TOWN HALL.

TOWN WARDS.

The line dividing North and East Wards from the West and South Wards, commences at the north-west boundary of the Corporation, and runs as follows: Along the centre of Woolwich St. to its intersection with Wyndham; thence along Wyndham to Macdonnell; thence along west Macdonnell to Norfolk; thence along Norfolk and Gordon to south-east boundary. North and East Wards are divided by Macdonnell, Woolwich, Thorp and Grange streets. West and South Wards are divided by Cork, Dublin, Durham, Yorkshire, Berlin, Edinburgh, Crimea and G. W. Railway.

FIRE DEPARTMENT.

MANUFACTURERS.

W. Bell & Co.'s Organ Factory.—This factory is situated on the Market Square, and is a stone building of three stories, besides the basement; built in the form of an L, one part running from Market Square to Macdonnell street, thirty-three by one hundred and six feet. The other part is sixty-five by fifty-four. Total frontage, ninety-eight feet. From eighty to one hundred men are constantly employed in this establishment. There is machinery for every conceivable kind of work, thus producing an organ much more perfect than it is possible to do by all-hand labor. The number of organs produced is one hundred and twenty per month, and they are shipped to every Province in the Dominion. In addition to this they have built up a large trade in England and Scotland, where their instruments are greatly admired, and enjoy a reputation equal to those of any manufactory in the world. They also do a large business in pianos, both wholesale and retail, being general agents for the Province for the celebrated Hallett, Davis & Co.'s Pianos, besides others, which are good and reliable, at a moderate cost.

Sewing Machine Factory.—Wilkie & Osborn, Guelph Sewing Machine Co. Established sixty years ago. Manufacturers of the Osborn Sewing Machine. Factory occupies two sides of a square, eighty-five and seventy feet long, two and three stories high, lower flats filled with the most improved machinery, other flats used for light machinery, fittings, &c. About one hundred and twenty hands regularly employed in connection with the factory, to whom about \$65,000 is paid annually for wages, and the annual sales from work turned out amount to nearly \$200,000. Business chiefly Canadian, though a considerable quantity is exported. Machines enjoy a high reputation, and an increasing business is the result.

Steam Biscuit and Confectionery Works.—Carried on by Messrs. Massie & Campbell, situated in the Alma Block, near the top of Upper Wyndham Street.

Stone building 130x35, four story high, containing a revolving oven with eight immense pans capable of baking into biscuits 40 barrels of flour, also sugar pounding room, containing a machine with 6 steam hammers for pulverizing the sugar previous to its being made into the different styles of confectionery. It has also various rooms for sweetening, printing and making the above, amongst which we must notice one containing a lozenge machine which rolls out the dough, stamps and prints lozenges at the rate of 900 lbs. per day. The above machine is by Copping & Co., of Toronto, and is valued at \$2,000.

This interesting establishment has also a huge store-room which is capable of containing 800 packages of lard.

The engine is constructed on the Collis principle of 35 horse power, with driving wheel 10 feet in diameter, and weighing 3000 lbs. Employs between 50 and 60 men. Value of machinery employed in building, \$25,000.

The premises composing the Alma Block, Upper Wyndham Street, would compete in beauty and size with any of the large cities in the Dominion, and amongst which we must mention specially Massie & Campbell's confectionery works, Massie & Patterson's wholesale grocery and liquors, H. Clearihue & Co., wholesale china, glass and crockery, J. O. Wood's retail grocery; and others which occupy the whole depth between Wyndham & Woolwich Sts.

Chase's Carriage Works, by Caleb Chase. These Works are situated on Woolwich St. Size of building 60x50 feet, employ 10 men, and turn out about \$15,000 worth of work per annum.

Excelsior Carriage and Spring Works.—Situated between Macdonnell and Quebec Sts., carried on by Armstrong & Co., size of building 90x35, 3 story. Steam 30 horse power. Employ 20 men.

Carriage Works.—By Messrs. Armstrong & Son, situated on Woolwich Street, close to the station of the Grand Trunk Railroad, consist of two buildings: 1 stone block with shop, 30x30; 1 frame building, 2 story, containing show room and paint shop, 35x35, 1 frame store-room, 35x25. Employ 11 men. Turns out 75 vehicles per day.

Guelph Brewery—By Thos. Holiday. Malt house, 110x45. Brewery, 75x54. Steam, 10 horse power. Capacity, 70 barrels. Employ 7 men.

Phoenix Mills (flour and grit).—By N. E. C. Schwalm, size of building 40x50 feet, stone, 3 story high, contains 3 run of stone, capacity 75 barrels per day. Employs 3 men.

