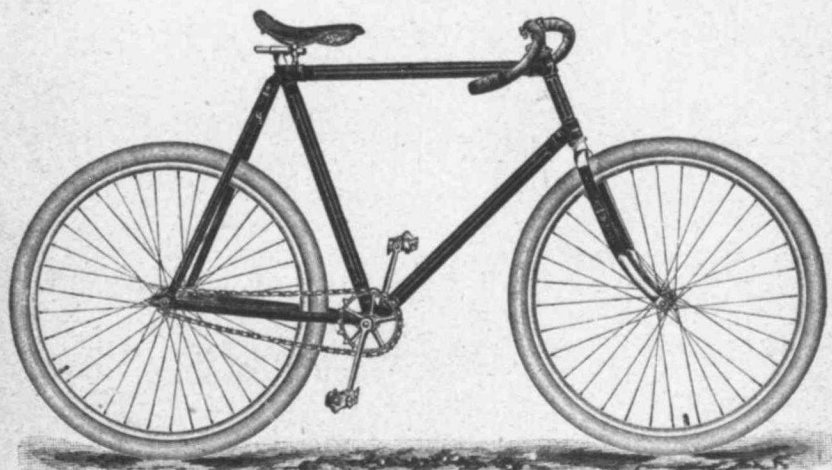

Ald. Rumball reported for the committee having the purchase in hand of copies of "Illustrated London." The committee had purchased 650 copies for \$500. Sir Donald Smith had made a very complimentary reference to the book itself. Two books, each costing \$22, had been prepared for presentation to Her Majesty and to the Lord Mayor of London; 150 copies had been sent to the High Commissioner in London, Eng., to be placed in immigration offices and places of public resort; 200 copies are to be sent to newspaper offices throughout the United Kingdom. Other copies will be kept in the clerk's office, to be given out only upon the Mayor's authority. The report was adopted.—*Free Press, Oct. 26, 1897: Report of "Illustrated London" Committee.*

Directions for giving an alarm from above boxes. Unlock and pull open outside door. Then pull the hook on the inner door down as far as it will go (ONCE ONLY) and let it go.

Instructions to Key-Holders.

Upon ascertaining that there is a fire in the vicinity of your box, unlock the outside door and pull it wide open. Then listen, and if you do not hear the little gong inside striking, proceed at once to give the alarm as directed above. If you do hear the gong striking wait until it has entirely ceased repeating its number of rounds before you attempt to pull the hook or knob.

If after pulling the box as directed, you do not hear the little gong inside striking or the Box working, shut the door and go to the nearest telephone to send in the alarm.

Do not attempt to remove your key from the lock as you cannot do so without injuring the lock or breaking the key. Some member of the Fire Department will release and return it to you.

Never open a Box except for the purpose of giving an alarm. Never give an alarm for a fire outside of the city limits, or for a fire which is a long distance away (unless you are on a line between it and the Fire Station) or for a chimney fire. All alarms should be sent in from the Box nearest to the fire. If possible always wait until the firemen arrive and direct them to the fire if it is not visible. Always close the door of the Box before leaving it.

Keep your key in a place where you can get it quickly when required and where it will be out of the reach of children and strangers. If you intend to remove from the house you are occupying, please return your key to the nearest Fire Station.

Notice to the public.

Any responsible citizen can obtain a key by applying at the nearest Fire Station.

Keys will be kept at houses in the immediate neighborhood of the Boxes.

Anyone having a telephone can use it for the purpose of giving an alarm for a fire.

Ten strokes on City Hall Bell or on the gongs, followed by the number of the Box, will denote a second alarm for the same fire, and call all the apparatus of the Department.

Two strokes on Bell or gongs (after an alarm is given), will signify that the fire is out.

Parties erecting houses or scaffolding, moving houses or cutting trees, must on no account interfere with the wires, poles or boxes. By leaving notice at the nearest Fire Station, all necessary alterations will be promptly attended to. Citizens will confer a favor by immediately reporting at the nearest Fire Station any break or damage to the line or boxes.

Directions for counting the signal on the bell when a box is pulled.

Suppose box 34 is pulled, you do not get 34 blows on the gongs or bell, but first you get three distinct blows, which will represent the tens or 30; then a pause of five seconds, when four blows will be given representing the units, or four, thus: 111-1111-34.

Single numbers up to nine, are struck consecutively or continuously, without any break, until the whole number is given. The number of the box pulled will be repeated four or five times with an interval between.

Letters addressed to places in Canada, Newfoundland, and United States, 3 cents per 1 oz or fraction thereof; city or drop letters for city delivery; 2c per 1 oz. or fraction thereof.

Letters to any place in Canada insufficiently prepaid will be forwarded and charged double the deficiency.

