OIL LANDS OF ONTARIO.

Without entering into a lengthened and, to the majority of readers, uninteresting geological, and particularly lithological, description of the oil lands of Ontario, or reviewing the numerous speculations as to the origin of petroleum, we will briefly state that the Corniferous, which is the oil-producing formation, underlies in a greater or less degree the Counties of Welland, Haldimand, Norfolk, Brant, Oxford, Perth, Huron, Bruce, Essex, Kent, and Lambton, or more generally "all that part of the Province lying to the south and west of a curved line, running from the foot of Lake Erie to Stratford, to an undefined point on Lake Huron, west to the mouth of the Saugeen River. A considerable part of this area is, however, overlaid by the shales of the Hamilton formation, and the overlying Portage and Chemung groups; but by far the greater part is overlaid by drift deposits of clays, sands and gravel, and it is in or through these overlying drift deposits, and their underlying Hamilton formation, that mineral petroleum springs are found in the greatest abundance, and wells are sunk through, to, and into the underlying Corniferous formation." The oil-bearing districts of Ontario have been long known to the Indians. In places where the oil was found floating on the surface of the water, they obtained it by saturating their blankets with the surface liquid and squeezing out the retained oil, which they used medicinally; at a subsequent period the white settlers used it for such general purposes as lubricating waggon wheels and farming machinery. In many places, as at Enniskillen and Bothwell, the overflow of oil becoming dried, partly by oxidation and partly by volatilization, left solid beds of tarry bitumen, which are found, from the surface to ten feet beneath it, varying in thickness from a few inches to a couple of feet, some of the deeper of which are separable into thin layers or laminæ, and retain the impressions of animal and vegetable life, which had been embedded in it while in a liquid state, thus representing the characteristics of coal.

The discovery of Petroleum, on the flats of Black Creek, dates as far back as 1840. In the year 1858 it was tested as a burning oil, and found to possess all the qualities of the finest Pennsylva-

nian petroleum. As soon as this fact became known, numerous speculators, chiefly Americans, were attracted to the oil territory, and all the fluctuations of speculative energy were experienced, The oil was first obtained from surface wells at a depth of from twenty to forty feet, and brought to the surface by hand pumps; but subsequently a successful attempt was made on the rock, and oil of a superior quality was obtained at depths varying from sixty. five to several hundred feet. The famous "Shaw well" was tapped in 1862. The proprietor, Mr. John Shaw, after months of labour. was rewarded by an unprecedented flow of oil which, filling the surface well, covered the land for acres around. About twentyeight thousand barrels were secured, but the quantity lost cannot, of course, be ascertained. Soon after other flowing wells were discovered, and oil became such a drug that in the summer of 1862 it was sold as low as ten cents a barrel; but when the wells became intermittent, or ceased flowing, the price increased in proportion.

LAKES AND RIVERS.

LAKE HURON.

This magnificent sheet of water, next to Lake Superior the largest of the great American lakes, is noted for its extensive fisheries and its numerous islands. Including the Georgian Bay, it covers an area of twenty-four thousand square miles. The great Manitoulin, the most important of the islands, is eighty miles in length, with an average breadth of twenty miles. The area is about sixteen hundred square miles. The other islands number several thousands, varying in size from a few square feet to many acres. Lake Simcoe is drained into the Georgian Bay by the River Severn, and Lake Nipissing by the French river. Lake Huron flows into Lake St. Clair by the St. Clair river. Height above the sea, 578 feet; mean depth, 300.

LAKE ST. CLAIR is, in its widest part, about twenty-six miles across, and in length, from the head of the Detroit to the entrance of the St. Clair river it is about twenty-five miles. There are several islands in the northern part. The principal, belonging to Canada, are Walpole and St. Anne's; the islands west of Walpole

belong to the Americans. The Thames, St. Clair and Sydenham rivers flow into Lake St. Clair. Area, 320 square miles. Height above the sea, 570 feet.

LAKE ERIE.—The most southerly and the shallowest of the Canadian lakes, in length 231 miles, and in its broadest part about 70. It receives the waters of the upper lake from the Detroit river, and discharges them by the Niagara. There are several small islands near the western extremity of the lakes, the principal being Point Pele Island. Area 10,000 square miles; height above the sea, 565 feet; mean depth, 200 feet.

RIVER THAMES.

