# INTRODUCTION.

In placing before the public this *our* first issue of the "London City and Middlesex County Directory" for 1886, we wish to say that neither time or expense has been spared in our effort to place before our patrons a thoroughly reliable work, and we trust that those criticising it will bear in mind the many difficulties we have had to contend with in collecting the necessary information, as well as the great amount of detail connected with its compilation. We have no hesitation in asking our patrons to compare the present work with any previous issue of the London City Directory.

The following is the number of names contained in the work, as compared with the two previous issues. The number of names credited to the 1883 and 1884 Directories include London East :

1883.....	8,041 Names.
1884.....	10,561 "
1886.....	11,965 "

This shows an encouraging increase. After a careful computation, and only counting once those doing business in the city and residing in the suburbs, we find the population, including London South and London West, to be 35,000, which must be very gratifying to the citizens. With the anticipated railway facilities, London will undoubtedly rapidly increase not only in population but also as a wholesale and manufacturing centre.

We wish also to state here that the patronage accorded the present issue, while exceeding that of any previous one, has not been what it should for a city of the size and importance of London ; but this is solely attributable to the fact that many of the professional and business men complained of some of the Directories heretofore published, and declined ordering until the work was issued. We regret that the publishing price would not allow us to make provision to supply them, and hope the Directory *will be found all that we represented it to be*, and that those who hesitated to order will not do so when we make the canvass for our next issue.

In conclusion we wish to thank the citizens generally for the facilities afforded us while taking the information.

**RULES FOR KEYHOLDERS.**

In pulling a box for fire, remember you are winding up a piece of clock-work, and no jerking or unusual force is required. A steady turn on the handle, or a steady pull on the door, will insure a proper alarm.

Never give an alarm, except from the box nearest the fire, unless you have first ascertained that the box nearest the fire has not been pulled, or will not work.

Do not pull a box for a chimney on fire, or a fire outside the city limits.

Leave your key in the door, the Chief or officer in charge will release and return it to you.

Never open the box, except in case of fire. Always await, if possible, the arrival of the Fire Department, and direct them to fire, if not visible.

Two blows of the bell is a signal that the fire is out.
