INTRODUCTION.

In presenting the present issue of the "London City Directory," the publishers wish to say that every care and attention has been given to insure the placing in the hands of their patrons a thoroughly reliable work.

The following is the number of names contained in the work, as compared with the three previous issues. The number of names credited to the 1883 and 1884 Directories include London East.

1883.....	8,041 Names
1884.....	10,561 "
1886.....	11,965 "
1887.....	13,774 "

This shows an increase of 1,809 names over that contained in the Directory of 1886, which, when multiplied by three, (the usual figure used by directory publishers) gives an increase of 5,427 in the population, which, coupled with the fact that there are 206 less vacant houses in the city than there were two years ago, warrants the claiming of a population, when London South and London West is included, of close on to 40,000. No year during the history of the Forest City has such an improvement been made in the business portion of the city. The erection of a large wholesale block on York street and the Union Block on Dundas street, is an indication that the citizens realize the advantages of the increased railroad facilities. London has now, through the C. P. R., direct communication with all points east to the Atlantic coast, and with the new Short Line to Portland and Boston, and to all points west, also to British Columbia, connecting with the C. P. R. steamers for China and Japan at Vancouver. The M. C. R. gives connection with the Vanderbilt system, which extends east to New York and west to Chicago, which gives the advantage of bringing European goods from New York over the one system of railroad. With such railroad facilities London is the most desirable point west of Toronto, for not only manufacturing, but also for the wholesale trade, and has become the distributing point for Western Ontario, and we hope in our next issue to claim that London will be, both in population and industry, the second city in Ontario.

The erection of a branch of the Cleveland Rolling Mill indicates the starting up of various other manufacturing industries.

In conclusion, the publishers wish to thank the citizens generally for the facilities afforded them in getting the necessary information for the publication.

straight down as far as it will go (about two inches)—once only—and let it go.

INSTRUCTIONS TO KEY-HOLDERS AND OTHERS.

Upon ascertaining that there is a fire in the vicinity of your Box, unlock the outside door and pull it wide open. Then listen, and if you do not hear the little gong inside striking, proceed at once to give an alarm as directed elsewhere. If you do hear the gong strike count the strokes, and if it is the number of a box near the fire you need not send in another alarm. But if the number struck is from a box located in another direction, then wait until it has done striking or working (about 30 seconds), before you attempt to give an alarm.

If, after pulling your box as directed, you do not hear the little gong inside strike or the box working, lock the door and go to the next nearest box to the fire and repeat the operation.

Do not attempt to remove the key from the lock, as you cannot do so without breaking the lock or key. Some member of the Fire Department will release and return it to you.

Never give an alarm except from a box nearest the fire, unless you have first ascertained that the box nearest to the fire will not work or has not been pulled.

Never open a box except to give an alarm. Do not pull a box for a chimney fire, or for a fire outside the city limits.

Always wait (if possible) till the Firemen arrive to direct them to the fire, if it is not visible.

Keep your key in a convenient and secure place, where you can get it quickly when needed, and where it will be out of the reach of children or strangers.

If you are going to remove from the house you occupy, please return your key to the Fire Station or to the Electrician of the Department.

Always close the door of the box before you leave it.

NOTICE TO THE PUBLIC.

Any responsible person living in the vicinity of the boxes will have keys or can obtain them by applying to the Chief of the Fire Department or Electrician.

Any person having a telephone can use it for the purpose of giving an alarm of fire.

Two blows on the City Hall Bell (after an alarm is given), will be a signal that the fire is out.

Parties erecting houses or scaffolding, or moving houses, must on no account interfere with our wires, poles or boxes. By leaving notice at the Fire Station any alterations necessary will be promptly attended to.

Citizens will confer a favor by immediately reporting at the Fire Station any break or damage to the line or boxes, or any malicious or accidental interference with the same.

DIRECTIONS FOR COUNTING THE SIGNAL ON THE BELL WHEN A BOX IS PULLED.

Suppose Box 34 is pulled, you do not get 34 blows on the gongs or bell, but first you get three distinct blows, which will represent the tens, or 30; then a pause of five seconds, when four blows } 30 4 will be given, representing the units, or four thus: 111 — 1111 = 34 Single numbers up to nine are struck consecutively or continuously, without any break, until the whole number is given. The number of the box pulled will be repeated four or five times, with an interval between.
