This township is bounded north by Blenheim; east by Brantford and Oakland; west by Oxford and Norwich, and south by Windham. The land is generally rolling, and the soil a sandy loam. The north of the township consists principally of oak plains. It is well watered by several small streams.

The settlement of Burford commenced in the year 1793, when wild land sold at five shillings per acre, and the first conveyance of land was made to George Forsythe and John Symington in 1798. In 1817 the population numbered 550; in 1841, about 2,000, and in 1852 the number had increased to 4,133. In 1866 the total of real estate was valued at \$1,333,052, and the number of acres assessed was 66,654.

TOWNSHIP OF SOUTH DUMFRIES.

This township was originally united with North Dumfries, which forms part of the County Waterloo. Dumfries, north and south, was settled in 1816, by the Hon. William Dickson. In 1817, the settlers numbered thirty-eight, making with their families a population of one hundred and sixty-three, of all ages. There were in that year two hundred and forty-five acres cleared, and the business of the township, apart from agriculture, consisted of one saw mill and one store.

South Dumfries is bounded north by North Dumfries, Co. Waterloo; east by Beverly; west by Blenheim; and south by Brantford. The Great Western and Grand Trunk Railways pass through it, and there are two good roads from Paris to Ayr, and from Paris to St. George. It is well watered by the Grand River, and is one of the best townships in the Province. Large quantities of gypsum, invaluable for its fertilizing qualities, are found in beds on the bank of the river in the vicinity of Paris.

CALEDONIA.

A flourishing incorporated village and station of the Buffalo and Lake Huron Railroad, on the banks of the Grand River, principally situated in the township of Seneca, a small portion on the opposite side of the river being in Oneida. A swing bridge, erected in 1843, subsequently destroyed by ice and reconstructed in 1865, joins the two portions of the village: the bridge is about 750 feet in length.

That part of the village in Oneida was laid out as a village by the Grand River Navigation Company in 1835—the plot contained sixteen acres and the village was named Oneida. In the year following the same company laid out another village plot on the opposite side of the river, about a mile below Oneida, which was called Seneca. In 1843 the government laid out a village plot under the name of Caledonia, which also included the village of Seneca. The village was incorporated in 1852, Ranald McKinnon first reeve. The post office was established in 1842, James Little, P. M. Among the first settlers of Caledonia were Thomas Bryant, Ranald McKinnon, James Little, John Jackson, Jacob Turner, G. & J. Bingham and Wm. McKenzie. The first general store was opened in 1842 by Ranald McKinnon, and the school in the following year.

At present Caledonia contains five churches. Episcopal, Rev. Mr. Hill; Presbyterian, Rev. James Black; Canada Presbyterian, Rev. Dr. Wilson; Methodist New Connexion, Rev. Mr. Pearson; and Roman Catholic, Rev. John McNulty. The last named is built of brick, the others are of frame. The manufacturing establishments are three flour mills, two woollen mills, two saw mills, a cabinet factory and several mechanics' shops.

The town hall, a commodious and handsome building, was erected about ten years ago.

CALEDONIA FLOUR MILLS.—R. McKinnon, built 1863, frame, stone foundations; water power, four run of stones; employs 8 hands; capacity upwards of 60,000 barrels per annum. The main building is 60×45 feet, the storehouse 50×30.

CALEDONIA WOOLLEN MILLS.—R. McKinnon, brick; water power; main building, 100×50 feet; employs about 40 hands manufacturing cloths, tweeds, blankets, flannels, &c.

BALMORAL FLOUR MILLS.—Wm. Hicks; water power; three run of stones.

SENECA WOOLLEN MILLS.—Thos. Lees. This establishment occupies the site of a similar factory erected in 1834 and destroyed by fire. Water power; four power looms; employs five hands.

SENECA FLOUR MILLS.—Wm. Tait, lessee. Water power; four run of stones; employs three hands. Capacity 60 barrels a day.

VICTORIA FOUNDRY.—Christopher Young; steam, engine 14 horse power; employs six hands, manufacturing agricultural implements, stoves, &c. A large blacksmith shop is attached. The proprietor is also extensively engaged in the manufacture of tin, copper and sheet iron ware.

CALEDONIA FOUNDRY.—Scott & Co.; steam, 16 horse power; employs from 20 to 30 hands.

CALEDONIA CABINET FACTORY.—John Builder; steam, 12 horse power; averages 10 hands.

