

**BLACK HORSE CORNERS.**

A small village in the Township of North Dumfries, eleven miles from Berlin. It was first settled by David Shantz. It contains a hotel, blacksmith, waggon, and shoemakers' shops, and a pump and shingle factory.

**BLAIR.**

A village in the township of Waterloo, situated on the Grand River, seven miles from Berlin, two from Preston, two from Doon and four from Galt. It was settled about the year 1819 by Messrs. Bowman, Bechtel and Wisner. The post office was established in 1858, W. Bowman, first postmaster. There are two flouring mills, two saw mills and a distillery in the village. There is also a good school, J. W. Adams teacher, and a Mennonite church, Rev. John McNally pastor.

**BLOOMINGDALE.**

A small village in the township of Waterloo, on the Grand River, five miles from Berlin, and four from Breslau station. The post office was established in 1861, J. G. Moyer, first and present postmaster. It contains a Mennonite church, a hotel, a woollen factory, several mechanics' shops, and a school.

**BRANCHTON.**

A village and station of the Great Western Railway, in the seventh concession of the township of North Dumfries, seventeen miles from Berlin and six from Galt. The village was laid out in 1855 by William Rosebrugh. The post office was established in 1850, Peter Marshall, first postmaster. The village contains a Wesleyan Methodist Church, built of stone in 1855, a good school, averaging 70 pupils, a grist mill, saw mill, and a woollen factory, giving employment to 10 hands and using a steam engine of 13 horse power.

A village and station of the G. T. R. in the township of Waterloo, four miles from Berlin, six from Preston, and nine from Guelph. The village was laid out by Joseph Erb in 1857, and the post office was established the same year, Cyrus Erb, first postmaster. Breslau possesses excellent water privileges, being situated on Hopewell Creek and adjacent to the Grand River. It contains a Mennonite church, Rev. Joseph Hagey, pastor, a flouring mill, steam saw mill, and several mechanics shops.

**BRIDGEPORT.**

A flourishing village in the township of Waterloo, situated at the confluence of Laurel Creek and the Grand River, two miles from Berlin. The place was first settled by Jacob S. Shoemaker, and the site was laid out by Messrs. Barnabas, Devitt, Elias Eby, Thomas L. Ferrier and Peter N. Tagge, the proprietors. The post office was established in 1847, Peter N. Tagge, first postmaster.

The village was formerly known as "Shoemaker's Mills," "Glasgow," and "Lancaster." The excellent facilities for manufacturing purposes afforded by the Grand River and Laurel Creek, have been advantageously employed, and the place now contains several large establishments, the principal being the flouring mill, Elias Eby & Co., proprietors, having five run of stones, and a capability of eighty barrels a day. This mill was built in 1832, and cost, with the machinery, \$15,000; a saw mill capable of cutting half a million of feet per annum; a large stave and shingle factory; an oil mill, producing about 6,000 gallons of linseed oil per annum; a woollen factory, Messrs. Wendling and Murray, proprietors, turning out about \$3,000 worth of goods per annum. There is also a large steam rake and shingle factory, and a number of mechanics' shops, general stores, &c., a Lutheran church, Rev. Mr. Hoelsche pastor, and a school, averaging 70 pupils, John Mulherron teacher.

A post village in the Township of Woolwich, situated at the confluence of the Conestogo and Grand Rivers, seven miles from Berlin, and sixty-nine from Toronto.

Conestogo was laid out in the year 1846 by Messrs. David Musselman and Charles Hendry, and the post office was established in 1849, Charles Hendry, first P. M.

The facilities for manufacturing are first-class. The Conestogo, and a small branch of the Grand River, supply power for the large flouring Mill of Mr. Henry Snider, which is capable of manufacturing sixty barrels a day, the extensive flax mills of Perine Brothers, and two saw-mills. The village contains a Lutheran church, a common school, E. Ruby, teacher, two general stores, three hotels, three carriage and waggon maker's shops, and several other mercantile and mechanical establishments. The Seventh Division Court is held here. Daily mails. Stages to Berlin. Population, about 400.

