### PREFACE.

In presenting the "Gazetteer and Directory of the Counties of Haldimand and Brant" to the public, the compilers wish to state that their object, which they hope they have attained, is to provide a work which will prove not only useful, but interesting, and that every exertion in their power has been made to render it full, complete and reliable; and though, from the variety of sources from which the necessary information was obtained, and the impossibility of avoiding all mistakes in a work of this nature, inaccuracies will be found, particularly in the orthography of proper names, the publishers trust that as few errors will be discovered in this work as in any of a similar character, and that it will deserve the approbation of its Patrons.

We deem it our duty to return our sincere thanks to those who have so liberally aided the undertaking, by providing us with valuable information, as well as in a pecuniary sense. We are particularly indebted to the editors of the several papers in the Counties.

## COUNTIES OF HALDIMAND AND BRANT.

HALDIMAND is bounded north by Brant and Wentworth; east by Lincoln and Welland; west by Norfolk, and south by Lake Erie. It contains twelve municipalities: the townships of Canboro, Cayuga North, Cayuga South, Dunn, Moulton and Sherbrooke, Oneida, Rainham, Seneca and Walpole; and the villages of Cayuga, Caledonia and Dunnville. Oneida and Seneca formerly belonged to the Gore District, and Rainham and Walpole to the Talbot District. The remaining townships formed a part of the Niagara District.

THE COUNTY OF BRANT is bounded north by Waterloo; east by Wentworth and Haldimand; south by Haldimand and Norfolk, and west by Oxford. It contains eight municipalities; the townships of Brantford, Burford, Oakland, Onondaga, South Dumfries and Tuscarora, and the towns of Brantford and Paris.

At the termination of the war of Independence, the Six Nations Indians of the Mohawk Valley, (a branch of the Great Huron Iroquois confederacy), the firm allies of the English Crown from the earliest colonial times, became apprehensive that consequences injurious to their interests might result from their hunting grounds being within the territory of the United States, and deputed their Chief, Captain Jos. Brant, Tyendenaga, to represent their fears to General, afterwards Sir Frederick Haldimand, then Governor of the Province of Quebec. Their claims upon the Government were acknowledged, and by a proclamation dated October 25th, 1784, it was declared "That they and their posterity should be allowed to possess and enjoy a tract of land six miles in depth, on each side of the Grand River, running into Lake Erie, being part of a large tract lately purchased by Government from the Chippewa Indians." This grant was confirmed, and its conditions defined by a patent under the Great Seal, issued by Lieut. Governor Simcoe, and bearing date January 14th, 1793. The original extent of the tract was 694,910 acres, but the greater portion has been since surrendered to the crown, in trust, to be sold for the benefit of the tribes. The following is a list of the principal surrenders:

January 15th and February 6th, 1798—The land now forming the townships of Dumiries, Waterloo, Woolwich, and Nichol, extending downwards on both sides of the river from the northern extremity of the reserve; and the greater part of Canboro and Moulton on the eastern side of the entrance of the Grand River, 352,707 acres.

April 19th, 1830 .- The site of the town of Brantford, 807 acres.

April 19th, 1831 .-- A part of the township of Cayuga, 20,670 acres.

February 8th, 1834.—The residue of Cayuga, the township of Dunn, and a part of Canboro and Moulton, 50,212 acres.

March 26th, 1835 .- A confirmation of the preceeding surrenders.

January 18th, 1841.—The residue of the land, with the exception of a reserve of 20,000 acres, and the lands actually in the occupation of Indians, amounting to upwards of 220,000 acres.

Of the earlier surrenders, the greater portion has been sold, and the proceeds invested either in consols in England, or in the Grand River Navigation Stock.

In reference to the first surrender, the schedule specifies the following tracts:

These transfers were subsequently the cause of great annoyance and perplexity. The views of the Indians were expressed in an address made by them to the Superintendent-General of Indian Affairs, dated April 18th, 1811, in which the following sentences occur:

"We thought when the Servant of our Father (Governor Haldimand) gave us, in his name, the lands on the Grand River, that we should be secure, and, without interruption, enjoy it as our own. In this we have been most egregiously deceived, and to our great surprise and grief we find ourselves, by the contrivance of artful, faithless and wicked men, stript of our property. What little is yet left us we are denied the lawful right of controlling or disposing of without our master's leave."

The townships comprising the counties of Haldimand and Brant, with the exceptions of Rainham and Walpole in the former, and Burford and Oakland in the latter, were comprised in the original Indian reserve.

