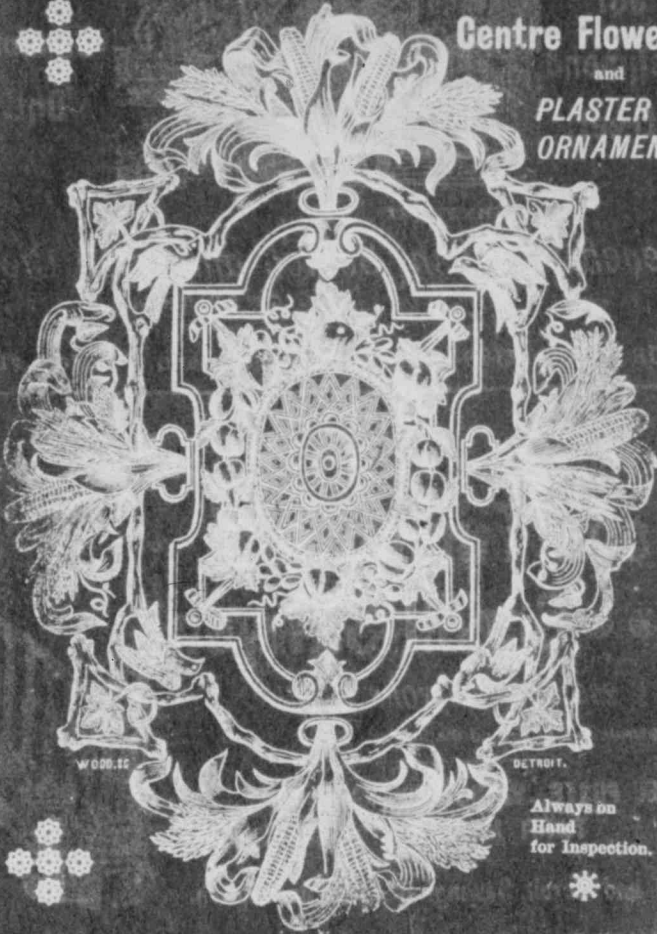

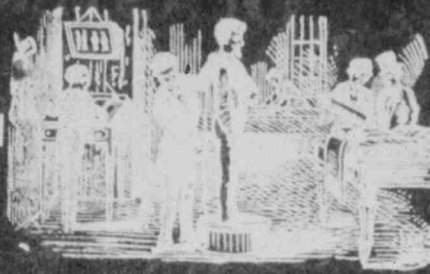

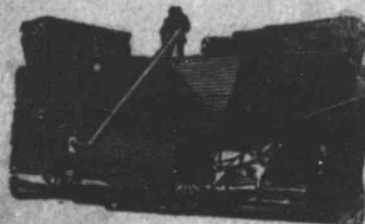

**THE QUEEN AND ROYAL FAMILY**

Her Majesty Victoria, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Queen, Defender of the Faith, Empress of India (in India Kaiser-I-Hind), born May 24th, 1819; succeeded to the throne June 20th, 1837, on the death of her uncle, King William IV.; crowned June 28, 1838, and married February 10, 1840, to his late Royal Highness, Francis Albert Augustus Charles Emanuel, Prince Consort, Duke of Saxony, Prince of Cobourg and Gotha. Her Majesty is the only child of his late Royal Highness Edward, Duke of Kent, son of King George III. The Children of her Majesty are:—

Her Royal Highness Victoria Adelaide Mary Louise, Princess Royal of England and Prussia, born Nov. 21, 1840, and married to the late Emperor Frederick of Germany, Jan. 25, 1858, and has issue four sons and four daughters.

His Royal Highness Albert Edward Prince of Wales, born Nov. 9, 1841, married March 10, 1863; Alexandra of Denmark (Princess of Wales), born Dec. 1, 1844, and has issue Prince Albert Victor, born Jan. 8, 1864, died Jan. 14, 1892; George Frederick Ernest Albert, born June 3, 1865, married July 6, 1893, to Princess Mary of Teck; Louisa Victoria Alexandra Dagmar, born Feb. 20, 1867, married Duke

of Fife, July 27, 1889; Victoria Alexandra Olga Mary, born July 6, 1868; and Maud Charlotte Mary Victoria, born Nov. 26, 1869.