The school averages 100 pupils, Thomas Jackson, teacher.

The Doon Mills, built of stone, employs seven hands, and is an extensive establishment; the flax works of Perine Bros, employs about sixty hands. There is one church, Canada Presbyterian, built in 1856, at a cost of \$5,000, Rev. Malcolm McKenzie, pastor. The post office was established in 1845, Robert F. Ferrie, first P. M. Daily mails. A post village in the Township of Woolwich, on the Kannaakajaique creek, twelve miles from Berlin, the nearest railway station, and seventy-four from Toronto. The village was first settled in the year 1832, by Henry Christman and Edward Bristow. The plot was laid out by Messrs. Wenger and Good. The post office was established in 1852, Edward Bristow, first P. M. The village contains three churches, two Lutheran, Revds. Messrs. Koessman and Ernst, pastors, and one Wesleyan Methodist, Rev. Mr. Fear, pastor, a common school, averaging 130 pupils, G. W. Woodward, Misses Woodward and Johnston, teachers, a steam flouring mill, a woollen factory, and a foundry. Daily mails. Stages to Berlin and Glenallen. Population, 400.

ELMIRA MILLS—flouring—"Elmira Flouring Mills Company," proprietors; John Ratz, President; S. Snider, Secretary and Treasurer. Steam power, 35 horse, three run of stones with capacity for four more. The building is of brick, three and a half stories high.

ELMIRA WOOLLEN MILLS, Winger & Weaver, proprietors—steam, 45 horse; two complete sets of machinery, employing 25 hands, and turning out manufactured goods, tweeds, cloths, blankets, &c., to the value of

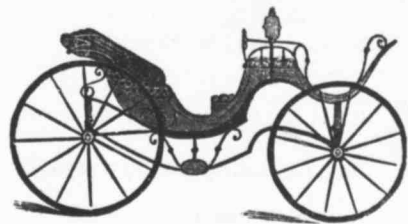

The name of the post office of the village of New Germany, situated in the township of Waterloo, eight miles from Berlin. It contains a Roman Catholic Church, two stores, schools, hotels and mechanics' shops.

Population, 150.

**GALT.**

A Town in the County of Waterloo, is situated in the Township of North Dumfries, and on both sides of the Grand River. The surrounding country is remarkable for its fertility, and the scenery in the neighborhood of the town is very picturesque. It is the largest and most populous town in the county, and in regard of its manufactures is second to none in the Province. The numerous extensive establishments are fully employed, and Galt has not inappropriately been called the "Manchester of Canada." Its water power is unlimited, and a reference to the subjoined list of the principal establishments, will give a good idea of its claims to be the "wealthiest incorporated town in Canada." The streets are neatly laid out, and the employment of stone in building, which is procured in any required quantity in the immediate vicinity, gives the town a remarkably substantial appearance. In 1845 the population was estimated at 1,000; in 1852, it was 2,248; and in 1861, 3,069. The present population is probably about 3,500.

**DUMFRIES FOUNDRY**—Goldie, McCulloch & Co.—This establishment has been in operation for about 25 years. The motive power is steam, two engines—aggregate, 40 horse, employing upwards of one hundred operatives. There are two departments, one for the manufacture of engines, boilers, and general mill gearing, the other for woollen machinery. All the manufactures are of the most approved model, and the best proof of the excellency of the manufacture is found in the demand not only from all parts of Canada, but from the West Indies, California, and other distant countries.

**VICTORIA FOUNDRY**—Lutz & Co.—Established about twenty-five years water power, equivalent to 15 horse—employs from 25 to 30 hands. Manufactures all kinds of agricultural implements, shingle-sawing machines, stoves, ploughs, &c.

**UNION FOUNDRY**—J. W. Davis & Co.—Steam, 10 horse, about 12 hands, manufactures ploughs, stoves, hardware, tin, copper, and sheet-iron ware, all of superior quality.