The Thames is one of the principal rivers in Western Canada. The north or principal branch rises in the "great swamp," in the County of Perth, which is also the source of the Maitland, Saugeen, Bayfield, and Grand rivers. At London it is joined by the east branch, which takes its rise in the Township of Easthope, and passing through the County of Kent enters Lake St. Clair. It joined by several streams in its course.

The Thames affords excellent fishing at and above Delaware; and during the spring, whitefish, pike, pickerel, maskinonge, and occasionally sturgeon, are taken.

This river is navigable for steamboats and schooners to Louisville, a distance of nearly thirty miles from its mouth, its average depth at this point being 16 feet, and its breadth from 200 to 300 foot

Some twenty years back the craft on the Thames differed somewhat from those of the present day. About that time the steamer Brothers, owned by W. & W. Eberts, (Walter Ebert, captain,) kept up the line between Chatham, Detroit and Windsor. She was built in Chatham, and taken off the line in 1857. The Ploughboy built for this line replaced the Brothers; she was a fast boat, low pressure, side wheel, and owned by the same parties. After a few years the same owners put on the Canadian; after which the Islander, owned by Steinhoff & Lapalme, took up the line. The steamer Swan, an American boat, ran opposition to the Islander for about two years, when both were taken off. The Heather Belle, an American boat, owned by John Stewart, Detroit, then monopolized the line until 1868, when the Dominion was put on the route, owned by Steinhoff & Black, (J. W. Steinhoff, captain,) which ran without opposition and with marked success. There

was then quite as much freight in and out as at present, though the travel has increased over fifty per cent.

Capt. Steinhoff, seeing the necessity of a first-class passenger boat, conceived the idea of the present splendid screw-boat, already so far known, the *J. W. Steinhoff*; he owning the one-half and Messrs. Winters & Rogers the other.

The Steinhoff was built at Wallaceburgh, by Jenkins & Roulard, from designs by the present Captain J. W. Steinhoff, and put on the route as a day-boat this present summer, making her trial trip 20th May, 1874. Length, 133 ft., breadth, 29 ft., double engines 18" bore, 18" stroke; 2 boilers 6 ft. shell 12 ft. 3 in.; return tubes 95 in each boiler. She is fitted in first-class style; cabins, saloons, dining-saloon, &c.; makes the run from Chatham to Detroit, 58 miles in about 4 hours.

The line is now kept up by the *Steinhoff* and *Dominion*, the latter being a night boat, and carrying freight as well as passengers. A trip on the *Steinhoff* will well repay pleasure-seekers.

St. Clair.—This river unites Lakes Huron and St. Clair, and including its windings, it is about thirty miles long, and from three-fourths of a mile to a mile and a half wide. The banks of the upper portion are high; those of the lower portion are flat, and in some parts marshy. There are several beautiful farms on the banks, and the villages of Corunna, Froomfield, Mooretown, and the town of Sarnia are situated on its border.

BEAR CREEK, OR THE RIVER SYDENHAM, is divided into two branches. The east, or principal branch, rises in the Township of Lobo, runs through the south-east of Adelaide, the north-west of Mosa, enters Zone near its north-east corner, and leaves it near the south-west corner, running nearly due west through Dawn and Sombra. The north branch rises in the Township of Warwick, and runs south-west across Enniskillen to about the centre of Sombra, and turning south reaches the east branch at the "Forks," about nine miles from the River St. Clair into which it empties through the Chenal Ecarte. Both branches, are navigable for large vessels, the east about nine miles, and the north about five miles above the "Forks."

DETROIT RIVER receives the waters of the upper lakes and discharges them into Lake Erie. It is about twenty-three miles long, and varies from one to two miles in width. The principal islands are Bois Blanc, Fighting, and Peach Islands. Large quantities of fish are taken in this river, and the abundance of wild ducks which frequent the islands, marshes and parts of the coast, make this a

favorite resort for sportsmen. The scenery on the banks of the Detroit is very beautiful.

KENT.

Kent.—This County is bounded north by Lambton; east by Elgin and Lake St. Clair, and south by Lake Erie. It contains eleven municipalities: the Town of Chatham, the Townships of Camden, Chatham, Dover, Harwich, Howard, Orford, Raleigh, Romney, Tilbury East and Zone.