The M P C Cigar Factory.—By S. Myers, situated on Gordon St., size of building 20x65 feet. Employ 20 men. This factory has been established 8 years, and carries on an extensive business.

Guelph Wheel Works, Eramosa Road.—By R. R. Dagleish & Co., established 1872. The building is stone, 36x135 feet, 3½ story high. This firm go extensively into the manufacture of all kinds of carriage wood work. Employ 10 men.

Guelph Pump Factory.—By Edward Stovel. The works are situated on Arthur St., size of building 28x36 feet.

Victoria Mills.—By J. C. Present. size of building 65x35 feet, 3 story high, contains 3 run of stone, capacity 70 barrels per day. Employ two men.

Silver Creek Brewery.—By Geo. Sleeman, size of building 137 feet square, capacity 11,000 gallons per week, steam, 22 horse power. Mr. Sleeman can boast of having the only moveable steam boiling coil in the Dominion, which is certainly a great advantage in securing cleanliness. The building is of stone, four story high. Malting capacity 35,000 bushels annually. The water used in the Brewery is from the celebrated Silver Creek, and is so arranged that it can be brought to any flat in the building without pumping. We can safely say that the Silver Creek Brewery will compare with any of its size in the Dominion, and is certainly the best we have ever visited west of Toronto.

Rainer's Piano Factory, by John Harris, established 1872. Size of building 65x35 feet, employ 5 men, and turn out about 3 Pianos per month.

Woolen Mills, by McCrae & Co., established 1862. The building is of stone 143x54 feet, 2½ story high, steam 40 horse power, employ 98 hands. This factory is the largest in the County, and the articles manufactured are of the best quality of knitted goods, under-clothing and yarns, and is the largest mill in the Dominion, making full fashioned work.

Guelph Foundry, established 1848, by A. Robertson & Sons. The building is of stone, 178x54 and 30x50 feet. This is the oldest foundry in Guelph. The Messrs. Robertson's make Steam Engines and Boilers, and mill work a specialty, their engines having taken first prizes at Central Fairs for a number of years, employ 15 men.

Guelph Steam Foundry, by Messrs. Mills & Goodfellow, established 1855. Main building 206 feet square. Pattern shop and store 22x40 feet. Store room 110x25 feet. This firm is extensively engaged in the manufacture of stoves and tinware, and all kinds of castings, employ 25 men.

Groom Bros., are engaged in the manufacture of Cooking Ranges, their shop is situated on Suffolk St. The range manufactured by this firm is really a superior article and cannot fail to recommend itself to all, both as regards general utility and saving in fuel.

Mr. Thomas Worswick, is engaged in the manufacture of engines, machinists' tools, shaftings, pulleys, and general machinery. The foundry is of stone, and is situated on the corner of Norwich and Dublin Sts., being 104x44 feet, 2 story high, steam 30 horse power, employ 30 men.

Wellington Foundry, situated on Perth St., established 1859, by Inglis & Hunter. Main building 115x30 feet, 2 and 3 story high. Moulding shop 80x30 feet, boiler, blacksmith and finishing shop 110x48 feet. The buildings occupy a space of 142x78 feet. This firm is principally engaged in the manufacture of steam engines and boilers, water wheels and all kinds of mill work and barrel machinery, employ 60 men.

People's Flour Mills, by James Goldie. The building is of stone 130x80 feet, 5 story high, contains 6 run of stone. Capacity 300 barrels per day. There is a cooperage in connection with mill, built also of stone 130x36 feet, 2 story high. Mr. Goldie employs about 40 men.

Union Foundry, by Harley & Heather, established 1871. Size of building 156x38 feet, steam 15 horse power, employ 25 men. This firm are agents for the Joseph Hall Manufacturing Co., and John Watson, of Ayr, Agricultural implements.

Organ and Piano Factory, by John Jackson & Co., established 1869, situated on Market Square. Size of building 80x40 feet, 3 story high. The Messrs. Jackson employ a great many men, and manufacture very superior instruments.

Crowe's Iron Works, Norfolk St., established 1869 by John Crowe. Foundry 75 feet

square, finishing shop 24x40 feet, steam 8 horse power. This firm make a specialty of castings, principally for sewing machines, employ 35 men.

Cossitt's Agricultural Works, Norfolk St., by Levi Cossitt, established 1865. Main building 60x36 feet, paint shop 60x20 feet, and foundry situated on Suffolk St. 80x40 feet. Mr. Cossitt is largely engaged in the manufacture of fanning mills, straw cutters, turnip cutters, seed drills, Philadelphia lawn mowers, &c., and gives employment to 35 men.