Letters posted wholly unpaid to places within the Dominion or United States, and letters addressed to the United States not prepaid at least one full rate (3 cents) will be sent to the Dead Letter Office.

Re-directed letters are not liable to any additional postage if handed back to the post office with a changed address at the moment of delivery, or as soon as possible thereafter, provided always the change in the address does not require the letter to be sent to any place to which the postage rate is higher than was at first payable.

Letters, in places in Canada, Newfoundland and the United States, sent in envelopes having printed or written thereon a request that the letters be returned to the sender if not delivered within a specified time will be returned as requested if not delivered in the time stated.

Post Cards.

For Canada and the United States, 1 cent each. For Great Britain, Newfoundland, and all postal union countries, 2 cents each. Reply cards for Canada only, 2 cents each. One cent Canadian card will pass to Great Britain, etc., by prepayment of the extra cent stamp. Nothing must be attached to a post card.

SECOND-CLASS MATTER.

Newspapers and periodicals posted from the office of publication, and authorized to pass free of postage to regular subscribers in Canada, Newfoundland and the United States.

Specimen papers are one cent per pound or fraction of a pound, to be prepaid by stamp or otherwise, as the Postmaster-General from time to time directs.

THIRD-CLASS MATTER.

Newspapers and Periodicals.

Transient newspapers within the Dominion and the United States, 1 cent per 4 oz., or fraction thereof—but a single paper weighing not more than 1 oz. will be forwarded for ½ cent. Local newspapers weighing not more

than 1 oz., for city delivery, ½ cent each. For the United Kingdom and all European countries, the rate is 1 cent per 2 oz. or fraction of 2 oz.

Foreign newspapers may be re-posted in Canada at the 1 cent per pound rate. Copies re-posted for local delivery, 1 cent per 4 oz.

The rate of postage upon all newspapers and periodicals posted in Canada, not otherwise provided for, and on books, pamphlets, occasional publications, printed circulars, prices current, hand-bills, and other matter wholly in print; and on packages of seeds, cuttings, bulbs, roots, scions, or grafts; patterns or samples of goods or merchandise, is 1 cent per 4 oz. or fraction thereof, to be prepaid by postage stamp or stamped postband or wrapper.

Upon all book and newspaper manuscript, printers' proof-sheets, whether corrected or not, maps, prints, drawings, engravings, lithographs, photographs when not on glass or in cases containing glass, sheet music, whether printed or written documents, partly printed or written, not being letters or intending to serve the purpose of letters—such as deeds, insurance policies, militia and school returns, or other documents of like nature, the rate of postage is 1 cent for each 2 oz., or fraction of 2 oz., to be prepaid by postage stamp or stamped postband or wrapper.

Printed matter bearing a request to return if not called for in so many days is not admissible.

Books.

A Book Packet must be left open for inspection; it must not contain any enclosure, nor must it exceed 24 inches in length nor 12 inches in breadth or depth. The limit of weight of a book packet addressed to any place within the Dominion, Newfoundland or Great Britain, is 5 lbs. Postage to places in Canada, 1 cent per 4 oz.; to the United States, Great Britain and other European countries, 1 cent per 2 oz.

A Book Packet may contain a single invoice of the contents.

Commercial Papers and Legal Documents, including bank pass books, may be sent to Great Britain and the United States and all foreign countries at 5 cents for the first 10 ounces, and 1 cent for every additional 2 ounces.

Circulars.

Are communications in print, or produced by a multiplying process easily distinguished from type writing, which are posted to several individuals, and couched in identical terms. A circular

may, without becoming liable to a higher rate of postage, have a written date and signature, and may have the name of the addressee repeated in writing inside.

The postage on circulars wholly in print is 1 cent per 4 oz., and on circulars produced by a multiplying process, 1 cent per 2 oz.

Circulars Produced in Imitation of Type Writing.

Circulars printed, or otherwise produced, in imitation of type writing may be allowed to pass at the 1 cent per 2 oz. rate when at least 50 copies, in exactly identical terms, are handed into the post office at one time. When such circulars are posted in the receiver they should be tied together.

Circulars type-written are liable to letter rate.

Canada and United States.

The following classes of matter, when addressed to the United States, are subject to a postage rate of 1c per 2 oz.: Books, pamphlets, occasional publications, printed circulars, prices current, hand bills, books and newspaper manuscript, printers' proofs, whether corrected or not, prints, advertising sheets, drawings, engravings, lithographs, photographs, sheet music, whether printed or written; documents wholly or partly printed or written, such as deeds, insurance policies, and generally the class of documents known as legal and commercial papers; seeds, cuttings, bulbs, roots, scions, etc., can only be sent as fifth-class matter—1 cent per oz.