Her Royal Highness Alice Maud Mary, born April 25, 1843; married to H. R. H. Prince Frederick Louis of Hesse, July 1, 1862; and has issue five daughters and two sons; second son killed by accident, May, 1873; died Dec. 14, 1878.

His Royal Highness Alfred Ernest Albert, Duke of Edinburgh, born Aug. 6, 1844; married her Imperial Highness the Grand Duchess Marie of Russia, Jan. 22, 1874, and has issue one son and five daughters.

Her Royal Highness Helena Augusta Victoria, born May 25, 1846; married to H. R. H. Prince Frederick Christian Charles Augustus of Schleswig-Holstein-Sonderburg-Augustenburg, July 5, 1866, and has issue three sons and two daughters.

Her Royal Highness Louisa Carolina Alberta, born March 18, 1848; married to the Marquis of Lorne, eldest son of the Duke of Argyll, March 21, 1871.

His Royal Highness Arthur William Patrick Albert, Duke of Connaught, born May 1, 1850, married March 13, 1879, to Princess Louise Margaret, daughter of Prince Frederick Charles of Prussia, and has issue one son and two daughters.

His Royal Highness Leopold, George Duncan Albert, born April 7, 1853; married April 27, 1882, to Princess Helen of Waldeck, and has issue one son and one daughter, Died March 28, 1884.

Her Royal Highness Beatrice Mary Victoria Feodore, born April 14, 1857; married July 23, 1885, to Prince Henry of Battenburg, and has issue one son and two daughters.

Instructions to Key-Holders.  
 Upon ascertaining that there is a

fire in the vicinity of your box, unlock the outside door and pull it wide open. Then listen, and if you do not hear the little gong inside striking, proceed at once to give the alarm as directed above. If you do hear the gong striking wait until it has entirely ceased repeating its number of rounds before you attempt to pull the hook or knob.

If after pulling the box as directed, you do not hear the little gong inside striking of the Box working, shut the door and go to the nearest telephone to send in the alarm.

Do not attempt to remove your key from the lock as you cannot do so without injuring the lock or breaking the key. Some member of the Fire Department will release and return it to you.

Never open a Box except for the purpose of giving an alarm. Never give an alarm for a fire outside of the city limits, or for a fire which is a long distance away (unless you are on a line between it and the Fire Station) or for a chimney fire. All alarms should be sent in from the Box nearest to the fire. If possible always wait until the firemen arrive and direct them to the fire if it is not visible. Always close the door of the Box before leaving it.

Keep your key in a place where you can get it quickly when required and where it will be out of the reach of children and strangers. If you intend to remove from the house you are occupying, please return your key to the nearest Fire Station.

**Notice to the public.**

Any responsible citizen can obtain a key by applying at the nearest Fire Station.

Keys will be kept at houses in the immediate neighborhood of the Boxes.

Any one having a telephone can use it for the purpose of giving an alarm for a fire.

Ten strokes on City Hall Bell or on the gongs, followed by the number of the Box, will donate a second alarm for the same fire, and call all the apparatus of the Department.

Two strokes on Bell or gongs (after an alarm is given), will signify that the fire is out.

Parties erecting houses or scaffolding, moving houses or cutting trees,

must on no account interfere with our wires, poles or boxes. By leaving notice at the nearest Fire Station, all necessary alterations will be promptly attended to. Citizens will confer a favor by immediately reporting at the nearest Fire Station any break or damage to our line or boxes.

Directions for counting the signal on the bell when a box is pulled.

Suppose box 34 is pulled, you do not get 34 blows on the gongs or bell, but first you get three distinct blows, which will represent the tens or 30; then a pause of five seconds, when four blows will be given 30 4 representing the units, or four thus 111-1111-34 Single numbers up to nine, are struck consecutively or continuously, without any break, until the whole number is given. The number of the box pulled will be repeated four or five times with an interval between.
