COUNTY OF WELLINGTON.

In the year 1834 the County of Halton comprised the territory now known as North Wentworth, North and South Waterloo, and North and South Wellington; and in 1837, by Act of Parliament, the new "District of Wellington" was set apart, which comprehended "the townships of Luther, Proton, Amaranth and Melancthon, from the County of Simcoe; the townships of Guelph, Garafraxa, Erin, Eramosa, Nichol, Waterloo, Wilmot, Woolwich, and a triangular portion known as the 'King's Bush,' now forming the townships of Peel, Maryborough and Wellesley, from the Gore District. By the same proclamation, the erection of a court house and jail in the town of Guelph was authorized. In 1840 the county officials received their commissions: A. J. Fergusson, Judge, County Court; George J. Grange, Sheriff; Thomas Saunders, Clerk of the Peace, and James Hodggett, Inspector of Licenses. Mr. A. D. Fordyce was appointed Warden in 1841.

At a subsequent period, the *County* of Wellington was formed, and now contains eighteen municipalities: the town of Guelph; the villages of Fergus, Elora, Mount Forest and Orangeville; and the townships of Amaranth, Arthur, Eramosa, Erin, Garafraxa, Guelph, Luther, Maryborough, Minto, Nichol, Peel, Pilkington and Puslinch. Wellington is an interior county, bounded north by Grey; north-east by Simcoe; east by Peel and Halton; south by Wentworth and Waterloo; west by Perth and Huron, and on the north-west by Bruce. It is situated about fifteen miles north-west from Lake Ontario, and about forty miles south from the Georgian Bay. Its area is about 791,604 acres, or nearly 1237 square miles.

Wellington is one of the best agricultural districts in the Province, consisting principally of a deep, rich loam, clayey and vegetable mould, generally resting on a limestone or gravel basis. There is a good deal of swamp in the northern townships, especially in Luther and Amaranth, but a great deal of this is susceptible of drainage, and may be made available for useful purposes. It is well watered by the Grand, Speed, Irvine, Eramosa, Maitland and Conestoga rivers, and their numerous tributaries. Limestone of an excellent quality exists in great abundance, particularly on the banks of the rivers.

The early settlers of the several townships were chiefly Scotch, Irish, a minority English and Americans. Many removed from other portions of the Province. In a work of this description, which is chiefly intended for *utility*, it would be leaving our legitimate province to enlarge on the vicissitudes of "Life in the Bush," and the recently published "History of Guelph and the townships of the County of Wellington," in the columns of the *Guelph Mercury*, contains more interesting details and information on this subject than we could possibly find space for. We are greatly indebted to the researches of Mr. Innis for the matter contained in this work.

Wellington is divided into two Ridings. The North is represented in the Legislative Assembly by Thos. S. Parker, M.D.; the South by David Sturton, Esq.

TOWNSHIPS, COUNTY WELLINGTON.

AMARANTH—Bounded north by Melancthon; east by Mono; west by Luther; and south by Garafraxa. This township was annexed to Wellington in 1841, previous to which time it formed part of the County of Simcoe. About one-third of the land is swamp, but there is a large quantity of good soil. The first settler in Amaranth was Abraham Hughson, who arrived here in 1823 or 1825, authorities differ on this point, and for eight years was the only occupant. Among the other early settlers were Daniel Severs, Robert Keys, John Rennick, Neil McGill, Charles Gillespie, Walter Coon, Samuel R. Munroe, and John Stopford.

Census of 1861.—Amount held in acres, 18,744; under cultivation, 6625; under crops, 5,536; under pasture, 1,089; wood and wild lands, 12,119; cash value of farms, \$333,400. Population, 1,196.

ARTHUR—This township was settled about the year 1845; that part of it on the Owen Sound road by Colonization grants conditional on actual settlement. It is bounded north by Egremont; east by Luther; west by Minto, and south by Maryborough and Peel. Early settlers—Hugh McDougall, John Muir, Thomas McGuire, and John Munroe.

Census of 1861;—Amount held in acres, 49,617; under cultivation, 13,034; under crops, 9,778; under pasture, 3,247; wood and wild lands 36,583; cash value of farms, \$599,720. Population, 3,597.