The soil of these counties is diversified, consisting in places of high table land, the foundation of which consists of limestone and freestone; water lime and gypsum are also found in considerable quantities in the townships of Cayuga, Oneida, and Seneca. The land is generally rolling, of excellent quality, consisting of a mixture of clay and loam, in those portions timbered with hardwood, and of light sandy soil where the wood consists of pine. In some parts, especially in Brantford and Burford, there are extensive oak plains, easily cleared, and capable of producing excellent crops.

The counties are watered by the Grand River, which enters Lake Erie between the townships of Dunn and Sherbrooke; the Chippewa or Welland, and Canning rivers, and their tributaries, and several smaller streams.

The Great Western and The Buffalo and Lake Huron Railways pass through Brant, intersecting at Paris, and the latter through Haldimand.

THE SIX NATIONS embraced the following cantons or tribes: Mohawks, Oneidas, Senecas, Cayugas, Onondagas, and Tuscaroras. The latter being adopted into the confederacy subsequent to its first establishment. The Five nations were called Iroquois, from the Indian approbatory exclamations "Yoe! Haugh!" by the French. The origin of the Iroquois is very obscure. Their own tradition is that they originally descended the river Ottawa and resided as a small tribe at Hochelega, (Montreal) subject to the Adirondacks (bark eaters) or Algonquins, from whom they learned the arts of war and husbandry. In an attempt to gain their independence they were defeated and compelled to leave the country. They ascended the St. Lawrence, coasted the southern shores of Lake Ontario and entering the Oswego river, scattered themselves in separate bands throughout the present State of New York, but subsequently at the desire of the Onondagas, for mutual protection, they formed a league under the title of Ho-deno-san-nee, or "People of the Long House," their territory extended from the river Hudson to the great lakes of Canada. The Mohawks guarded the eastern boundary, and the Senecas the western. This league suggested the union of the thirteen colonies in the Revolutionary war. The confederacy was formed about the year 1540, and was successfully maintained for upwards of 200 years, indeed it has never been formally dissolved. The Tuscaroras were admitted in 1712. In 1723 the Ne-ca-ri-a-ges a remnant of the Hurons at Mich-il-i-mac-inac (the "Great Turtle" abbreviated to Mackinaw) was nominally admitted. By the Algonquins the Indians of this celebrated league were known as the Mingoes, and by the Hurons and Ojibwas as Noda-was or "Adder Enemy." In their protracted wars they extirpated the Eries, utterly destroyed the power of the Hurons, defeated the Adirondacks and Utawas, and thus placed Canada under their sway.

In 1640-1670, they drove the An-das-tes and At-ti-ouan-di-rous, or "Neutral Nation," and the Petuns from the Niagara Peninsula and the Lakes; and after their conquest of Canada, established colonies along the northern shores of Lake Ontario. In 1740 they reached the zenith, and after the close of the American Revolution their power began gradually to decline. They afterwards removed to Canada and settled at Brantford, Tyindenaga, on the Bay of Quinte, and on the River Thames.

The Company for the Propagation of the Gospel in New England and the parts adjacent in America, commonly called the New England Company, was constituted in the year 1649, the Hon. Robert Boyle, the first Governor, bequeathed the corporation a handsome annuity and several subsequent bequests and grants enabled the Society to support various missionary establishments in New England in the seventeenth century. Their operations were, for a time, interrupted by the Revolutionary war, and have since been carried to Canada and New Brunswick, where, in addition to schools and other establishments for the education of the Indians, they have contributed largely to the erection of churches, payment of teachers, &c. In the year 1702 this Society sent missionaries to the Mohawks in the neighbourhood of the English settlements. In 1714 the Liturgy of the Church of England was translated into the Mohawk, and a few years after the whole "Common Prayer" was also translated.

The Mohawk Church, one and a half miles from Brantford, is an object of interest, not only from the evidence it gives of the educational and religious status of the Indians at the time of its erection, but also from the fact of its being the first English church built in Canada West, that at Niagara being the next. We are happy to state that measures are being taken for its restoration and preservation. The Indians have in their possession a communion service of silver, the gift of Queen Anne. The church bell was also supposed to have been a gift from Her Majesty, but it was found to have been made by "John Warner, Fleet Street, London, 1786," and was doubtless procured by Joseph Brant, at the time of his visit to England, in the same year.

The Mohawk Institute, erected 1857, at a cost of \$4000, about one mile from Brantford, is a handsome and commodious three-story brick building, pleasantly situated near the Grand river and in the old Mohawk village, now deserted. In this establishment about eighty pupils, male and female receive their board, clothing, and education in English branches. The building is well suited for the purpose—the dormitories dining and school rooms are spacious, well lighted and well ventilated. The proficiency of the pupils reflects great credit on the teachers, Mr. Thomas Griffith and Miss Ruth Hartley. The

establishment is supported by the New England Company. Mr. and Mrs. W. Bauslaugh are caretakers of the premises.

