## TOWN OF SARNIA.

Sarnia is the County Town of Lambton and seat of Judiciary. It is favorably situated for becoming a great commercial emporium—being in direct communication with all ports from the head of Lake Superior to the Atlantic Ocean by regular lines of steamboats and sailing packets; and also the terminus of Grand Trunk and Great Western Railways in Canada, and is expected ere long to have a direct Railway line to Lake Erie at Rond Eau Harbor.

Few towns in Ontario have made more steady and rapid progress within the last decade—during that period its population and trade have increased over fifty per cent. The large number of costly public buildings and private mansions erected in this town is another mark of its prosperity and the enterprise of its citizens. Last year they expended the sum of \$60,000 in waterworks, by which all parts of the town are supplied with a full supply of that convenience. The county buildings are of the first-class order. The Court House, Registry Office and County Clerk's Office are built of grey lime stone, with cut stone quoins and dressings. The Jail is built of free stone and is not excelled by any prison in Ontario for safety and comfort. To all this may be added the new Town Hall and Market House in course of erection, which will compare favorably with the like buildings in any city or town in Canada.

*St. Mary's, Roman Catholic Church*, corner of London Road and Christina Streets, is a large frame building with spire and dome, erected in 1856, having capacity to seat 400. Sabbath services, 8 to 10½ a. m.; vespers at 7 p. m. Sabbath School at 2 p. m. The *Lady of Lake Huron Academy*, conducted by the sisters of the Holy name of Jesus and Mary. Also a separate school with male and female departments, and an attendance of 150 pupils, under the tuition of three teachers, are in connection with this church. T. H. Finn, Principal Teacher.

*Methodist Church*, is a good brick building with basement story and galleries. This church has capacity to seat 450. Sabbath services, 11 a. m. and 7 p. m. Sabbath School, 2.30 p. m.

## WYOMING.

An incorporated village and station on the Sarnia branch of the G. W. R., in the Township of Plimpton. Distance from Sarnia 16 miles, and 44 miles from London. This village owes its rapid progress mainly to the oil trade of Enniskillen, combined with the enterprise of its early settlers. Mr. Brock erected the first permanent building in the village in 1852, the few shanties that preceded it having long since disappeared. In 1856 Robinson and McKay laid out the village and Alex. Duncan and W. H. Brown opened the first store. From that time it increased rapidly, and was incorporated in 1874, W. W. Hunt being elected first Reeve, which office he still retains. There are four churches in the village, viz. :

*Church of England*—Sabbath services, 11 a. m. Rev. G. Turnbull, Minister.

*Roman Catholic Church*—Services alternate Sabbaths, at 10 a. m. Rev. J. Ansboro, P. P., who supplies Oil Springs and Forest churches also.

*Methodist Church*—Sabbath Services, 10.30 a. m. and 6.30 p. m. Sabbath School, 2.30 p. m. Rev. John Neelands, Minister.

*Methodist Episcopal Church*—Rev. G. C. Squires, Minister.

**SCHOOLS**—The Public Schools consists of three departments and number about 250 pupils. Mr. G. W. Marriott, Principal teacher.

**SOCIETIES**.—*Masonic*—Burn's Lodge, 153, holds its regular communications on Thursday on or before full moon.

*L. O. L. No. 294*—Meets Wednesday on or before full moon.

*I. O. O. F.*—Model Lodge 147, meets on Mondays.

**MANUFACTURES**.—Amongst the manufacturing establishments we notice the Woollen Mills of A. J. Syer where 10 hands are employed in the manufacture of tweeds, full-cloths, blankets, and fancy flannels, shirting, stocking yarn, etc., and all kinds of custom work. This is one of the best mills in the County and 10,000 yards of cloth are manufactured annually. The Flour Mills of Mustard Bros; the Oil Refineries of McGarvey and Brown, and the extensive Ontario Carriage Factory of Bennett Bros., where 8 to 10 hands are employed and every article in their line manufactured.