ERAMOSA—(Indian, "a dead dog.")—This township is bounded north-east by Erin; north-west by Garafraxa; south-west by Nichol and Guelph, and south-east by Nassagaweya. It is well watered, two branches of the Grand River running across it, and several smaller streams flowing through other parts of it, giving motive power to several flouring, saw, carding, and woollen mills. Several parts of the township are celebrated for their beautiful scenery.

Eramosa is one of the best townships in the county, the land being almost wholly of the first quality. In the year 1825 it contained 284 inhabitants; in 1841, 935; and in 1861, the number had increased to 3,604. Eramosa is a small township, being only six miles in width, and containing about 45,000 acres. The assessment of real and per-

sonal property in 1866, was \$750,000. Early settlers—Isaac and Storm Bradt, Peter McCullum, Titus G. Simons, Daniel Showers, and Patrick Hammel.

Census of 1861.—Amount held in acres, 33,174; under cultivation, 19,653; under pasture, 7536; gardens and orchards, 243; wood and wild lands, 13521.

ERIN—This township is bounded north-east by Caledon, north-west by Garafraxa, south-west by Eramosa, and south-east by Esquesing. Erin is next to Eramosa, the oldest settled township in the County. The first settlement was made in 1824, by the How, McMullen, and Trout families, and subsequently by Archibald Williams, Alexander McArthur, Abraham Buck, J. Dean, Wm. Kennedy, and Jacob Snyder. There is a large proportion of excellent land in this township, but part of it is hilly and stoney.

Census of 1861.—Amount held in acres, 60,753; under cultivation, 32,743; under crops, 20,127; under pasture, 12,492; gardens and orchards, 124; wood and wild lands, 28,010; cash value of farms, \$1,248,974. Population, 4948.

GARAFRAXA—This township is bounded north by Luther and Amaranth; south-east by Caledon, Erin, and Eramosa; and south-west by Nichol and Peel. The greater portion of the land is of the best quality. It is well watered by the Grand and Irvine rivers, and other smaller streams. The Garafraxa or Owen Sound road was first opened in 1840. Garafraxa was first settled in 1826, Messrs. John Dobbin, Headly, Felker, and McKee, were among the earliest settlers.

Census in 1861.—Amount held in acres, 54,429; under cultivation, 24,520; under crops, 18,378; under pasture, 6117; gardens and orchards, 25; wood and wild lands, 29,909; cash value of farms, \$1,250,110. Population, 4866.

GUELPH—This township is bounded north-east by Eramosa; north-west and west by Nichol and Pilkington, and south-east by Puslinch. The soil is of the best quality, consisting of long, rolling, sweeping stretches of land, with strips of swamps and swale between. The township is plentifully watered by clear and pure streams, and the river Speed runs through it for ten or twelve miles. It is also abundantly supplied with excellent limestone for building and other purposes.

The township was conveyed to the Canada Company by the Crown on the 9th of July, 1829, and then consisted of 42,338 acres, and was immediately after rapidly settled. The first actual settler was Samuel Rife, a Pennsylvania Dutchman, in 1827. Among the earlier settlers were Wm. Logan, Matthew Sweetnam, Hugh Kennedy, Alexander Reid, Andrew Ritchie, Robert Orr, J. Heffernan, John O'Conner, J.

Drew, Robert and William Patterson, and Archibald McCorkindale. The "Scotch Block," about four miles from the town, lying on both sides of the Elora road, was settled by the "Laguarian Emigrants," whom the Columbian Company had enticed to South America, but who being disappointed and reduced to great distress, were sent to New York, and thence to Canada. The "Paisley Block" was settled by Scotch, and the "West End" by English emigrants. In 1851, the township was organized as a distinct municipality—first reeve, Benj. Thurtell.

The history of the township is so intimately connected with that of the town, that we refer to our description of the latter for further information concerning it.

Value of rateable property (1866), \$1,146,580. Population, 1861, 3058.