A large majority of the Indians on the Grand River are Christians, and the greater part belong to the Church of England; there are a few Methodists and Baptists. A considerable number, however, of the Cayugas, and a few Senecas and Onondagas, are still Pagans.

The Grand River Indians, including also a few Delawares, Muntures, Tutulies, Nanticokes, and a considerable body of Massassaugas (Credit Indians), are under the superintendence of an officer of the Indian Department, residing at Brantford; they receive medical aid and annual payments from the fund of the tribes. In 1843 they numbered 2,223 individuals, forming about 500 families, and probably at present (1867) they amount to upwards of 3000.

Joseph Brant (Thayendanega), a Mohawk of pure blood, was born on the banks of the Ohio, in 1742. He is said to have been a grandson of one of the five Sachems or Chiefs who visited England in 1710, during the reign of Queen Anne. In the Revolutionary war he took sides with the British, and as a prominent chief of the Iroquois, he influenced several Cantons of that celebrated league to join the British standard. During the war he was chiefly engaged on the border settlements of New York and Pennsylvania in conjunction with Sir William Johnson and Colonel Butler. He received a good education at Lebanon, Connecticut, and during the war held a Colonel's Commission from the King.

Brant was a warrior from his boyhood, being only thirteen years of age when he fought his first battle. In 1765 he married the daughter of an Oneida Chief, and settled near Canajoharie.

The town of Brantford, the county of Brant, and the township of Thayendanega, on the Bay of Quinte, where a number of the Mohawks had settled, were named after him. He translated the Gospel of St. Mark into the Mohawk language; and in many ways exerted himself to promote the temporal and spiritual welfare of his people. He was greatly respected and beloved by them and the English. In 1783, he visited England, and died near Wellington Square, Canada, on the 24th November, 1807, aged 65 years. His remains were removed to the Mohawk village, and interred by the side of the church which he had erected there. He was a noble specimen of a Christian Indian, and humane as he was brave.

His son John led the Mohawks at the battle of Queenston, October, 1812, and, in 1827, was appointed by the Earl of Dalhousie to the rank of Captain and Superintendent of the Six Nations. He died in 1832.

The Slab erected to the memory of Brant, bears the following inscription:-

This Tomb
Is erected to the Memory of
THAYENDANEGA, OR
CAPT. JOSEPH BRANT,
Principal Chief and
Warrior of
The Six Nations Indians,
By his Fellow Subjects,
Admirers of his Fidelity and
Attachment to the
British Crown,
Born on the Banks of the
Ohio River, 1742, died at
Wellington Square, U. C., 1807.

It also contains the remains of his Son, AHYOUWAIGHS, or CAPT. JOSEPH BRANT,
Who succeeded his father as TEKARIHOGEA, and distinguished himself in The War of 1812-15.

Born at the Mohawk village, U. C., 1794.
Died at the same place, 1832.
Erected, 1850.

The Grand River or Ouse takes it rise in the township of Amaranth, about fifty miles above Fergus and passing through the Counties of Wellington, Waterloo, Brant, and Haldimand, enters Lake Erie at Port Maitland. The Grand River is navigable for large vessels as far as Dunnville where the feeder of the Welland Canal enters it, and for smaller craft to within a short distance of Brantford, sixty miles above Dunnville, where a canal three miles in length, with three locks, has been constructed to enable vessels to reach the town. The damming of the river to supply the Welland Canal, has caused it to overflow much of the land near its mouth. Its principal tributaries are the Canestoga, Speed, and Irvine.

The towns and villages of Dunnville, Cayuga, York, Caledonia, Brantford, Paris, Galt, Preston, Elora and Fergus, are on the river. (See page 107.)

THE WELLAND CANAL connects Lakes Erie and Ontario, and thus overcomes the Falls of Niagara. Its length is twenty-eight miles.

It has twenty-nine locks, and surmounts 334 feet. This important work was projected in 1818 by the Hon. W. H. Merritt, commenced in 1824, and completed in 1829. The original design of connecting the lakes through the Welland and Niagara Rivers having failed, the Grand River was adopted as the feeder, and the difficulties of the descent were overcome by numerous locks. The Grand River feeder is about twenty-two miles in length. There are two entrances to the canal on Lake Erie—Ports Maitland and Colborne, and one on Lake Ontario—Port Dalhousie. This work cost nearly seven millions of dollars.
