

BRASS AND IRON FOUNDERS.—Messrs. Dalgarno, Parkinson & Co. commenced business in Chatham in 1865. Their buildings, which are frame, measure 120 x 42 feet. A 25 h. p. engine is used, and 30 to 35 hands are engaged in the manufacture of steamboat engines, and saw and grist mill gearing in general. Mr. L. F. Stark is engaged in the manufacture of castings of all kinds, stoves, and agricultural implements. His buildings are of frame, two stories, and consist of a moulding shop, 38 x 24 ft., and a show room, 36 x 24. He employs 5 to 6 hands. Messrs. Jas. Soutar & Co. are extensively engaged in the manufacture of agricultural implements of all kinds.

STEAM SAW MILLS.—Messrs. D. R. Van Allen & Co.'s buildings were established in 1857. They are of frame, and measure 63 x 72 feet. A 75 H. P. engine is employed, and 45 hands are engaged in cutting 50,000,000 feet of lumber annually. Mr. Salem G. Aldis has been established since 1851. His buildings are frame, 100 x 30, where 7 to 8 hands and a 15 H. P. engine are employed. He cuts lumber of all kinds, to the amount of 1,000,000 feet annually.

BREWRIES AND DISTILLERIES.—Mr. Thos. Bennett's buildings are frame, 40 x 24 feet and 1½ stories in height. A twelve H. P. engine is employed, and all kinds of whiskies are manufactured. The brewery of Mr. John Garner was built in 1840. It is a brick building on a stone basement, and measures 62 x 26 feet. A one H. P. engine is employed, and ale and porter are manufactured extensively.

TANNERIES.—Mr. John Smith established his tannery in 1857. It is of brick, 42 x 60 feet, with 42 vats. An engine of 15 horsepower is employed, and six to eight hands are engaged in manufacturing sole, harness, and upper leather, reps, calf and sheep skins. The Kent Tannery of Messrs. Walker and Leith, was established in 1868. It is of brick, two stories in height, and measures 80 x 35 feet. A 10 H. P. engine is employed, and five hands are engaged in the manufacture of sole, harness, upper, kips and calf skins.

BLLENHEIM.

RONDEAU P. O.

An important post village in the Township of Harwich, on the stage road from Chatham to Morpeth, distant from Chatham 12 miles, and 10 miles from Morpeth. The site is very pleasant and healthy, being at an elevation of 150 feet above the lake. Blenheim contains three churches—Episcopal, Presbyterian and Wesleyan Methodist—a good town hall and a brick school house—four hotels and a full representation of mercantile business. The manufacturing establishments exceed that of any other village in the county—among which may be mentioned the woolen and carding mills of Eli Warner, where tweeds, cloths and flannels are manufactured and custom work attended to. Eight hands are employed. The Foundry and Agricultural Implement Manufactory of Hall & Son gives employment to 10 hands, and turns out plows, fanning mills, cultivators, shovel plows, seed drills, &c.,

besides general jobbing. The Dominion mill, where Wm. R. Atkinson manufactures all kinds of straight and turned handles, viz: fork, shovel, hoes and broom handles, &c., sawn and turned, J. K. Morris' Steam Saw Lath and Veneer Mills and Machines; 12 to 15 hands are employed; two thousand feet of lumber sawn annually, six thousand feet of lathing, and three to five million feet of veneering cut daily. This is the place for piano lumber of all kinds. Lewis Kinne is engaged in a large frame building 36 x 50, 2 story high, manufacturing doors, sash and blinds, and planing and matching building material; he employs 8 hands. J. S. Farrell carries on a large business in the manufacture of spade handles only, and employs 6 men; he uses steam power. Thos. Coghlan is extensively engaged in the manufacture of cabinet work of all kinds, upholstering and undertaking; he keeps a good hearse. Tennesy's shingle factory, Hughson's flour mill and Bisnett's planing mills also do a good business.

TOWN OF BOTHWELL.

An incorporated town on the line of the G.W.R.; 40 miles from London, 70 from Windsor and 26 from Chatham, the County Town. The Hon. Geo. Brown was the original proprietor. The discovery of oil in this place in 1865 gave an impetus to its rapid advancement during that and following years. It was incorporated in 1865.

MANUFACTURING ESTABLISHMENTS.—The Zone Oil Works, carried on by the Messrs. Prince & McCulloch, were established in 1867. They have a capacity of refining about 600 bls. per week of crude Petroleum into refined illuminating and lubricating oils. This firm employ 20 hands, and a 15 horse power engine. The flour and grist mills and stave factory of R. Chambers & Co. is a frame building, 100 x 40 feet, 3 stories in height, with 2 run of stone. They use an 18 horse power engine, and employ 12 hands in the manufacture of flour staves, and custom work in general. The sash, door and blind factory and planing mills of Mr. Colin Reid is a frame building, 50 x 60 feet, erected in 1864. The power employed is a 20 horse power engine, and 6 to 8 hands are employed in the manufacture of sash, door, blinds, planing and building material in general. Mr. James Trott's carriage and waggon factory is situated on Oak street. He employs 10 hands in the manufacture of carriages, waggons, buggies, sleighs, cutters and everything in the line. Messrs. Archibald, Dixon & Co. are extensively engaged in the manufacture of woolens. Their buildings are frame, 100 x 30 feet, 2 stories high. A 25 horse power engine is used to propel the machinery, and 15 to 20 hands are employed in the production of woolen stuffs, tweeds, blankets and flannels. Especial attention is paid to the manufacture of long and square shawls of a superior make and fabric, specially intended for the use of farmers' wives and others. Mr. Hugh Tims is the proprietor of a saw mill situated in West Bothwell, which is built of frame, 2 stories in height, and measures 50 x 70 feet. A 25 horse power engine furnishes the motive power, and 25 hands are employed. One million feet of timber are here sawn per year.

CHURCHES.—Church of England, a handsome brick building, capable of seating 300 persons, the Rev. D. Deacon, minister. Presbyterian Church, a fine building with spire and dome, erected in 1866, seated for 250, Rev. R. H. Warden, pastor.


