MOUNT FOREST.

It is situated in the townships of Egremont, Normanby, and Arthur, and on the north side of the southern fork of the Saugueen river, formerly called the "Maitland." It was first settled in 1853, and incorporated in 1865. The Owen Sound or Garafraxa gravel road passes through the village. Railway communication at an early day is expected by the Toronto, Grey and Bruce Railway, which is rapidly being extended to this village. Mount Forest has a good grain market. There is fair water power. A large country trade is carried on. The Montreal Telegraph Company has an office here. Distant from Arthur, 16 miles; from Fergus, a station on the Wellington, Grey and Bruce Railway, 27 miles; from Owen Sound, 44 miles; from Guelph, 41 miles. Mail daily. Population about 1,500.

ORANGEVILLE.

An incorporated village, one part of which lay in the township of Mono, in the county of Simcoe, and the other in Garafraxa, in the county of Wellington; but when it was incorporated in 1864, it was annexed to this county, and is now wholly separated from the county of Simcoe, as far as municipal affairs are concerned. The large and fine agricultural district every year growing into more importance, and its favorable geographical position—at the convergence of the three counties of Wellington, Simcoe and Peel—have contributed, doubtless, very much to its rapid growth. It is beautifully situated on a handsome slope on the town lines running east and west between Amaranth and Mono on the one side, and Caledon and Garafraxa on the other. A small stream runs through the village, joining the Credit a little below, having in a short distance the great fall of 120 feet, and driving in its course several mills and factories. There are quite a number of stores in the village, besides other places of business and mechanical shops. It is forty miles from Toronto, and thirty-six from Guelph.

This village is likely to become one of the most important towns in the western section of the Province, being now one of chief stations of the Toronto, Grey & Bruce Railway. There are two telegraph offices, an express office and two bank agencies, several churches, excellent grammar and common schools, one flour mill, one tannery, two saw mills, two foundries and machine shops.

Messrs. Crawford & Fitzgerald, cabinet makers, were established in 1868. The factory consists of two buildings, each two stories high, one 18 feet x 50 and the other 18 feet x 30. Seven hands and steam power are employed.

Messrs. Buyers & Meredith were established in 1867, and employ fourteen hands in the manufacture of carriages, buggies, sleighs, &c., and in general job work and repairing. The buildings are roughcast, three stories high, 30 x 50 feet, the blacksmith shop being 50 x 30 feet. The firm are chiefly manufacturing light carriage work.



Irvine Foundry, Modeland's Agricultural Works, Isaac Modeland, proprietor. This extensive establishment employs from fifteen to twenty hands. The building is of stone, 100 feet x 30. All kinds of agricultural implements are manufactured; threshing, mowing and reaping machines, steel mould board ploughs, cultivators, &c.

Messrs. Whitelaw and Gay, millers, employ 8 hands; the mills are 121 x 76 feet, 3 stories front and 7 stories in rear, containing 5 run of stone for flouring and one for oatmeal.

There is a last and peg factory established by Messrs Wallace and Black, who employ a number of hands.