LUTHER.—This township was attached to Arthur for municipal purposes till 1860, when the first council was organized, Mr. George Todd being appointed first reeve. The greater portion of the soil is unfit for agricultural purposes, being mostly swamp. A part of the township was surveyed about thirty years ago, by Lewis Burwell, of Brantford, and in 1854-5, the whole township was surveyed by Mr. Wm. McPhillips, of Richmond Hill. Among the settlers previous to 1854, were John Graham, Wm. Clench, John Cole, Patrick Cantwell, and Patrick Mooney. At the present time, scarcely one-third of the township is settled. In the fifth concession there is a lake of considerable size, having no visible outlet.

Luther contains three post offices, eight or ten schools, a saw mill, but no grist mill, and what is rather remarkable, there is not a church or tavern in the whole township. This is probably owing to the fact that the most thickly settled part is near the village of Arthur. There are 218 rate-payers in the township, and the value of real property is estimated at \$104,367.

Luther is bounded north by Proton and Melancthon, east by Amaranth, west by Arthur, and south by Garafraxa.

Census of 1861.—Amount held in acres, 16,514; under cultivation, 2,046; under crops, 1,750; under pasture, 296; wood and wildlands, 14,468. Population, 689.

MARYBOROUGH.—This township originally formed part of the "Queen's Bush," which also included the townships of Peel, Arthur, Wellesley, and Mornington, formerly clergy reserves, but gradually opened for settlement. This is one of the best townships in the North Riding, the land being of good quality, high, and rolling. It is well watered by branches of the Conestoga. Limestone of superior quality abounds, particularly along the river banks. In 1850 it contained 587 inhabitants.

Maryborough was surveyed in 1848, and was rapidly settled. Among the first settlers were W. H. Hambly, John Haight, H. Healy, and Lewis Adams. This township was united with Peel for municipal purposes until 1851. Hugh Hollingshead, first reeve.

Census of 1861: Amount held in acres, 43,752; under cultivation, 14,056; under crops, 10,521; under pasture, 3,120; gardens and orchards, 409; wood and wild lands, 29,696; value of farms, \$858,500. Population, 3,134.

MINTO.—The most recently settled township in the county, and one of the best as regards quality of soil. The surface is a succession of gentle undulations, the intervening local portions being for the most part beaver meadows, well adapted for grazing purposes. On the higher ground the soil is a strong clay, the lower portion more alluvial, in both cases being underlaid with gravel. The township is well watered by branches of the Maitland and Saugeen rivers, and there is scarcely a farm without its spring creek. There is probably not more than 500 acres of useless swamps in the township. In 1854 Minto was offered for sale by the Government. At that time it was a complete wilderness, but the government roads, which were made between 1858-60, encouraged settlement, and in the year 1861 the population was 2,341. The value of real property, according to the assessment of 1866, was \$336,274.

NICHOL.—The township of Nichol is a portion of the tract of land originally granted to the Six Nation Indians, by Sir Frederick Halli-mand, Governor of the province of Quebec, in the year 1784. This grant was confirmed, and its conditions defined by a patent issued by Governor Simcoe, bearing the date January 14th, 1793. This tract extended for six miles in depth on each side of the Ouse or Grand river, from its head to Lake Erie, embracing an area of 694,910 acres, or about 1,086 square miles, more than half the extent of Aberdeenshire. By far the greater portion of this extensive and valuable tract has been at various times surrendered by the Indians. The first transfer was made in 1798, and included what now forms the townships of Dumfries, Waterloo, Pilkington, and Nichol, extending downwards on both sides of the river from the northern extremity of the reserve; and the greater part of the townships of Cranboro' and Moulton, on the eastern side of the entrance of the Grand river, in all 352,707 acres.

The township of Nichol was granted by the Crown to the Hon. Thomas Clarke for military services, the patent bearing date April 17th, 1807. The undivided moiety was sold to Samuel Hatt, Dec. 9th, 1808, and by him again sold to the Rev. Robert Addison, June 29th, 1826. The widow of the last-named gentleman sold her right to Mr. William Gilkison, and in 1834 the late Hon. Adam Fergusson and James Webster, Esq., (county registrar), purchased 7,367 acres, being the northeast quarter of the township.

Nichol contains a large proportion of excellent land, and is watered by the Grand and Irvine rivers and several smaller streams. The Grand river intersects the township; its average breadth is about forty yards, but at the Falls of Elora it expands to about sixty yards. The banks and beds are of limestone, the former rising in many places to a height of about thirty feet. The Irvine joins the Grand river at Elora. The settlement of "Bon Accord," (the motto of the city of Aberdeen), was originally founded by emigrants from Aberdeenshire. The other villages in Nichol will be noticed in the proper place.

