August.

COUNTY COURT TERMS commence on the first Monday in January, April, July, and October, and end the following Saturday.
