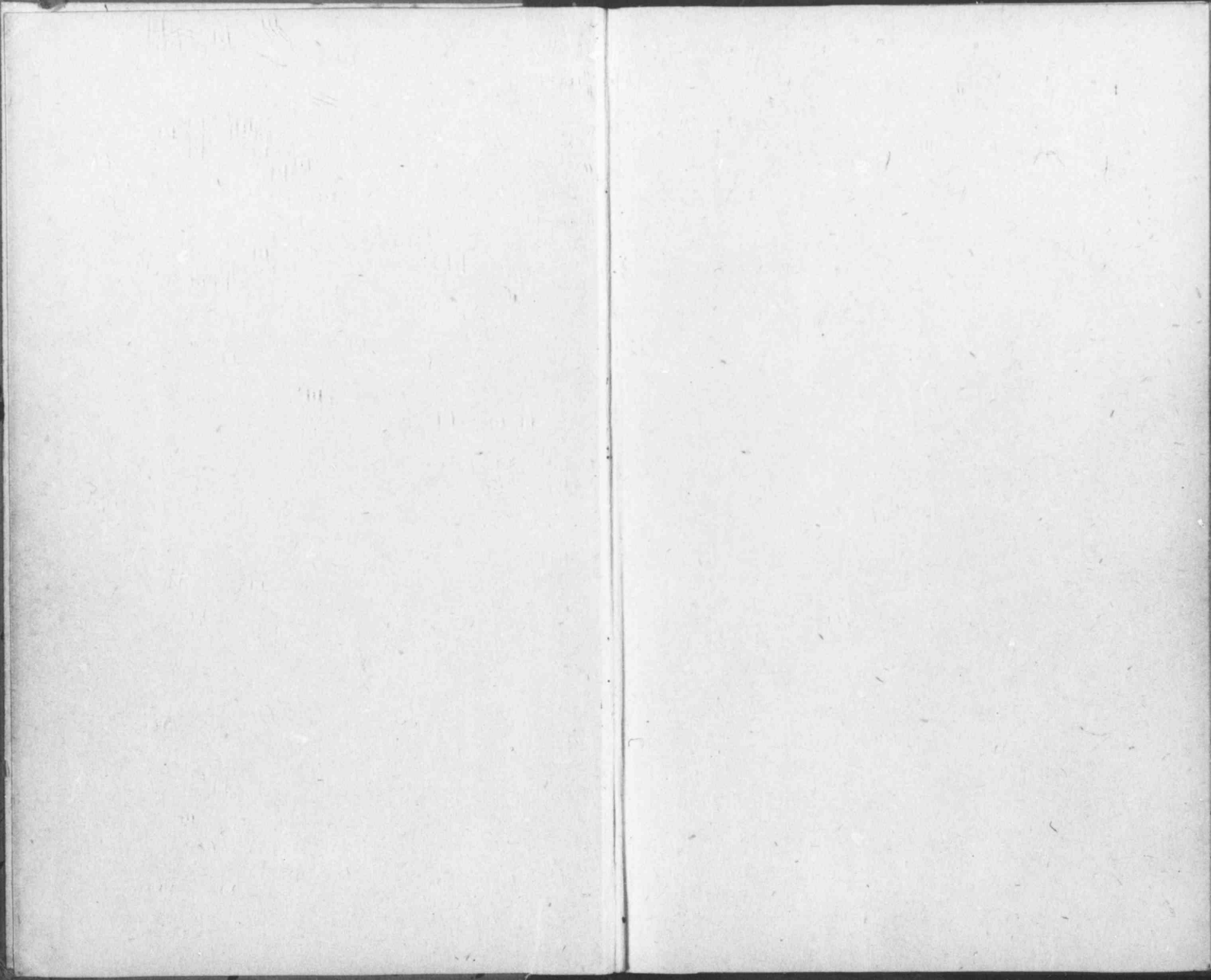

THE CITY OF KINGSTON.

