munity, as in all other districts of the country. Taking these into account, and small private seminaries, and the great colleges erected by the energy of Dean Hellmuth, it may be truthfully said that there is no place in Canada that enjoys higher educational advantages.

The Wesleyans, so often the pioneers in the work of evangelization,

The Wesleyans, so often the pioneers in the work of evangelization, were the first to establish gospel ordinances in the locality, and in the year 1830 the first church was built, and built by them. Next, in the same year, followed the Episcopal church; they erected first a frame chapel where St. Paul's Cathedral now stands, which was completed in 1846, the original structure having been consumed by fire in the previous year. The third denomination that appeared was the Roman Catholic in 1834. There is now, it may be added in an word, a ample variety of denominations, and many of their chapels are amongst the striking erections of the city, some of them, like the new Scotch church, being ornamented internally with remarkable taste, and at a large out-

lay of money. In 1835, having attained a population of 1,000, London was entitled, according to the law as it then stood, to return a representative to Parliament. It had formerly voted with the county, now it was to vote independently, and Mr. Mahlon Burwell, was the successful candidate. In 1838 it, for the first time, became a military post, and with more or less regularity soldiers were stationed in its garrison till the breaking out of the Crimean war. The arrival of the troops gave an impulse to the place, and it continued to increase steadily ever afterwards till the commercial crisis in 1858, thirteen years back. In 1847 it was raised to the position of a town, and in the following year elected Mr. Simeon Morrill as its first Mayor. The census roll having risen above 10,000 in 1855, London was numbered in the list of Canadian cities. Mr. Murray Anderson was the first Mayor after this important change in its history, and when it arrived at this dignity, the late Justice John Wilson was its representative in the Legislative Assembly. It is not easy to tell the exact population at the present moment, but let us say 15,000, and we are not wide of the mark. Slowly, but steadily, manufactories are increasing along its streets, and those are providing employment for orderly and industrious workers. Steam engines, boilers, oil stills, stoves, carriages, furniture, shoes, farming machines and implements, refined oil, salted meats, &c., &c., are sent forth from its hives of industry to add to the wealth and reputation of the producers. Railways start from the city in every direction, facilitating manufacturing operations immensely, and accommodating those who travel on business or pleasure. It is quite true that the manufacturing is not driven with an awful rush, as if the owners were heedless whether they were established or failed in business, provided they only run vigorously, say furiously for a while; but the moderate progress seems to be comfortably remunerative, if we may form our opinion by the prosperity of the producers, and the recent enlargements in their premises.

Messrs. E. A. Taylor and Robert Reid have also book binderies connected with their book and stationery establishment.

BOOT AND SHOE MANUFACTURING (WHOLESALE.)

J. McPherson & Co. opened an establishment on Dundas street in 1862, they have also a large branch in Hamilton. One hundred and thirty hands are employed in the business here, and all the latest and most improved modern inventions in pegging and sole sewing machines, cutting, skiving and shaving machines. They manufacture \$150,000 worth of boots and shoes annually. J. C. Merritt manager.

London Boot & Shoe Manufacturing Co., established in 1870, on the corner of Dundas and Talbot streets. This company employs 100 hands in the manufacture of all kinds of boots and shoes, and use the most approved modern labor saving machines. Their probable annual sales will be \$100,000 to \$150,000.

JOHN McMechan & Co., have erected a large building on north side of Dundas st, where they employ 150 hands in the manufacture of Boots and Shoes. Their machinery and workmen are all first-class,

BENT STUFF AND HUB AND SPOKE FACTORIES.

The Middlesex Steam Bending Hub and Spoke Factory is situated on Ridout street, Messrs. Plummer & Pacey, proprietors. It was established in 1843, and gives employment to 25 hands, turning out work to the amount of \$20,000 per annum. The main building is a two story brick, 72 x 30 feet. The ground floor is used as a hub and spoke factory, and above it is the bending room. In the rear is a large breik one-story building, 35 x 160 feet, which is used as a wagon and sleigh factory. North of this is a two-story brick building, 16 x 72 feet, used for storage. The works are propelled by a 15 horse-power steam engine.

MR. A. EFNER carries on a bending factory on York street.

BREWRIES.

