The parts of all streets (extending north and south) north of King-street, are called by their names proper, as James-st., Hughson-st., whilst the part south of King-street is denominated Upper, as Upper James street, Upper Hughson street, and by the same rule the streets extending east and west; those east of James are called by their proper name as King-street, while those west of James street have the prefix of west, as west King-street.

In King-street, and all streets parallel with it, the numbers commence at James-street, and run East and West, the odd numbers being on the South side and the even on the North, viz.: W. P. Maclaren's number is 1 King-street, Macnab's, 3 King-street; while on the opposite, or North side, Lawson and Brother's number is 2 and 4 King-street, and J. T. Bickle and Son's, 6 King-street. Also, Canada Insurance Office is No. 1, and the Ontario Insurance Office is No. 3 West King-street; while opposite, Hamilton and Kneeshaw's number is 2, and A. Booker's number is 4 West King-street.

In James-street and all parallel streets, the numbers commence at King-st. and run North and South, the odd numbers being on the West side, and the even on the East, viz.: J. Hutchison's number is 1, and Ruthven and Watson's, 3 James-street; and on the opposite side, Field & Davidson's is No. 2, and J. McKillop's, 4 James-street; while A. A. and A. Wylie's number is 1, and R. and Roy's, 3 Upper James-street, the even numbers on the opposite, or East side.

NOTE.—The difficulty of getting up a first Directory of a large place as a thing like correctly, is, (from the absence of numbers to the houses, and the indifference of the public to give the necessary information from the object not being thoroughly understood, together with the fact that the work is composed of proper names for which there can be no rule, and an infinite variety of reverse causes,) very great, indeed more than an approximation to correctness impossible, whilst a future edition, based on the above, can readily be made. The system of numbering the houses, though open to objections, is that though most convenient, being identical with that of the sister city, Toronto.