The County of Kent is a fine agricultural district, being composed of a fruitful soil, and is surpassed by few. The major part of the land is composed of an alluvial soil, covered with a thick deposit of vegetable matter, the accumulation of ages. In passing through the County you want no other evidence of the quality of the land, than the abundance of fine large thrifty timber that is met with in all parts. It is heavy land to clear in consequence, but when once fitted for cultivation, it well repays the labour, which is evidenced by the many well-to-do farmers in the County. The principal growths of timber are oak, walnut, white wood or poplar, hickory, water elm, bass wood, white and black ash, beech and maple. Of course large quantities of the more valuable timber have been cut down, but there is still a considerable trade in sawn lumber, staves and square timber. There is likewise a good trade with Michigan in cordwood.

The advantages possessed by this County for moving off its products to market are great, as the River Thames passes through the heart of the district, giving an outlet by water to all parts of the world, and as a consequence a large business is done with Detroit and other places adjacent. On the northern side of the County the River Sydenham runs, affording another outlet by water, and on the south lies Lake Erie. In addition to this the Great Western and Canada Southern Railways pass across the County, leaving nothing to be desired in the way of communication with the outside world. As there are telegraph offices in Chatham, and all the principal towns and villages in the County, intelligence from every part of the world can be obtained as early as in any place not on the seaboard.

The principal farm products of this County are wheat, barley, oats, corn, potatoes, and likewise buckwheat. The product of fruit is increasing. Apples of fine quality are grown here. Peaches are also grown to some extent, and great quantities of the smaller

fruits. Grapes are grown to perfection in this County The Erie View Vineyard, at Buckhorn, covering some fifty acres, produces some fine specimens. Fine samples of butter are produced. Cheese likewise is receiving the attention of some of the farmers, with every prospect of success, as it is the opinion of parties well able to judge that a considerable portion of the land is well adapted for dairy purposes. A considerable trade has hitherto been done with the States in cattle and sheep, as the grazing lands of the County are well adapted for raising all kinds of stock.

The climate is milder than the eastern part of Canada, and the north-eastern or north-western part of the United States; and as the land is gradually cleared up and drained, its salubrity is im-

proved.

As this work is chiefly designed as a record of statistical and general information, we deem it superfluous to enter at any length into a history of Kent, although many interesting events have transpired within its limits. Here, on the 5th of October, 1813, was fought the battle between the British and Indian forces under General Proctor, and the celebrated Indian Chief, Tecumseth, and the American army under General Harrison. Its early settlement, and the efforts made to civilize and Christianize the Indians who settled in this section, as early as 1729; also the perseverance and energy of its first settlers, along with the march of improvement, affords ample material to render an historic sketch, both interesting and instructive. An impetus was given to the progress of the County on the completion of the Great Western Railway, which, along with the roads that intersect the County in every direction, opened communication with the County town, and afforded a cheap and expeditious means of transporting the industrial and agricultural productions of the County, and enhanced the value of property to a great extent. At the commencement of the settlement of the County, lots of 200 acres, situated on the banks of the Thames, were sold for \$100; in 1804, they sold for \$500. Since that time, the price of property has been rapidly increasing. The development of the rich agricultural resources of the County was the means of starting many now thriving villages, which contain their share of manufacturers, merchants, mechanics, &c. A description of the Town of Chatham and the Villages of the County will be found in other parts of this work.

CHATHAM.

The County Town of Kent is pleasantly, and in a commercial sense, advantageously situated on the River Thames, at the entrance of McGregor's Creek, and about eighteen miles eastward from where the river debouches into Lake St. Clair. The Thames is navigable to Chatham for the largest class of sailing craft, and several of the finest vessels on the inland waters have been built here. (See River Thames.)

The town was originally laid out by Governor Simcoe, who, on view of the great natural advantages, reserved six hundred acres for a town plot, but the actual settlement dates from about the year 1832, since which time it has steadily progressed, and now contains about nine thousand inhabitants.

Messrs. McCrae, Daniel Forsyth, and Mrs. Larke, were among the first settlers.

In 1855 the area of the town was augmented by the addition of lots one and two, second concession of the Township of Chatham; lot twenty-three, first concession, and lot twenty-four, second concession, of Raleigh, and lot twenty-four of Dover east. The principal port of the town is on the south side of the river.

Situated in the midst of a fine agricultural country, and possessing excellent facilities for transportation, Chatham is one of the best markets in Western Canada. Large quantities of farm produce of every description, staves, and square timber, are exported.

