BLENHEIM

(Rond Eau P. O.)

Is an incorporated village of about 1,600 inhabitants, in the township of Harwich, 12 miles south-east of Chatham, 5 miles from Charing Cross on the C. S. Ry. its nearest railway station at present, and five miles from the Rond Eau Harbor. It is pleasantly situated, 130 feet above the level of Lake Erie, and will be an important station on the line of the Erie and Huron Railway, now in course of construction.

An extensive Lumber and Manufacturing interest is centered here, including Bending works, Handle factories, Saw Mills,

Sash, Door and Blind factories, and an Agricultural Implement Manufactory. It is surrounded by a fine agricultural country, and large quantities of the finest wheat are annually exported by way of the lakes. There are six churches, one of the best school houses in the county, a bank and a weekly newspaper.

The Montreal Telegraph Co. has an office here and the Dominion Co. will shortly extend its line to this place. Daily stages to Chatham, Charing Cross and Morpeth.

BOTHWELL

Is an incorporated Town, in the township of Zone, in the extreme northeast corner of the county, on the line of the Great Western Railway, 23 miles from Chatham. The place was first started about the year 1858, and Bothwell probably owes its existence to the discovery of oil in the vicinity about that time. It was for some years thereafter the seat of quite an extensive oil business, and grew rapidly. In the year 1867 a disastrous conflagration destroyed the greater portion of the town, and this, together with the general depression of the oil business, gave the place a serious set back. It is surrounded by a good farming county, from which it derives a profitable trade and is increasing steadily, if not rapidly, in population and business, and bids fair to regain eventually its old time prosperity. It has a flour mill, a saw mill, a planing mill, a hub and spoke factory, a bank, three

hotels, a weekly newspaper, churches of the leading denominations and good educational facilities, and exports principally grain and live stock. The Dominion and Montreal Telegraph Companies and the American Express Company maintain offices here. Population about 1,200.

CHATHAM,

The county seat of Kent, is situated a little west of the exact center of the county at the junction of the four townships of Chatham, Dover, Raleigh and Harwich. It is on both sides of the river Thames, 18 miles above its mouth, 60 miles southwest of London and 46 east of Detroit, Mich. The first settlement of the place dates back to the year 1830 or thereabouts, and Chatham was fixed upon as the county seat of Kent, which up to the year 1847 formed a part of Essex. Railway communication was established about that time by the opening of the Great Western Railway. When the Canada Southern Railway was completed some six years ago an effort was made to build a branch road from this place to Charing Cross, on that line, which is only seven miles south. Although a large bonus was voted and the project was decidedly popular, yet the measure was by some influence defeated, and the result was that a portion of the trade from the southern part of the county was diverted to other points. This, however, will be remedied by the completion of the Erie & Huron Railway, now in an advanced state of construction, which will give the Town direct communication by rail with the north and south parts of the county, and by connecting with the Canada Southern will give the place all the advantages to be derived from a competing line east and west.

Chatham is surrounded by a fine agricultural country, and is one of the largest grain and produce markets in the western portion of Ontario. It is estimated that the shipments of wheat alone from here for the present year will be in excess of one million bushels. Besides this, enormous quantities of flour, barley, malt, beans, eggs and farm produce generally, together with live stock are exported annually. The products of the forest form a considerable portion of the shipments from here, and include hardwood lumber, square and ship timber, railroad ties, staves and stave timber and immense quantities of cord wood, nearly all of which is shipped by water direct, the river being navigable for vessels drawing 10 feet.

Although Chatham is essentially a commercial Town its manufacturing interests are also quite important, and include seven flouring and grist mills, four foundries and machine shops, four planing mills and sash factories, a large saw-mill, a woolen-mill, a boiler works, a plow, pump and stave factory, two breweries, a fanning-mill factory, agricultural implement manufactories, a soap factory, a tannery, about 10 carriage and wagon manufactories, several large brickyards, besides others of minor importance. There are also a grain elevator—70,000 bushels capacity,—two malhuses, one of 100,000 and the other 20,000 bushels capacity, three newspapers, branches of three incorporated banks, besides several private banking firms and about 15 hotels of all grades.

Of Churches there are about a dozen, representing all the different denominations common to this part of the country, some of them being very costly and beautiful edifices. The Public Schools are, including the High School, six in number, and cost to build and equip about \$40,000. They are under the control of the High School Board and the Board of Public School Trustees, furnishing employment to 25 teachers, and have a total average attendance of about eleven hundred. "The Pines" Ursuline Academy is an incorporated institution in charge of the Religious of the Ursuline Institute, built in 1870 at a cost of over \$20,000, and has about 12 acres of ground handsomely laid out. The Catholic Separate School was built in 1874 and cost nearly \$10,000. Both of these institutions are well patronized and are highly successful. The Wilberforce Educational Institute—a school designed for the higher education of the colored race—is ably managed and in a flourishing condition.

Within the past few years Chatham has improved vastly in appearance, and the Main or King street with its many handsome and costly brick business blocks now completed or in course of erection, presents quite a Metropolitan appearance. There are a number of elegant private residences, many of which have spacious grounds artistically adorned with flowers, shrubbery, etc. The town is lighted with gas, King street is paved with cedar blocks, and the streets generally are in good condition, but an adequate sup-

ply of good pure water is yet to be provided. Chatham is now an incorporated Town of nearly 10,000 inhabitants and is a port of entry, has a Customs House and Inland Revenue office.

Daily stages leave here for Dresden, Wallaceburg, Charing Cross, Blenheim and Morpeth, and during the season of navigation a steamer makes daily trips to Windsor and Detroit. The American Express Company and the Dominion and Montreal Telegraph Companies maintain offices here.

CHATHAM STREET DIRECTORY.
