

CITY OF GUELPH.

Gualph the County Town of Wellington became a City by Royal Proclamation this present year on the 52nd Anniversary of the cutting of the first tree on its present site. The inaugural ceremonies were never excelled in Canada on any similar occasion, although there are now seven Cities in Ontario alone.