The first settler in Nichol was Roswell Matthews, in 1818. He made the first clearing at the Falls, now Elora. Among the earliest settlers were John Gilliland, Alexander Watt, A. J. Flewelling, Silas Burlingame, George Emslie, James Dow, and Thomas Lachlan.

In 1829 Nichol numbered but twenty-three inhabitants. In 1841 the number had increased to 1,019, and in 1861 the population was 2,395.

Nichol is bounded north-east by Eramosa and Garafraxa; north-west by Peel; south-west by Pilkington, and south-east by Guelph.

Census of 1861.—Amount held in acres, 24,942; under cultivation, 15,233; under crops, 8,880; under pasture, 6,348; wood and wild lands, 9,709; cash value of farms, \$1,226,516.

PEEL.—Bounded north-east by Garafraxa; north-west by Maryborough; south-west by Wellesley, and south-east by Pilkington and Nichol. The Owen Sound road runs along the north-eastern border of the township. The greater part of the land is of excellent quality. In 1837 Peel contained 300 inhabitants; in 1850 the number had increased to 1,966, and in the same year there were 3,354 acres under cultivation.

Census of 1861.—Amount held in acres, 60,913; under cultivation, 25,032; under crops, 18,551; under pasture, 6,396; under gardens and orchards, 85; wood and wild lands, 35,881; cash value of farms, \$1,318,570. Population, 5,008.

PILKINGTON.—Formerly part of the Township of Woolwich, known as the "Pilkington Block," contains about twenty thousand acres, and belonged to the estate of the late General Pilkington. This "block," it is said, was granted to William Wallace under the authority of Joseph Brandt, (Thayendanega) agent and attorney for the Six Nation Indians, in the year 1797, but there is no reliable proof of this transfer. In 1859, the heirs of Wallace set up a claim for the possession of the land, which, however, was not granted. In 1799, Major General Pilkington became possessed of the tract comprising the greater part of the township. The general character of the land is the same as that of Nichol.

Early settlers.—George Reid, William Reynolds, Benjamin Tribe, Thomas Leppard, William Woolcott, Thomas Smith, George Wilbur, Christopher Wood.

Pilkington is bounded north by Peel; east by Nichol; west by Woolwich, and south by Guelph.

Census of 1861.—Amount held in acres, 27,508; under cultivation, 16,127; under crops, 12,889; under pasture, 3,177; under orchards and gardens, 61; wood and wild lands, 11,381; cash value of farms, \$939,150. Population, 2,397.

PUSLINCH.—This township contains about 60,000 acres, and is well watered, well settled, and well cultivated. The soil is, generally speaking, of good quality. The first lot sold in the township, was also the first Clergy Reserve lot sold in the province. The purchaser was Wm. Carroll, in 1829. The first actual settler was Humphrey Lowarch, the "Welchman." Among the earliest settlers were Michael O'Neil, John Foster, Thomas Dunn, Cornelius O'Sullivan, James Kidd, Duncan McFarlane, John Black, James Crooks and Peter McBeth. The "Plains" and "Scotch Settlement" were settled in 1831.

Puslinch, in its earlier days, was greatly indebted to the enterprise of Rowland Wingfield, Esq., a young gentleman from Gloucestershire, who settled near Guelph, and first imported superior cattle and sheep to the country.

In 1845, Puslinch, which previously formed a part of Gore, was annexed to Wellington.

Near the western boundary of the township are two lakes, the larger containing an area of 648 acres, and near the centre is an island of about 6 acres in extent. The smaller lake contains about 20 acres, but is said to be deeper than the other. They are separated by a belt of dry land about a furlong in width, and have no visible communication. The larger discharges its surplus water by the Speed, but the other has no apparent means of either supply or discharge.

Census of 1861.—Amount held in acres, 55,679; under cultivation, 32,884 under crops, 17,596; under pasture, 14,904; under gardens and orchards, 384; wood and wild lands, 22,795; value of farms, \$1,636,625. Population, 4701.