A packet of legal and commercial papers, however, must, as in the case of similar matter addressed to Postal Union countries, generally bear a minimum prepayment (however small the weight) of 5 cents.

The rate of postage on patterns and samples is the ordinary Postal Union rate of 1 cent per 2 oz. Limit of weight, 8 oz.

Patterns and Samples.

Bona-fide Patterns and Samples of Merchandise, not exceeding 24 oz. in weight may be sent to any place in Canada at 1 cent per 4 oz. Must be put up so as to admit of inspection. Goods sent in execution of an order, however small the quantity may be, or articles sent by one private individual to another, not being actually trade patterns or samples, are not admissible as such. The limit of weight to the United Kingdom is 5 pounds; dimensions, 2 feet in length, and 1 foot in breadth or depth. The limit of weight

to Austria-Hungary, Belgium, Egypt, France, Hawaii, Italy, Portugal, Roumania, and Switzerland is 12 ounces; limit of size, 1 foot in length, by 8 inches in width, and 4 inches in depth; if in form of a roll it may be 12 inches in length and 6 inches in diameter. Other Postal Union countries:—Limit of weight, 8 oz.; limit of size, same as Austria-Hungary, Belgium, etc.; rate of postage, 1 cent per 2 oz.

A sample packet for Postal Union countries must be prepaid not less than 2 cents.

Sample packets of liquids, oils, etc., may be sent to any European country, with the exception of the United Kingdom and Russia. These packets are forwarded in the direct mails for France, which are made up in Montreal weekly.

Parcel Post.

With the United Kingdom, Newfoundland, Japan, Barbadoes, and certain other countries:—

Closed parcels may be sent to places in Newfoundland, Jamaica, the United Kingdom, Japan, Barbadoes and all other countries with which the United Kingdom maintains a parcel post.

Customs declarations of the contents and value of each parcel must be filled up at the office by the sender.

For Other Countries.

Parcels for the United Kingdom must be prepaid 16 cents for the first pound, or fraction of a pound, and 12 cents for each additional pound, and must not exceed 11 pounds in weight, nor 2 feet in length, by 1 foot in width or depth.

Parcels for Newfoundland must be prepaid 15 cents per pound, or fraction of a pound, and must not exceed 7 pounds in weight, nor 2 feet in length, by 1 foot in width or depth.

Parcels for Japan must be prepaid 20 cents per pound, or fraction of a pound, and must not exceed 7 pounds in weight.

Barbadoes and Jamaica, 20 cents per pound, not to exceed 7 pounds in weight.

New South Wales.

Rates, 24 cents per pound, via Vancouver.

Postage for other countries can be ascertained at the inquiry office.

FOURTH-CLASS MATTER.

Parcels.

Parcels for Canada must be prepaid 6 cents for 4 oz., and must not exceed 5 pounds in weight, nor 2 feet in length by 1 foot in width or depth.

They should be plainly addressed, and should have the sender's name on the left hand corner. No correspondence must be enclosed.

Bank Pass Books must be prepaid letter or parcel rate.

FIFTH-CLASS MATTER.

Postage rate 1 cent per oz., or fraction of an ounce, to be prepaid by postage stamp. Miscellaneous articles of merchandise, including seeds, bulbs, etc. to the United States, and generally all matter permitted to pass by mail in Canada which is not of the nature of a letter, and therefore subject to letter rate of postage, and not entitled to be posted at a lower rate than fifth-class under one of the other classes, may pass as fifth-class when addressed to any destination within the Dominion or the United States. Fifth-class matter must be so packed or put up as to be open to examination of contents, and must not exceed 5 pounds in weight, nor 2 feet in length, by 1 foot in width or depth. When passing between Canada and the United States it will be subject to customs regulations if liable to duty. Liquids, oils and fatty substances are not excluded when in glass bottles or vials. Particulars as to the mode of packing, etc., will be supplied by application to the Postmaster at the mailing office. The registration charge on fifth-class matter is 5 cents in addition to postage.

REGISTRATION.

All classes of matter may be registered to all destinations in Canada and throughout the Postal Union, and letters may be registered to most of the countries not included in the union.

The fee on letters to places in Canada, Newfoundland, United States, Great Britain, and all European countries, 5 cents.

The sender of a registered article addressed to any Postal Union country may entitle himself to certificate as to the disposal of said article by the postmaster at the office addressed, on prepayment of an additional fee of 5 cents.

Every article intended for registration must be handed in at the wicket, and a receipt obtained therefor.

MONEY ORDER OFFICE.

In sending money by mail it is always best to transmit by Money Order, if possible. If sent by letter, it should always be registered. Money Orders issued and paid from 9 a. m. to 4 p. m.