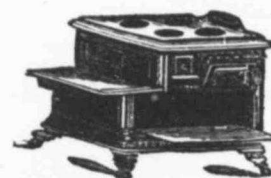

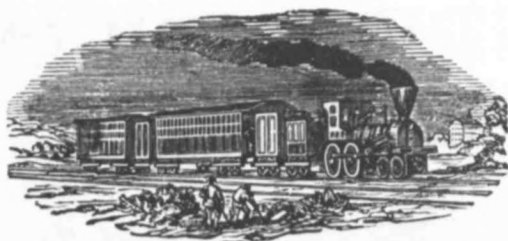

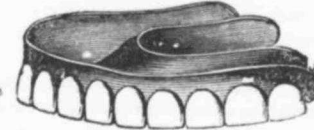

INDIANA.

(FORMERLY GRAND RIVER RAPIDS.)

A post village pleasantly situated on the Grand River, township of Seneca, three miles from Cayuga, eight from Caledonia, and sixty-two from Toronto. It contains two Churches—Presbyterian, Rev. A. Grant, and Roman Catholic, Rev. J. McNulty; a flouring mill, distillery, woollen mill, saw mill and pail factory, brick and tile yard, two general stores, two groceries, three taverns, and two blacksmith shops. A bridge spans the river here of 500 feet in length, built by the Indiana bridge company.

To render the Grand River navigable and to overcome the falls, eight locks were necessary. The first of these in ascending the river is at Indiana, where there is a fall of twelve feet; the next at York, with a fall of five feet nine inches; Sim's lock, or number three, is about one a half miles from York, with eight and a half feet fall; the next at Seneca, with five feet nine inches fall; the next at Caledonia, with a fall of seven and a half feet; from thence there is a level water or slack water navigation for twenty-five miles, that is to within two miles and three quarters of Brantford, where there are three locks, each having a fall of eleven feet.

Among the early settlers of Indiana were Joseph Young, David Thompson, W. Fell, Daniel McKenna, John Darling, Aaron Helmer, and Robert Wilson. The Post Office was established in 1837.

BRANTFORD.

Brantford, the County Town of Brant, is beautifully situated on a high gravelly ridge, skirting the north bank of the Grand River, at the head of navigation, and on the Buffalo and Lake Huron Railway. Its name is derived from the celebrated Mohawk chief Brant. The site of the town, consisting of eight hundred and seven acres, was surrendered by the Indians to the Crown on the 19th April, 1830, and was surveyed the same year by Lewis Burwell, Esq., and immediately after lots were sold at an upset price of ten pounds. As early as 1824 there were a few settlers on the site of the town; stores were kept by Messrs. Wilkes, Douglas, and Gage; shoe shops by W. D. Dutton and A. Huntington. Messrs. Page and Lewis built the first grist and saw mills. The Grand River Navigation Canal, commenced in 1840, added materially to the early prosperity of the town. The capital stock of the company was £50,000, the greater part of which was held by the Indians. The object of the canal was to remove the obstruction to navigation by the falls on the Grand River below the town; its length is about three miles, and it is capable of admitting vessels of three and a half feet draught to reach the town.

In a commercial point of view, few towns in Canada possess greater advantages than Brantford. Situate in the centre of one of the wealthiest and finest agricultural districts in the Dominion, possessing first class manufacturing facilities, and having direct water and railway communication with all parts of the country and of the United States; It is rapidly increasing in wealth and prosperity, and must, at no distant day, become one of the most important towns in Canada.

The public buildings are numerous and elegant, the principal are the Court House, a handsome brick structure erected in 1842 at a cost of \$32,000; the Registry office, Market house, Banks, Churches, Schools, &c. Ker's Music Hall is a fine building; it contains a stage, a gallery, dressing rooms, &c., is well lighted and ventilated, and is capable of seating eight hundred and fifty persons. There are also numerous elegant private residences.

The Victoria Square, in the centre of the town, is beautifully laid out, and planted with ornamental trees and shrubbery. The population of Brantford (1867), inclusive of the military, is 8,029. The total value and amount of real and personal property and income is \$1,944,610.

BRANTFORD ENGINE WORKS—Dalhousie street, estsblished 1844, C. H. Waterous & Co., steam, employ about 40 hands; steam engines, grist and saw mills, shingles, lath and stave machines, chopping mills, &c.