Chatham possesses several elegant private residences, and the public buildings are creditable. The Court House and Jail, erected at a cost of \$25,000, is a handsome building, constructed of white limestone from the Anderson quarries. The numerous churches, the Market House, erected in 1856, at a cost of \$6,000; Robert's block, which cost \$8,000; the post office block; the Rankin House; the Music Hall; the Garner House, and the numerous mercantile houses, are all handsome and substantial buildings. - the churches of Chatham are numerous and handsome struc-

Chatham boasts the possession of two newspapers, the "Planet," one of the oldest established periodicals in the west, Rufus Stephenson, editor and proprietor; and the "Banner," J. R. Gemmill, jr., editor.

BOTHWELL.

A town in the Township of Zone, on the line of the Great Western Railway; distant from Chatham 26 miles, from London 40 miles, and from Windsor 70 miles. It was laid out in 1855, but its settlement dates from 1858, at which time it contained one store and two saw mills. The Hon. George Brown was the original proprietor of the site, which was disposed of in 1856. The Bothwell Land and Petroleum Company, or "Scotch Company," purchased 5,250 acres lying round and in the town. This purchase gave the first great impetus to oil operations in this section. The company is under the management of A. R. Pratt, Esq.

Bothwell was incorporated as a town by special Act of Parliament in 1865. Population in 1866 reached nearly 6,500.

The town of Bothwell is indebted to its apparently inexhaustible mineral wealth for its prosperity. On the first discovery of oil the lands in the immediate vicinity were eagerly purchased by American and other speculators, at high prices, and derricks and steam engines soon dotted the banks of the Thames. In another part of the work we will notice the "oil fields" of Ontario.

The decline in price of oil in the U.S. to a mere nominal figure (at one time being as low as 10cts, per barrel) soon ruined the prospects of the speculators and operators here, then the great fire of March, 1867, which destroyed all the fine substantial buildings erected during the excitement, cast a deep gloom over the (only a few weeks before) most lively busy spot for its size in America.

The great majority of the settlers having lost heavily, now became discouraged, and left by hundreds to seek their fortunes elsewhere, reducing the population to about 1,000 in 1868.

Bothwell, like Chicago, rose again like the Phœnix from its ashes, and to-day compares favorably with the most flourishing towns in Ontario.

It is steadily improving, a number of good brick stores and dwellings are in course of erection; the new Town Hall, a fine structure of white brick, also two new brick churches, have just been completed. The merchants and manufacturers are shrewd and enterprising, and there is every reason to believe that every inch Bothwell gains henceforth she will retain.

A reference to the subjoined list of names will give a sufficient idea of the mechanical and professional prosperity of the town.

DAWN MILLS.

A post village on the Sydenham River, on lot 3,7th and 8th concessions, of the Gore of Camden, distant from Chatham 16 miles. The village was laid out in 1863 by the late William Taylor, Esq. James Boyle and Capt. Taylor were among the first settlers. The third Division Court is held here. It contains two churches, Episcopalian and Wesleyan Methodist. Mr. John Dobbyn, the well-known and enterprising mill owner, having sold his saw and grist mills at "Dobbyns" for a handsome sum, is now engaged in building an extensive grist, saw and shingle mill here to be known as the Dawn Mills. The mill will be run by water power of which there is an abundant supply winter and summer.

There are three hotels here; "The Union Hotel" kept by Richard Tiffin, being the favourite. Mails daily. Population about 200.

DRESDEN.

One of the largest and most thriving villages in Ontario, situated on the east branch of the River Sydenham and the head of navigation. Timber, lumber, cordwood and staves, and country produce afford the principal trade.

The village was laid out about 30 years ago, and within the last few years has made most rapid and permanent progress. There were two large steamers built here, and another intended for the Dresden and Sarnia route is now on the stocks. There are two lines of steamers running from here, one to Detroit and Windsor, and one to Sarnia.

A splendid brick Town Hall and Market is in course of erection, at a cost of about \$10,000. There are also a large number of superb private dwellings and stores going up. There are already some very fine stores completed in the village, among which the "Union Block" and the "Beaver Hall Block" are particularly deserving of notice.

The Erie and Huron Railway has been surveyed, and will in all probability be constructed immediately. It will run direct through the village, and afford direct communication with Lakes Erie and Huron, cutting the Great Western and Canada Southern roads on both the north and south.

This road, taken in connection with the excellent navigation, will give every facility for connection with the best markets, and as Dresden is the NATURAL market for the whole of the Sydenham
