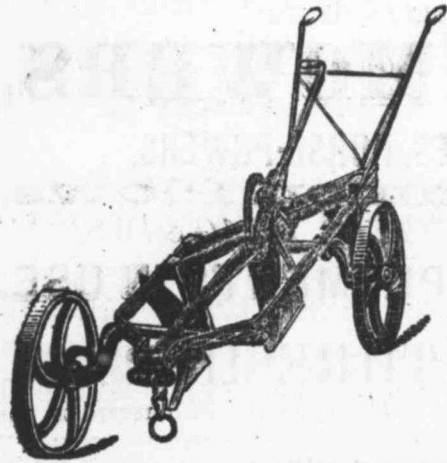

CITY OF GUELPH.

Guelph the County Town of Wellington became a City by Royal Proclamation this present year on the 52nd Anniversary of the cutting of the first tree on its present site. The inaugural ceremonies were never excelled in Canada on any similar occasion, although there are now seven Cities in Ontario alone. Up to the opening of the Grand Trunk Railway its growth was slow, but through the impetus it then received, and afterwards by the Great Western Railway Co. running a branch to the town, which was subsequently continued through the Counties of Wellington, Grey & Bruce to our inland waters, thus making Guelph the most important commercial place North of Toronto. In 1854 it was incorporated a town with 2,000 inhabitants, which had increased to 5,500 in 1867 at the time of Confederation, and in 1879 takes her place among the family of Cities, with a population little short of 11,000, and an assessed value of over three Million of Dollars.