**GALT AXE FACTORY**—H. H. Date.—Established 17 years, water power, employs about 40 hands, and manufactures axes and edge tools.

**DICKSON MILLS**—Richard Blain.—Erected in 1843. The main building is of stone, 75 by 45 feet, and four stories high. Water power, equal to 60 horse; capacity, 25,000 barrels per annum. Mr. Blain is also proprietor of a cooperage and stave factory, water power, employing 20 hands; capacity, 40,000 flour barrels, and one million staves annually.

**DUMFRIES FLOURING MILLS**—Thomas Stewart.—Water power, four runs of stones; capacity from 100 to 150 barrels a day. Employs five hands.

**ROBINSON & HOWELL'S WOOLLEN FACTORY**—Steam and water power, engine 45 horse, employs about 50 hands. This establishment manufactures cloths and tweeds exclusively.

**OSBORNE TANNERY**—W. S. Burnett & Co.—Steam, engine 8 horse employs 8 hands; manufactures curried leather chiefly.

**BILLING & Co.'s TANNERY**—John Billing & Co.—Steam, 30 horse, employs 28 hands. All the several branches of the business are carried on.

**SUTHERLAND'S SAW MILL**—Steam, 25 horse, employs six hands; capacity, 8,000 feet a day.

**LAIDLAW'S SASH FACTORY**—W. W. Laidlaw, builder and contractor.—Water power, employs eight hands in the manufacture of sash, doors, and blinds, flooring, mouldings, &c.

**BARBOUR'S CABINET AND CHAIR FACTORY**—John Barbour.—Steam 6 horse, employs 7 hands. Trade principally retail.

**VICTORIA WORKS**—James McMillan & Co.—Steam, engine 10 horse, employs 16 hands; manufacture every description of carriage material, hubs, spokes, bent work, &c.

**KAY'S CARRIAGE WORKS**—James Kay.—Employs 15 hands; manufacture carriages, farm and lumber waggons, &c.

**GILLIES' CARRIAGE WORKS**—Peter Gillies.—Carriages, waggons, sleighs, &c., made of the best materials. Employs 7 hands. Blacksmith shop in connection.

**GALT BREWERY**—Carter & Todd—Employs six hands. The trade of this establishment extends to the adjoining counties.

**PECK'S MALT FACTORY**—Thomas Peck.—This establishment does a very extensive business. Orders are filled for all parts of the Province. The malt house is one of the largest stone buildings in the town.

**SCOTT'S FACTORY**—James Scott & Son—Manufactures bobbies, Jack



and cotton spools, and other implements for woollen factories—steam and water power—employs 16 hands.

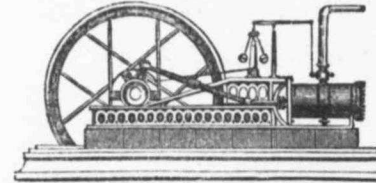

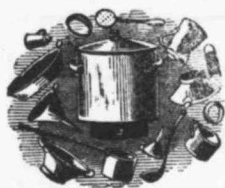

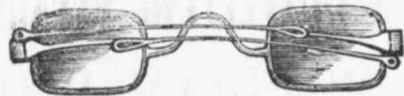

## HAYSVILLE.

A village situated on lot 20, second concession, block A., of the township of Wilmot, three miles from New Hamburg station Grand Trunk Railway, eight from Plattsville station, Buffalo and Lake Huron Railway; sixteen from Berlin, twenty from Galt, and seventy-eight from Toronto. The village was settled in 1835 by Robert Hays, William Hobson, and E. Everett, and the Post Office was established the following year—Robert Hays, first postmaster. The village is well supplied with water privileges by the river Nith, and contains a flouring mill, a woollen and a cheese factory. There is an Episcopal Church, Rev. H. Mellish, pastor, and an excellent school ably conducted by Mr. T. J. Newman, and averaging eighty pupils.

The Post Office was originally called Wilmot, but was changed to its present name in 1853. It is named after Mr. Robert Hays, who built the mills here in 1835.
