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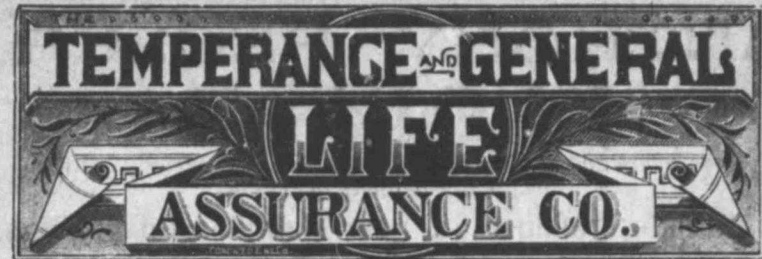

INTRODUCTION.

The Queen and the Royal Family.

Her Majesty VICTORIA, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Queen, Defender of the Faith, Empress of India (in India Kaiser-I-Hind), born 24th May, 1819; succeeded to the Throne 20th June, 1837, on the death of her uncle King William IV., crowned 28th June, 1838, and married 10th February, 1840, to his late Royal Highness Francis Albert Augustus Charles Emanuel, Prince Consort, Duke of Saxony, Prince of Cobourg and Gotha. Her Majesty is the only child of his late Royal Highness Edward, Duke of Kent, son of King George III. The children of her Majesty are:—

Her Royal Highness Victoria Adelaide Mary Louisa, PRINCESS ROYAL OF ENGLAND AND PRUSSIA, born Nov. 21, 1840, and married to the late Emperor Frederick of Germany, Jan. 25, 1858, and has issue four sons and four daughters.

His Royal Highness Albert Edward, PRINCE OF WALES, born Nov. 9, 1841, married March 10, 1863, Alexandra of Denmark (Princess of Wales), born December 1, 1844, and has issue Prince Albert Victor, born Jan. 8, 1864; George Frederick Ernest Albert, born June 3, 1865; Louisa Victoria Alexandra Dagmar, born Feb. 20, 1867; Victoria Alexandra Olga Mary, born July 6, 1868; and Maud Charlotte Mary Victoria, born Nov. 26, 1869.

Her Royal Highness Alice Maud Mary, born April 25, 1843; married to H. R. H. Prince Frederick Louis of Hesse, July 1, 1862; and has issue five daughters and two sons; and son killed by accident May, 1873. Died Dec. 14th, 1878.

His Royal Highness Alfred Ernest Albert, born at Edinburgh, born Aug. 6, 1844; mar-

ried her Imperial Highness the Grand Duchess Marie of Russia, Jan. 23, 1874, and has issue one son and five daughters.

Her Royal Highness Helena Augusta Victoria, born May 25, 1846; married to H. R. H. Prince Frederick Christian Charles Augustus of Schleswig-Holstein-Sonderburg-Augustenburg, July 5, 1866, and has issue three sons and two daughters.

Her Royal Highness Louisa Carolina Alberta, born March 18, 1848, married to the Marquis of Lorne, eldest son of the Duke of Argyle, March 21, 1871.

His Royal Highness Arthur William Patrick Albert, Duke of Connaught, born May 1, 1850; married 13th March, 1879, to Princess Louise Margaret, daughter of Prince Frederick Charles of Prussia, and has issue one son and two daughters.

His Royal Highness Leopold George Duncan Albert, born April 7, 1853; married April 27, 1882, to Princess Helen of Waldeck, and has issue one son and one daughter. Died March 28, 1884.

Her Royal Highness Beatrice Mary Victoria Feodore, born April 14, 1857; married July 23, 1885, to Prince Henry of Battenburg, and has issue one son and one daughter.

Then grasp the knob or button, which is on a crank on the inside door, and pull it slowly and steadily to your right, and downwards (once only) as far as it will go. Then release it, and it will at once fly back to its place.

Directions for giving an alarm from above boxes. Unlock the outside door and pull it firmly and steadily until it is wide open. Pulling the door wide open is all that is necessary to give an alarm from above boxes.

Directions for giving an alarm from above boxes. Unlock and pull open outside door. Then pull the hook on the inner door straight down as far as it will go (about two inches)—once only—and let it go.

INSTRUCTIONS TO KEY-HOLDERS AND OTHERS.

Upon ascertaining that there is a fire in the vicinity of your box, unlock the outside door and pull it wide open. Then listen, and if you don't hear the little gong inside striking, proceed at once to give an alarm as directed elsewhere, if you do hear the gong

strike count the strokes, and if it is the number of a box near the fire you need not send in another alarm. But if the number struck is from a box located in another direction, then wait until it has done striking or working (about 30 seconds), before you attempt to give an alarm.

If, after pulling your box as directed, you do not hear the little gong inside strike or the box working, lock the door and go to the next nearest box to the fire and repeat the operation.

Do not attempt to remove the key from lock, as you cannot do so without breaking the lock or key. Some member of the Fire Department will release and return it to you.

Never give an alarm except from a box nearest the fire, unless you have first ascertained that the box nearest to the fire will not work or has not been pulled.

Never open a box except to give an alarm. Do not pull a box for a chimney fire, or for a fire outside the city limits.

Always wait (if possible) till the Fireman arrive to direct them to the fire, if it is not visible.

Keep your key in a convenient and secure place, where you can get it quickly when needed, and where it will be out of the reach of children or strangers.

If you are going to remove from the house you occupy, please return your key to the Fire Station or to the Electrician of the Department.

Always close the door of the box before you leave it.

NOTICE TO THE PUBLIC.

Any responsible person living in the vicinity of the boxes will have keys or can obtain them by applying to the Chief of the Fire Department or Electrician.

Any person having a telephone can use it for the purpose of giving an alarm of fire.

Two blows on the City Hall Bell (after an alarm is given), will be a signal that the fire is out.

Parties erecting houses or scaffolding, or moving houses, must on no account interfere with our wires, poles or boxes. By leaving notice at the Fire Station any alterations necessary will be promptly attended to.

Citizens will confer a favor by immediately reporting at the Fire Station any break or damage to the line or boxes, or any malicious or accidental interference with the same.

DIRECTIONS FOR COUNTING THE SIGNAL ON THE BELL WHEN A BOX IS PULLED.

Suppose Box 34 is pulled, you do not get 34 blows on the gongs or bell, but first you get three distinct blows, which will represent the tens, or 30; then a pause of five seconds,

when four blows will } 30 4
be given, representing }
the units, or four thus: } 111 — 1111 — 34
Single numbers up to nine are struck consecutively or continuously, without any break, until the whole number is given. The number of the box pulled will be repeated four or five times, with an interval between.
