## INTRODUCTORY.

In compiling a work like the present on the County of Middlesex,  
it may not be out of place to make a few remarks relative to its history  
for the benefit of those who may yet seek a home in our midst or may  
come after us, and in doing so will make the starting point where Sir  
John Graves Simcoe, the first Governor of Upper Canada, by consent  
of parliament assembled at York (Toronto) in 1798, proclaimed that  
the London or Western District should extend from Long Point to  
Bramford, and from Lake Erie to the Georgian Bay.

In 1803 or 1804 the Hon. Col. Talbot was authorized to settle the  
Crown Lands in the London District, and he, with great wisdom and  
forethought, opened up the southern part of the district by cutting out  
the road since known as the Talbot street, extending from Long Point  
to St. Thomas; thence on through Kent and Essex to the Detroit River,  
and by this means prepared the country for settlement, which was then  
done on the free grant system. From 1793 to 1825 the District Courts  
were held in the Township of Charlotteville and at Turkey Point. A  
brick court house had been erected at Victoria in the mean time, at a  
cost of \$40,000, which was accidentally burned down in 1825, when the  
court was removed to St. Thomas for a year or two. In 1826 by an  
Imperial Act passed in the 7th George IV., cap. 14, it was enacted that  
London would be the judicial seat of the district, and in the same year  
a log jail and a temporary court house were erected.

In 1828 the first bridge spanned the Thames at this point, and an  
incident is related that the first crime in the annals of the place was  
committed in connection with the building of the bridge; it consisted  
in the stealing of an axe from one of the men employed at the works.  
Although a legally appointed police force was then unknown, the thief  
was arrested and kept chained all night to a stump. In the morning  
Judge Lynch presided over the extemporised open air tribunal and after  
hearing the case decreed that the culprit should receive so many lashes  
or clear out—never again to make his appearance. The latter alterna-  
tive was accepted, and public indignation fully appeased.

In 1830 the market was situated on the southeast corner of the Court House Square. The first merchants were Messrs. Goodhue, Lawson, O'Brien and Jennings, and a weekly mail, carried on horse-back, conveyed the intelligence of "well or woe" to the people of London and its vicinity. The roads in these days were very difficult to travel, and the merchants sold their goods at extravagant prices; for instance, a pound of better would pay for a common clay pipe, and a bushel of wheat for a yard of factory cotton.

In 1838 and, 33 London made much progress, owing chiefly to the excessive emigration from the British Isles during that period; and in 1856 the census returns showed a population of 1,037, and the assessed value of real and personal property amounted to \$54,380.

In 1858 seven persons were executed at London for participating in McKenzie's rebellion, and a number of others were doomed to penal servitude, which sentence was carried in effect.

The most important subject to a Christian community is its religion and the influence it exercises on the people. For as "*righteousness exalts a nation*" it is the foundation of all national greatness and moral worth. The Wesleyan Methodists—so often the heralds of the Gospel of Peace in new lands and pioneer missionaries of the forest—first established religious worship in London and built a frame church in 1830. The following year the Episcopalians erected a church and organized religious worship. And in three years after, (1834,) the Roman Catholics insured an edifice for divine worship. Now the churches of London are a credit to the liberality and devotional spirit of all denominations.

In 1840 London was incorporated as a village, with a population of 1,716. The population having increased to 3,000 in 1847 it was incorporated as a town and Simon Merrill, Esq., elected first mayor of it. The Great Western Railway having given more than ordinary impetus to improvements in this section of county during the following years, in 1855 London was incorporated as a city, with 10,000 inhabitants, and Murray Anderson, Esq., elected first city mayor. But while London was thus advancing with such rapid strides the county was keeping pace with it in the onward march of progression; for although the County of Middlesex has been shorn of its territorial grandeur since the time it was legally and generally known as the London District, then extending from the Detroit River to Long Point, yet in

point of wealth, enterprise, population and intelligence it is now in excess of the old London District with the extended boundary.

The census of 1861 showed the population then to be 48,697 to which add 11,555 as the population of the City of London, lying within the county, making a total for city and county of 60,252; when the census for 1871 are taken an increase of at least 40 per cent. may be expected and that without a regular soldier within the limits.

The county is traversed by the main line and Sarnia branch of the Great Western Railway, and by the Port Stanley and London branch of the Grand Trunk Roads, with a fair prospect for another road in contemplation to a point on Lake Huron, thereby bringing markets within easy distance of all parts of the county. There are 150 miles of gravel and plank roads built and owned by the county besides those owned by the townships of Biddulph and McGillivray and the Proof Line Road Company which will swell the number of miles of plank and gravel roads within the county to over 200 miles. There is one incorporated town (Stratroy) and one incorporated village (Wardsville) within the county, with a number of villages that could claim the right to be incorporated as separate municipalities. The soil, agricultural facilities, mechanical enterprise, markets, roads, manufactories and water-power of Middlesex will favorably compare with any county in Ontario. This mammoth county, with 17 large municipalities and an assessment roll of over \$11,000,000 is becoming too unwieldy for one municipal body to control its destinies, consequently the differences of opinion and of local interests are yearly becoming more and more apparent in the council chamber, so that another division of Middlesex is forcing itself upon those holding the helm of municipal affairs and must take place at no very distant period.