CITY BREWERY.—This extensive establishment, situated on the corner of Waterloo street and Pall Mall, was first started by Messrs. W. & J. Carling in the year 1843, since which time the original building has been enlarged and improved from year to year, to meet the requirements of the increase of business. The main building, of brick, now measures 240 x 74 feet, with an addition of 74 x 40 feet, used chiefly as the bottling department. The whole building is two storeys high, with a basement. Thre are two malt kilns, with a capacity of 12,000 bushels each, being about one-half the amount required for the extent of business done. A ten horse-power engine is used, and from 25 to 30 hands kept constantly employed in the manufacture of ale and porter, the superiority of which is well established throughout Canada. The bottling department is kept well stocked with the several past years' manufacture. The cellars are excellently arranged, and well adapted for stock ale and porter.

JOHN LABATT'S BREWERY is situated at the south end of Talbot street, and is built of brick and stone. This is one of the largest and most complete brewries in Canada, and is fitted up with every new improvement adapted to the business. The bottling department is ample and convenient, and the storage cellars (all under ground) large and well suited to the storage requirements of the establishment. The malting houses are spacious, and receive the utmost attention and care. The kilns are now of sufficient capacity to produce all the malt required by the firm. An improved steam pump is here used, which largely economizes labor. It was procured from the United States, and put in

working order by Mr. Rogers, plumber, of the city of London. Over two hundred feet of pipes are extended from the brewery to the millrace from whence the supply of water is obtained and forced to the top of the building by means of the steam pump. There is also a large ice house connected with the establishment.

BUILDERS AND CONTRACTORS.

Messrs. Brodbert, Overell & Co., successors to the late Alex. Campbell, carry on a large business. Their premises are on Bathurst street, between Richmond and Talbot. They employ 30 hands in the manufacture of doors, sash, mouldings and wood eve troughs of best quality. They are also contractors for and builders of all kinds of edifices.

MESSRS. WRIGHT & DURAND are extensively engaged in the same line of business. They employ 35 hands on buildings of all kinds, planing and matching lumber and making doors sash, blinds, mouldings, scroll work, &c., &c.

MR. PETER WESTON is engaged in wood turning of all kinds. His buildings are frame 60 x 24 feet corner Duke and Richmond. He employs 3 hands.

CABINET WARE AND FURNITURE.

There are several firms in the city engaged in the above line, who manufacture and deal in furniture. Mr. George Moorhead, King street, between Clarence and Richmond, is most extensively engaged in the business. He employs a large number of hands and supplies every thing in the line.

CARRIAGES, WAGONS AND SLEIGHS.

One of the most important branches of the manufactures of London consists in carriage making, there being about a dozen establishments, all vieing with each other in the superiority of vehicles turned out. The following are the principal firms:

ABBOTT Bros., on Dundas street, near Wellington, called the Canada Carriage Works, were established in 1864.

The London Carriage Factory, situated on King street, between Talbot and Ridout, was established by Mr. John Campbell in 1852. The main building is 110 x 32 feet, three storeys high, with a black-smith shop attached, 110 x 50 feet. A spacious show room is located on the first floor. During the past year Mr. Campbell has turned out 100 buggies and carriages, 4 coaches, costing each \$700, and 83 pleasure

sleighs. Twenty hands are kept constantly employed. This is one of oldest establishments in the Province in this line; and has been attended with unprecedented success.

DOMINION CARREAGE WORKS.—These works, situated on Dundas street between Wellington and Waterloo, were established by H. H. Dart, in 1854, and are now carried on by his brother, Roger Dart, who employs about twenty hands in the manufacture of all kinds of carriages, buggies, waggons, sleighs, etc. Mr. Dart was awarded the first prize at the several Provincial Fairs field at London.

MR. THOMAS D. HODGINS' Carriage Factory, situated corner of Market and Richmond streets, was established in 1866. Eighteen hands are employed in the manufacture of all descriptions of vehicles, of a superior make and quality. His main building is two storys high, 30 x 40 feet, the ground floor being used as a wood shop, the upper story trimming and paint shop. North of the building is a frame show room 30 x 50 feet, in rear of which is a blacksmith shop, 30 x 50 feet.

MR. JOHN McKellar established a carriage factory in 1861 on Richmond street, opposite the English Cathedral. He employs about 20 hands, and turns out work of a superior character. The premises are commodious, and built of brick.

PAVEY & Bros. factory, situated on King street, was established in

Messrs. Plummer & Pacev have an establishment on Ridout street, near William street, founded in the year 1843. Their chief business is manufacturing hubs and spokes, but a large number of waggons and sleighs are manufactured at these works.

Messrs. Roe & Judd, situated on Wellington, bet King and York streets, established themselves in 1862, Eighteen hands are constantly employed, and a large amount of work is turned out, equal in finish and durability to any house in the city.