The fifth City in Ontario in population, is situated at the head of the St. Lawrence River and the end of Lake Ontario. It is the principal port for lake navigation in Ontario possessing the largest and finest harbour in the country. It is a station of the Grand Trunk Railway, and the head quarters of the Kingston and Pembroke Railway. The Public Buildings are very beautiful, the City Hall (the finest one in the Province) the Court House, Post Office, Custom House, Queen's University and College, the Churches and a number of business blocks and private residences. At the Western boundary is located the Kingston Penitentiary and about a mile west of it the Kingston Asylum for the Insane; opposite the city is the Royal Canadian Military College, and Garden and Wolfe Islands. Kingston is a military as well as naval city. Here is stationed 'B' Battery and a troop of cavalry, besides a local troop, a battery, and the 14th Prince of Wales' Own Rifles. The principal business streets are Princess, and parts of Wellington, Bagot, Clarence, Ontario, Brock, Market Square, Montreal, Queen etc., all connected by the Kingston Street Railway. There are two Daily Papers published, *The British Whig*, and the *Daily News*, both papers having weekly editions also. The city returns one member for the Dominion Parliament, Mr. Alex. Gunn, and one for the Local House, Mr. James H. Metcalfe. Kingston enjoys the proud position of being the soundest city financially, its merchants being considered the most prudent and safest men to deal with. The Limestone City, as it is sometimes called, is also the cleanest and healthiest city in Ontario, being built on the solid rock. A new Union Station is about to be built which will greatly add to the city's prosperity, and Kingston bids at no distant date to be one of the foremost cities of the Province. Kingston is distant from Toronto 161 miles, Montreal 172, Quebec 344, Ottawa 95, Hamilton 200, London (Ont.) 276, Detroit 386, St. John, N. B., 752, Halifax 828, and Liverpool 2414 miles. Population 15,000; with suburbs of Portsmouth, Barriefield and Garden Island, 17,500.

THE DENTAPHONE.

EDUCATIONAL.

QUEEN'S UNIVERSITY AND COLLEGE.

This institution, one of the oldest and most celebrated in Canada, is situated in the west end of the city, the grounds being bounded by Union, Arch, Stuart and Gordon streets. The houses of the Principal and Professors command a fine view of Lake Ontario and the surrounding country. The college buildings are new, handsome and substantial. The Astronomical Observatory of the institution was founded in 1855, and was deeded to the University in 1861. It contains an equatorial by Mr. Alvan Clarke, with an object glass $6\frac{1}{2}$ inches aperture, a small transit by Troughton & Simms, and an astronomical clock constructed by the assistant observer; also the Beaufoy transit, lent by the Royal Astronomical Society, England, a reflecting telescope by Mr. Short, with a speculum of $7\frac{1}{2}$ inches in diameter, and a reflecting telescope. It is in charge of the veteran Professor Williamson, who is as enthusiastic as ever in the pursuit of knowledge in this line of investigation, and practical astronomy will now be taught to those students who may so desire.

The library contains over 17,000 volumes, and receives considerable additions annually. Donations are sent to it from all quarters. The museum is varied and extensive. Its mineralogical and palæontological collections are particularly valuable.

Queen's College was incorporated with the style and privileges of a University by a Royal Charter, dated October 16th, 1841. A complete curriculum of study leads to the degrees in Arts of B.A., B.Sc., D.Sc., and M.A.; in Theology, of B.D.; and in Medicine, of M.D. These degrees are conferred on those who have gone through the required curriculum and passed the prescribed examinations. The Senate, however, is empowered to confer, besides these the Honorary Degrees of D.D. and LL.D., for literary, scientific or professional distinction.

It is the desire of the Trustees to attain the highest efficiency in all departments of a University course. Large additions are being made to the equipment of the teaching department in the scientific branches. The Physical and Chemical Laboratories will be better furnished, and especial attention will hereafter be given to practical training in these matters so important to the growth and development of our young country. The addition of a new Professor in Theology will make that department more complete than heretofore.

The Session in Arts begins on the first Wednesday of October, and closes on the last Thursday of April; the session in Theology begins on the first Monday of November, and closes at the same time as the Arts session. There are twenty-three scholarships in Arts and seventeen in Theology, ranging in value from \$32 to \$100, only three of which are below \$50. There are nine University prizes, none of which is under \$25, and four gold medals.

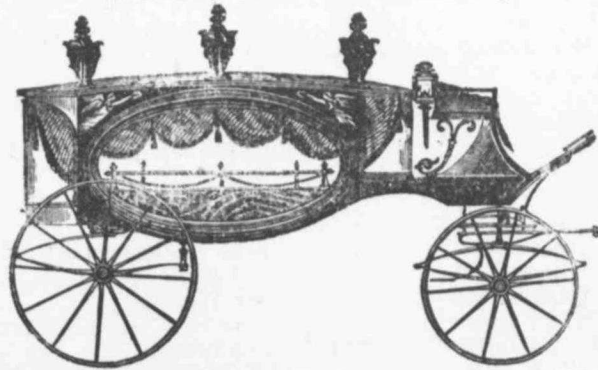