Stewart's Planing Mill, 96 and 98 Wyndham St., by Albert Stewart, established 1869. Size of building 40x110 feet, 2 story high, brick and stone basement. Contains two planers, siding saw, three side moulding machines, one single machine, power morticing and foot machine, tennoning machine, three blind machines, blind boring, tennoning and wiring machine and shaper, scroll saw and six other saws, steam 20 horse power, employ 26 men.

E. A. Hornbostel's Safe and Lock Manufactory, is situated on the corner of McTague and Woolwich Streets, commanding a good opportunity for a first-class factory, as the growth and prosperity of the town increases. Since commencing business he has met with great success, in the sale of the various articles he has manufactured on his premises. Mr. Hornbostel has recently patented a non-corrosive, combined wood and metal key tap, which is a great improvement to the old wooden taps, and has already met with a great sale. In consequence of the influx in his business, he has taken into partnership a Mr. Carroll, for the patentee and manufacture of the Guelph non-corrosive combined wood and metal key tap, under the firm and title of Hornbostel and Carroll.

Puslinch Oatmeal Mills, carried on by H. Murton, are situated on Wellington Street, consisting of three buildings, one of which is the kiln, a stone building 50 x 18 feet; another 36 x 66 feet, with four run of stone running day and night; capacity 1000 barrels a month; employs 7 men; also two girls and one boy are employed in putting up 1 lb. packages of Scotch oatmeal, and who turn out 15,000 of the above packages per month.

Woolen Mill, carried on by George Murray. Stone building 3 story, 50 x 36; one broad set of machinery for manufacturing yarns, tweeds, and shirtings. Employs 6 men. In the same building with the woolen mill is a carpet factory, by J. & A. Armstrong, size of building 40 x 50; 9 looms; capacity 100 yards a day.

Furniture Factory, by Burr & Skinner, situated on the corner Glasgow and Oxford Streets. One stone building, 75 x 33; one frame 75 x 20; steam 30 horse power; employs 45 men. In 1874, between 45 and \$50,000 worth of goods were manufactured by this firm.

Guelph Mills, (flour and distillery) established 1827. The original mill which was constructed of wood, and erected by the Canada Company, passed into the hands of the late William Allan in 1833. It is now wholly removed. Extensive buildings of stone work have been added year by year, and are still carried on with the same energy by the present proprietor, Mr. David Allan. The portion occupied as a steam flour mill contains four run of stone. The granary, which supplies both steam and water mills, the latter containing four run of stone. The elevating appliances of both mills can be connected when required, as can also the machinery which is kept almost constantly at work, supplying water to the tanks of the Grand Trunk Railway Station, in the immediate vicinity. Both mills are of recent erection, being fitted up with the best machinery for the manufacture of flour previous to grinding the wheat, is subjected to four distinct operations for the purpose of removing smut and other impurities, only the finest qualities of the "Guelph Mills," and "River Speed" flour leave the mills.

Two substantial tramway bridges connect the mills with the distillery on the opposite bank of the river. The distillery is of large capacity, the duty on spirits manufactured amounting to over \$100,000 yearly. Adjoining is the rectifying house four story high, recently fitted up with every appliance for the production of the purest quality of spirits, such as old rye, malt, pure spirits, alcohol, old Tom, Gin, ginger wines, etc., which are shipped to all parts of the Dominion. Owing to the superior quality of the articles manufactured by this firm, which cannot be surpassed, the demand for their liquors is constantly increasing. In connection with the distillery there is also a malt house and extensive sheds capable of holding 300 head of cattle. The building formerly occupied as a carding mill, is now used as a carpenter's and millwright's shop, and contains two wood planing machines, lathes for wood and iron, etc. There is also a commodious blacksmith's shop adjoining. The several apartments are kept in active operation, requiring the motive power of three water wheels and two steam engines, and furnish constant employment to over 30 men.

There are also two foundries and Agricultural implement manufactories, two saw mills, grist mill, three planing mills and sash factories, tannery, three brick yards, two cabinet factories, three carriage factories, four large grain warehouses and Elevators, pump factory, pottery, a large

number of good hotels, six churches, and a number of very fine stores, among which we might mention Messrs. Chisholm & Green's, which will compare favorably with those in cities. This firm carry on a very extensive business. The town being in the centre of an extensive agricultural district, a very large business is transacted, and immense quantities of grain and other farm produce is purchased and shipped by railway, a bill was passed at the last session of the Ontario Legislature, setting apart the new County of Dufferin, of which Orangeville is to be the county town. The town is increasing rapidly in population and wealth, during the last five years it has doubled its population, and its assessed value has increased threefold. Distant from Toronto 49 miles, from Mount Forest 38 miles, and from Guelph, the county town, 25 miles. Population 3,000.