MR. THOMPSON, on Dundas street, bet Clarence and Wellington, commenced business in 1867. Eighteen hands are employed, and work turned out to the amount of \$10,000 per annum.

CARRIAGE SPRINGS.

Mr. R. Brummir, Ridout street, corner Bathurst, manufactures largely carriage and buggy springs. This concern has been six years in operation; giving employment at the present time to six hands.

COOPERS.

There are several cooperages in London, among which may be noticed as the most prominent.

THE ONTARIO COOPERAGE is carried on by Mr. Charles Smith on Bathurst street. He established his business in 1866, uses steam power, and employs from 50 to 60 hands in the manufacture of oil, whiskey, and beer barrels and other tight work.

MA. IRWIN NESEITT is engaged in the same line of business. His buildings are on Horton street east. His buildings are frame 100 x 30 feet. He employs 40 hands, and use steam power in the manufacture of oil, whiskey, and beer barrels, and all other descripsions of cooperage.

MR. WM. HOCKIN is extensively engaged in the same business. He carries on the London cooperage, situated on York street, east. His business was established in 1867, and 50 hands are employed in the manufacture of everything in the line.

MR. HUNT, of the City Mills, has also a cooperage attached to his establishment, employing from six to eight hands.

FOUNDERIES AND MACHINE SHOPS.

London is noted for the extent of its excellent foundries and machine

THE PHŒNIX FOUNDRY was established by Mr. John Elliott in 1852. It is situated on the corner of Wellington and Bathurst streets, where he manufactures reaping, mowing and threshing machines, of the most improved description, and all kinds of agricultural implements of superior quality. Mr. Elliott has also a branch establishment in the flourishing town of Strathroy, where he supplies the farmers of Lambton and North and West Middlesex.

THE HON. ELIJAH LEONARD owns the extensive foundry and machine works situated on York street, between Waterloo and Colborne, where 25 hands are employed and superior work turned out, such as boilers, engines, mill-gearing and agricultural implements of all kinds.

THE CITY MILLS, Mr. Charles Hunt, proprietor, contain four run of stones, propelled by water power, and has capacity to dress and pack 123 barrels of flour daily.

NORTH BRANCH, Messrs. Hillard & Saunby, proprietors, have four run of stones, propelled by water, having capacity to dress and pack 120 barrels of flour daily.

THE BLACKFRIER'S MILLS are carried on by Mr. George Phillips. The building is expected to give place to one of stone and brick, with four run of stones. This mill is supplied with a never failing water power supplied by the Thames. A large quantity of custom work is done at this mill in superior style.

HON, ELHAH LEONARD's flour and grist mill is a large brick building on York street, three run of stones are used, and superior merchant and city flour manufactured; also custom work executed with despatch.

EAST END MILLS.-Messrs. Plewes & Crow's mills are frame, 30 x 40 feet, three storys high, with three run of stones. They use water power, and employ six hands. Their average work is 70 barrels of merchant flour, aud 75 bushels of custom work per diem.

MESSRS. MUIRHEAD & GREY'S oat meal, split peas, and pot barley mill is frame, 30 x 40 feet, three storys high, situated on the corner of Colborne and Simcoe streets. This is the only mill of this kind in the County of Middlesex, and consequently does a large business in merchant trade and custom work. Steam power is used.

TANNERIES.

MR. E. W. HYMAN carries on two tanneries in the city. The first, which might justly be called the model tannery, is a brick building, situated on Burlington street, corner of Ann, and is used principally for the manufacture of sole leather. It was established in 1867, and is 2½ storys high, 100 x 40 feet, with a beam house attached, of frame, 34 x 60 feet, containing a 30 horse steam engine. The capacity of this tannery amounts to 7,000 sides per annum. There is also a sheepskin factory on Ann street, adjoining, 2½ stories high, 32 x 100 feet, in which 60,000 lbs. of wood are pulled per annum. Mr. Hyman has also another tannery on Talbot street, cor of York, the main building being 100 x 40 feet, with a beam house about 20 x 60 feet. A ten horse power steam engine is used. The principel manufacture here is upper leather.

RICHARD ARSCOTT'S tannery on George street, corner of Talbot, is a large frame, furnished with all the modern improvements for the tannery of sole, upper, and harness leather; kip calf, and sheep skins. He uses steam power, and employs 10 hands.

MR. ALEXANDER JOHNSTON is extensively engaged in the leather trade. His store is on Richmond street, opposite the post office. His establishment is the most extensive west of Toronto
